On the Mass

Glory to God in the highest!

This prayer is an ancient hymn of praise to the Trinity during the Introductory rite of the Mass. It follows the Penitential Rite. First part of that hymn was sung by the "armies of heaven" at the birth of the Savior, praising God (Luke 2:13-14). It is our prayer to God the Father, reminding Him that the Church gathered for the Eucharistic celebration, is the incarnate Body of His Son. Next follows the part that praises God by recalling all of His attributes. The third is a prayer to Christ where we ask Him to save us from our sins.

The Gloria is omitted during Advent and Lent. Advent is a time of awaiting the Savior. During this Liturgical Season, we listen to the announcements of Jesus' coming, which the Prophets foretold regarding the Savior. The Season of Lent focuses on the saving works of Christ. It allows us to understand what God has done for us through the suffering and death of His Son.

In this hymn, we give praise to God by recalling how great He is and how worthy of our praise, worship and devotion. St. Paul in his letter to the Christian Community at Corinth writes: "So, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God" (1 Corinthians 10:31)." In the ***Glory to God in the highest*** we give thanks to God, who is always present. We are invited to praise God at all times because the "glory of God" is always before us. As we raise our minds and hearts to God in this hymn of praise, we should recognize God's Presence in our midst. We should be aware of our need for God, trusting that He never abandons us in our need. We should open our hearts and mind to Him and ask Him to make us aware of His presence in our lives at every moment.

Why Marry in a Church?

Question:

Why are Catholics required to get married in a church, and not outside or at a different venue?

Answer:

Because the sacrament of marriage is a sacred covenant between the husband and wife, the celebration of the sacrament of matrimony is much more than simply a social or family event. So, the rule that the sacrament be celebrated in a church is a way to help reinforce the deeper meaning of Christian marriage. To help make this clearer, the Church's tradition also normally includes the celebration of the Mass when the marriage is being celebrated between two Catholics, and so a church or chapel is the ideal setting. For special reasons — which vary from diocese to diocese — the local bishop can give permission for the marriage to be celebrated in another suitable place

October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month

Faith communities are called to offer hope, help, and healing to all harmed by domestic abuse and violence. We must learn to recognize domestic abuse, respond with compassion, and refer people to the proper services that are prepared to help them.

WHAT CAN I DO TO BE HELPFUL IF AN ABUSIVE SITUATION IS REVEALED?

- Listen, Believe, and Refer. Share that the abuse is not God's will. Say that help is available 24/7 at the National Domestic Violence Hotline: 1-800-799-SAFE (7233), 1-800-787-324 (TTY) or at www.ndvh.org.
- Let them know that without intervention, abuse often escalates in frequency and severity over time.
- Seek expert assistance by calling the NDVH. Refer them only to specialized domestic violence counseling programs, not to couples counseling.
- If possible, encourage the abusive person to seek help. Attending an appropriate 12-step recovery group has been a source of recovery for many people.

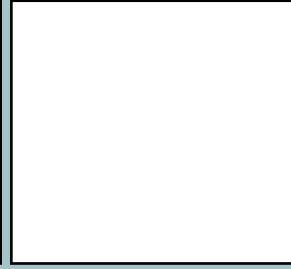

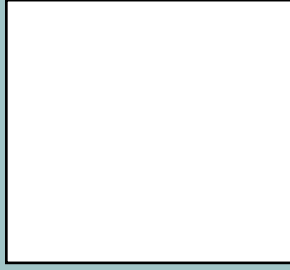
