"Annual/Bishop's Appeal"

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we kick-off the Annual/Bishop's Appeal. The number and variety of programs it funds is too big to list here. You can access the complete list at: diolc.org/stewardship/appeal-portal. However, some are listed here for you.

***SEMINARY EDUCATION & RELIGIOUS FORMATION** *currently we have 13 seminarians *3 Deacons to be ordained in 2025, 3 in theology, 3 in Pre-theology, and 4 in college. The Office of Vocations also offers discernment retreats for all ages, continuing education for ordained priests and regular spiritual enrichment.

Vocations promotion, the training and support of the 27 international priests and the overseeing of the Office for Consecrated Life are also funded.

MARY OF GOOD HELP HMONG MINISTRY This new parish assists the many Hmong Catholics who live in our Diocese with a full-time pastor in Wausau and 2 priest chaplains in the La Crosse area. Many have never heard of Jesus Christ. Some of our basic Catholic resources are being translated into the Hmong language, to foster an understanding of the Faith through prayer.

TELEVISED MASS For the home-bound on a Sunday, the Mass on TV is a real comfort. For those who are temporarily or permanently unable to go to church this is a life-line to Jesus. It is costly, however. The Appeal makes it happen.

It is amazing how broad the scope of Diocesan involvement is. When you receive your pledge card in the mail, kindly keep in mind all the people you are helping with your generous donation. I must, of course, mention that all money received over our target of

Plenary Indulgence November 1st - 8th

Beginning on All Saints' Day November 1st, the faithful can gain a plenary indulgence - applicable only to the Holy Souls - every day for eight days by praying for the dead in a cemetery.

On November 2 ONLY, the plenary indulgence can be gained in either a cemetery or in a church.

Story of the Commemoration of

All the Faithful Departed

The Church has encouraged prayer for the dead from the earliest times as an act of Christian charity. "If we had no care for the dead," Augustine noted, "we would not be in the habit of praying for them." Yet pre-Christian rites for the deceased retained such a strong hold on the superstitious imagination that a liturgical commemoration was not observed until the early Middle Ages, when monastic communities began to mark an annual day of prayer for the departed members.

In the middle of the 11th century, Saint Odilo, abbot of Cluny, France, decreed that all Cluniac monasteries offer special prayers and sing the Office for the Dead on November 2, the day after the feast of All Saints. The custom spread from Cluny and was finally adopted throughout the Roman Church.

The theological underpinning of the feast is the acknowledgment of human frailty. Since few people achieve perfection in this life but, rather, go to the grave still scarred with traces of sinfulness, some period of purification seems necessary before a soul comes face-to-face with God. The Council of Trent affirmed this purgatory state and insisted that the prayers of the living can speed the process of purification.

Superstition easily clung to the observance. Medieval popular belief held that the souls in purgatory could appear on this day in the form of witches, toads or will-o'-the-wisps. Graveside food offerings supposedly eased the rest of the dead.

Observances of a more religious nature have survived. These include public processions or private visits to cemeteries and decorating graves with flowers and lights. This feast is observed with great fervor in Mexico.

Reflection Whether or not one should pray for the dead is one of the great arguments which divide Christians. Appalled by the abuse of indulgences in the Church of his day, Martin Luther rejected the concept of purgatory. Yet prayer for a loved one is, for the believer, a way of erasing any distance, even death. In prayer we stand in God's presence in the company of someone we love, even if that person has gone before us into death.

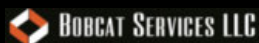
