


We come to Jesus with our disappointment. Our Youth, Parents, and
Chaperones that had committed to attending The March for Life in Chicago will not
be traveling to the Rally on January 8. The charter bus was canceled by the organizing group in Freeport. Reasons vary from
limited participation to the current pandemic to conflicting schedules to being uncomfortable in Chicago.
While we had great hopes this would be a wonderful, unified experience of sharing our faith and commitment to life though our
actions, attending the March for Life isn't in God's timing for us right now. We will fervently pray for those that attend any of
the Marches throughout the month of January.

AND what else will we do? We ALL have the ability to pray for a Culture of Life. There are many different prayers to create a society that values life at every stage—from conception to natural death. Some prayers to consider: The St. Michael Prayer, the Rosary with pro-life meditations and intentions, Meditations from the Stations of the Cross focusing attention on the meaning of Christ's passion, Prayers for Adoption with the courage, humility and faith demonstrated by St. Joseph, Prayers of Blessings for expectant to mothers and unborn children, and Prayers for all those affected by abortion. We believe that nothing is greater than the conversation of the human heart; miracles happen through persistence, prayer and faith.

Baptism of the Lord, January 9, 2022

The Son of God is gradually revealed to the world. Isaiah the Prophet says: Here is my chosen one and I am pleased with him" (Isaiah 42:1). Luke proclaims: "You are by beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" (Luke 3:22). Today, Jesus makes his first public appearance and is baptized by John. This is the final act of preparation before the new era begins, and it indicates Jesus' complete acceptance of the Father's plan for mankind. Jesus is ready to live and act in accordance with his Father's will. He is determined to introduce God's kingdom.

Here we face the importance of our own Baptism: this Sacrament is not just a private matter. In baptism, we are anointed for the same mission as Jesus was: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" (John 20:21). We continue to proclaim God's kingdom as members of his Mystical Body-the Church. As Christians, we have been baptized into His mission to demonstrate God's righteousness and to help the Messiah fulfill the work He has begun. In order to demonstrate His light to others, the light must shine in us.

In our Baptism, we have been commissioned to an important task as members of Jesus' living Body here on earth, the Church: to give witness to our fellow men that we truly believe in the Son of God. "Now that Christ has come, Christians are expected to accept the Gospel as the chief norm of their lives, to do otherwise is to ignore the fact of the Incarnation." (Bernard Haring, <u>Shalom -Peace</u>. <u>The Sacrament of Reconciliation</u>, <u>1967</u>).

In the Sacrament of Baptism, we have been invited to live with Him forever. Ours is the next move: to accept or reject His offer.

"Today, I have given you the choice between life and death, between blessings and curses. I call on heaven and earth to witness to the choice you make. Oh, that you would choose life, that you and your descendants might live! Choose to love the Lord your God and to obey him and commit yourself to Him, for He is your life. Then you will live long in the land the Lord swore to give to your ancestors Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob" (Deuteronomy 30:19-20).

The Baptism of the Lord
