The Conversion of St. Paul the Apostle-An Act of Mercy

"I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting" (Acts 9:5)

After Pentecost, we notice the spread of the Gospel and growth of the Church. Peter's bold witness and the testimony of other Apostles (Acts 2:14-4:37) helped the Jerusalem Church grow. However, the young Church was not without problems from external opposition. It resulted in imprisonment, beatings and death (Acts 5:1-8:3). But instead of stopping Christianity, opposition and persecution served in spreading the Gospel, because the believers took the Good news wherever they fled (Acts8:5-40).

Saul (who later became Paul) was so zealous for his Jewish faith that he became hostile against anyone who was the follower of the Way (Acts 9:2). Zealous for the Law and most likely trying to advance his career and build his reputation as a true Pharisee, Saul obtained a letter empowering him to arrest Christians even as far as Damascus, a key commercial city located in the Roman province of Syria, some 150 miles northeast of Jerusalem.

As Paul traveled to Syria in pursuit of Christians, he was confronted by the Risen Christ and was brought face to face with the truth of the Gospel. Jesus' confrontation with Paul, as we see it now, was an act of mercy. Paul was not only given an extraordinary opportunity of seeing the error of his ways and repent of his persecution of Jesus' followers, but Paul was called to the missionary work for Jesus' cause in the world. A marvelous effect of God's grace: Paul is called to God's service in spite of his undistinguished and miserable past. Paul must have been terrified. The blinding light, the realization of the terrible things he had done to the follower of the one who is Lord of all (Acts9:13), the loss of sight, the psychological turmoil of the experience, caused the involuntary starvation for three days.

Paul's experience on the way to Damascus directs us to the point of anyone's conversion to Christ: by the light of the Risen Christ, we recognize our own blindness and receive our sight from Him. Jesus' voice is heard, renewing the sense of His unseen presence from heaven among his followers. Jesus is present in our life all along will continue to be. As the followers of the Way we are expected to accept the Gospel as the chief form of our lives.


