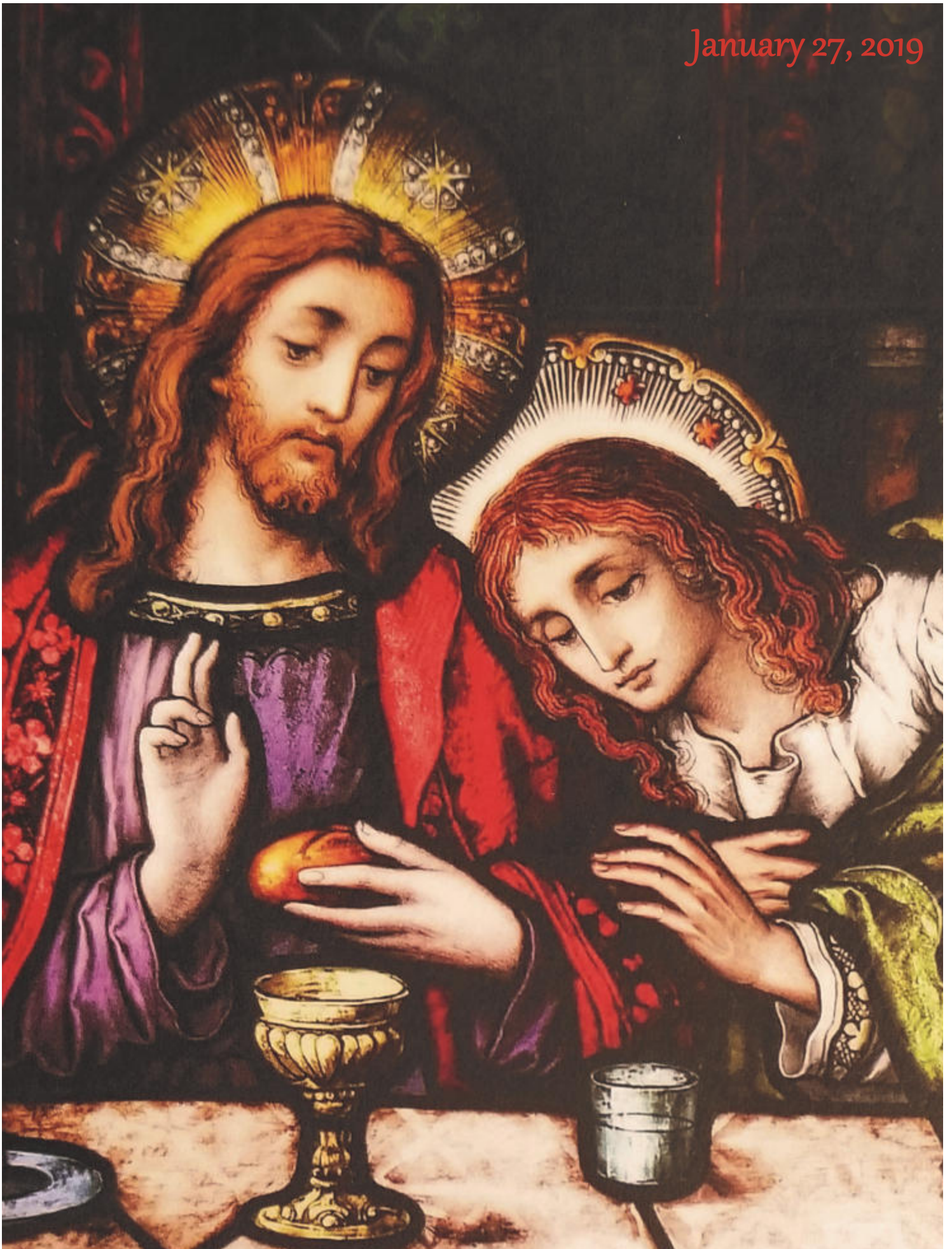

## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Many of you know that the Archbishop of New York, Cardinal Timothy Dolan, and I are classmates -- not related just classmates! We went through high school and college together. When first ordained we were assigned to neighboring parishes -- I to St. Mary Magdalen in Brentwood, he to Little Flower in Richmond Heights.

In an article he wrote "TRUE FREEDOM: On Protecting Human Dignity and Religious Liberty" he speaks of an elderly couple who lived in the parish that he would take Holy Communion to each week. The husband was severely disabled and the only way he was able to communicate was through a series of blinks and eye movements. His wife, who cared for him so tenderly, was able to translate for him.

What struck Fr. Dolan during his visits was their serenity, a real sense of inner peace. They always seemed very happy to see him...

He shared with them how grateful he was for their kindness, and told the wife how impressed he was by her patience with her husband, and told the husband what an inspiration he had been. He said, "In the eyes of the world, you're in bad shape. You're unable to move, unable to talk, unable to do so many of the things that most of us take for granted and consider necessary for a useful and productive life. And yet, in all the weeks that I've been visiting, you've never once complained, or asked 'why did God allow this to happen to me.' What's your secret?"

His wife held his hand as he blinked-out his reply. "Just to live is itself a gift from God. Every morning when I wake up I am so happy to be alive for another day, that I cherish the opportunity that I've been given."

That answer summarizes the beauty and dignity of life itself, a beauty and dignity that go beyond what we're able to do, what we're able to accomplish. It also gets to the heart of what Saint John Paul II was getting at in his encyclical, *Evangelium Vitae*, the Gospel of Life. His fundamental thesis is that human life is sacred, and thus merits dignity, in and of itself, not just for what it can accomplish, achieve, or produce.

St. John Paul II directs his teaching, not just to Catholics; not just to Christians or people of faith; but "to all people of good will." This is rather important. True enough, his teaching is expressed in terms of religious belief and teaching, but this fundamental concept of the sacredness of all human life, which deserves dignity, respect, and protection by law -- is rooted in natural law, a source of ingrained principles accessible to all, not just religious folks.
