

Epiphany

We all enjoy a good dose of escapism. We like and tell our children fairy tales. We may lose ourselves in reading trivial novels, watching soap operas, playing mindless games on our computers. Mostly it is harmless.

The Epiphany story may seem like a fairy tale. Mysterious Men from the East, star traveling across the sky, wicked King Herod, and, of course, the gifts of gold for the Child, gold, frankincense, and Myrrh. Although it may seem like a fairy tale, Matthew's story is firmly rooted. The Wise Men were very probably astrologers, who saw a new star in the sky and following the accepted wisdom of the time, they assumed that a great ruler had been born. But they had no certainty. So, acting on their belief, they let home and country. The star did not guide magically, they had to ask directions, they had to consult others as to where this king might be born.

And King Herod is not a fairy tale ogre. He was real enough: an evil and ruthless tyrant-he had one of wives and two sons put to death. And the King, the Magi sought, was not in any royal palace but in a stable located in a little, non-significant village. Even their gifts were not all good news: the myrrh and frankincense point to the Child's death and burial. The shadow of the Cross always hangs there, even over the wonder of the birth of the Son of God.

If the story were a mere piece of fairy tale literature, it would end with the adoration of the Magi. But no, we are told that they returned home, to their everyday lives. And so, must we. What do we return with? We are invited to read the signs of the time, to be alert to God speaking in our lives. We are called to act on our faith, to continue the journey of discovering God afresh every day. We are challenged to see God in the circumstances of our lives. The Magi saw beyond the Baby in a manger and recognized the presence of God they adored. We too are called to recognize God in this Child of Christmas and to praise and give thanks. Not just in the church and not just on Christmas day, but in our daily work and our daily routine. And most of all, the challenge is for all Christians to recognize the Face of God in our sisters and brothers.
