LETTER FROM FR. TOM: Hurray!! Happy New Year! Actually, our Catholic New Year began on November 28 with the beginning of Advent. That was the beginning of the new liturgical year. With the new year comes New Year's resolutions. I really like the idea of making a New Year's resolution. It helps us to look at our lives and work on one thing that will make our life better. For the past month, we have been talking about the importance of daily prayer as a Catholic. It is essential for every Catholic to pray every day. If I love Jesus Christ with all my mind, heart, soul, and strength, then I will want to spend time with him daily.

When you are considering a New Year's resolution, I hope that praying daily, or learning to pray would be part of your plan. It would be great if everyone in the parish began going deeper in their faith. You could begin simply by kneeling by your bed and praying night prayers. Then perhaps learn the Rosary. A couple of weeks ago, during my homily, I mentioned doing A.C.T.S. of prayer. I thought I would give you a written reminder that the letters from A.C.T.S. of prayer mean something. You could begin prayer with this method, or this method could be your entire prayer. Just do what the words say:

<u>Adoration</u> - begin by adoring God – worshiping God. God is the almighty Creator of the universe who created you and holds you together at every moment. Begin your prayer with adoration of God.

<u>Contrition</u> - this is a fancy way to say you are sorry. We pray the Act of Contrition. During this time, we look at our sins and repent. We ask for forgiveness and make a resolution to change.

<u>Thanksgiving</u> - we should thank God for all that he has done - creation, redemption, his death and resurrection, sending the Holy Spirit. But we also thank God for our family, friends, and the things we have. Gratitude to God will make us appreciative and joyful.

Supplication - this means that we ask God to help others. We take time to pray for our family, friends, community, and country. This is how we participate in saving the world.

When you pray, think of A.C.T.S. of prayer, and bring these four things to mind. As you learn to pray, you will come to know and love Jesus all the more. What a great thing to do for a New Year's resolution!
