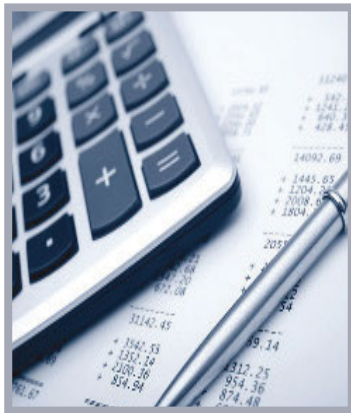

### St. Catherine's TRUSTEE-SECRETARY 2-YEAR TERM POSITION DESCRIPTION

The secretary is responsible for corporate record keeping at the parish other than financial records, such as corporate minutes, documents, notices and correspondence. One of the major responsibilities of the trustee-secretary is to ensure that parish records are kept on parish grounds in an easily accessible and orderly fashion. The trustee-secretary is responsible for maintaining records of all real property, property tax exemption, the parish inventory and the parish census. The trustee-secretary is an ex-officio member of the parish pastoral council and may be required to serve on the parish finance council.



### St. Joan of Arc TRUSTEE-TREASURER 2-YEAR TERM POSITION DESCRIPTION

According to the Parish Corporate Bylaws, the trustee-treasurer is responsible for keeping accurate and detailed accounts of receipts and disbursements for the parish. Most parishes have paid staff who carry out these accounting functions. The trustee-treasurer's particular responsibility is that of parish treasury activities. This includes the care and custody of funds, assets, supervision of banking, credit, and insurance. The trustee-treasurer is an ex-officio member of the pastoral council and may be required to serve on the finance council.

## Sunday, May 8, 2022 Accompanying One Another

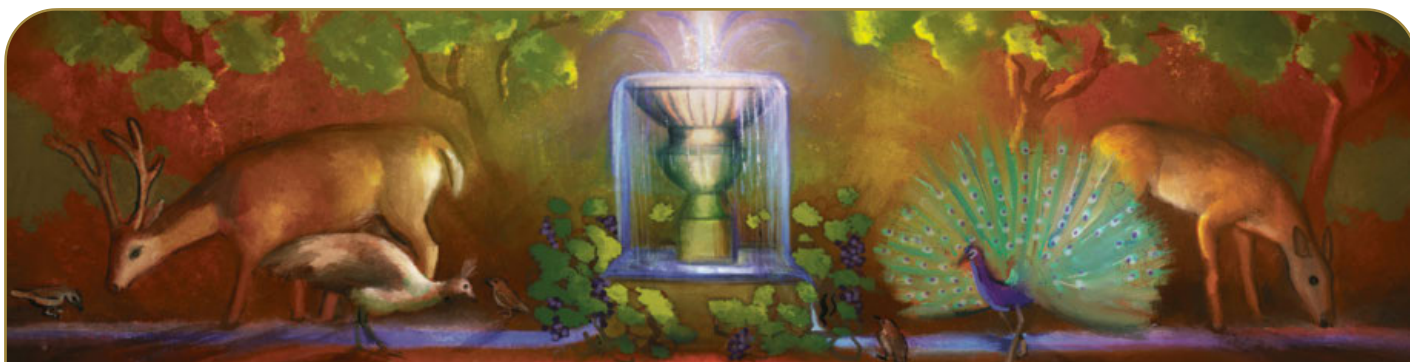
*Today's readings: Acts 13:14, 43–52; Psalm 100:1–2, 3, 5; Revelation 7:9, 14b–17; John 10:27–30.* Why does it seem that differences in culture, religion, or preferences frighten people? This appears to be the situation in the first reading today. The Jews grew jealous when Paul and Barnabas included the Gentiles in a Sabbath gathering. One group saw themselves as more deserving than the other and grew angry and violent. They wanted to keep the faith contained among those like themselves.

In the Gospel, Jesus identifies his sheep as those who “hear my voice” and “follow me.” Jesus gives them “eternal life.” Jesus’ sheep only need to hear his voice and follow him. It seems so simple, yet often people complicate

Christianity as they judge by appearances. Fear can lead to anger and ultimately to excluding people who have many gifts and talents to offer our communities.

When fearful of others, it is essential to pray for the grace to see people as God sees them, to recognize the presence of God within those who come to us seeking to join our journey of faith. Our prayer should lead us to treat each person with dignity and respect. May we strive to imitate the reverence for others that is apparent in Pope Francis’ statement: “The Church will have to initiate everyone—priests, religious and laity—into this ‘art of accompaniment’ which teaches us to remove our sandals before the sacred ground of the other” (*The Joy of the Gospel*, 169).





## THIS WEEK AT HOME

### Monday, May 9

#### The Voice of the Shepherd

Think of the people you love and how it feels when you hear one of them say your name. Often, the voice of a loved one is soothing. Jesus knows and calls us by name; if we are listening, comfort and security will be found even while facing challenges. Today, allow yourself a few moments of silence to hear your name being called by the Good Shepherd, and know the gift of peace. Consider meditating on the words of Sunday's responsorial psalm: we are his people, the sheep of his flock. *Today's readings: Acts 11:1–18; Psalm 42:2–3; 43:3–4; John 10:1–10.*

### Tuesday, May 10

#### A Hand to Hold

Jesus lets his doubters know that his followers, his sheep, are secure with him. “No one can take them out of my hand,” he says, “and no one can take them out of the Father's hand. The Father and I are one.” No matter the situation or adversary, Christians can rest assured that God cares for them. *Today's readings: Acts 11:19–26; Psalm 87:1b–3, 4–5, 6–7; John 10:22–30.*

### Wednesday, May 11

#### Light in Darkness

“I came into the world as light, so that everyone who believes in me might not remain in darkness,” Jesus states in today's Gospel. Unable to see in the dark, people often become afraid. The darkness we find ourselves in can be as literal as when the electricity is out during a storm, or figurative such as when the future seems uncertain. When you feel enveloped by darkness, remember to look for Jesus to light your path. *Today's readings: Acts 12:24–13:5a; Psalm 67:2–3, 5, 6 and 8; John 12:44–50.*

### Thursday, May 12

#### God Is Good

“For ever I will sing the goodness of the Lord,” we sing in today's responsorial psalm. What are the blessings in your life? Love, faith, family, friendship, a place to call home, our health, a job are some of the blessings that might come to mind. Many of these we take for granted. Grace, mercy, and faithfulness are God's promise to us. Even a moment of gratitude opens us to the fullness of this promise. *Today's readings: Acts 13:13–25; Psalm 89:2–3, 21–22, 25 and 27; John 13:16–20.*

### Friday, May 13

#### Have Faith

Just as Jesus tells the disciples, he also tells us, “Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me.” How often we allow our hearts to be troubled. It seems as though worry and fear can become a way of life. Spend time with the Gospel, placing yourself in Jesus' hands as you contemplate that he is “the way the truth and the life.” *Today's readings: Acts 13:26–33; Psalm 2:6–7, 8–9, 10–11ab; John 14:1–6.*

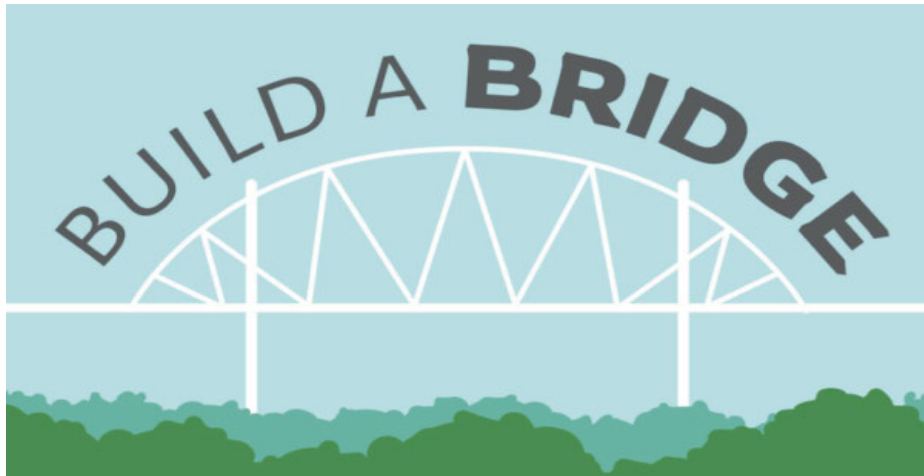
### Saturday, May 14

#### Faithful and Kind

In today's Gospel, Jesus asks his followers to come to him in prayer. “Whatever you ask in my name, I will do so that the Father may be glorified in the Son,” he says. Not only does Jesus desire to answer his followers' petitions, but he seeks to draw them to the Father. As we come to know Jesus, we come to know the Father. Spend time in a conversation with God and tell him your deepest concerns. *I'm very excited to share a new bulletin feature with you—our Classroom Spotlight! Each week for the next several months I will share with you some of the highlights of each of our classrooms, both graded classrooms and our 'specials' classes—Art, Health, Music, and Physical Education.*

*We hope you enjoy this deeper dive into what our teachers do to provide the uniquely effective education we have here at St. Joan of Arc. There are often reasons we do things in the classroom that aren't fully understood to those who aren't education practitioners, so hopefully this feature will...shed a little light! Enjoy!*

Our final grade level classroom for our classroom spotlight takes us to our most senior group in the school, our 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades. By 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades, our students are seasoned at learning in multiage environments and at moving between classrooms for their different subjects.

In 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades, students follow the pattern of receiving multiage instruction in all subject areas except math. This year, we have the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students in 3 different math groups, with students in the traditional 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade groups and a group studying algebra. Mrs. Gross is the math teacher for the middle school.

This year, we have tested out block scheduling with the middle school students for science and social studies. During the first semester, the students learned about the geography of the Eastern hemisphere, learning about the five themes of geography related to Europe, Asia, Africa, and Australia. They learned about the various cultures, their governments, and more.

This semester, the students are studying life science. The class participated in their own March Madness with a Mammal March Madness. The students and teachers (and their principal) filled out brackets and then watched

videos to learn why certain animals would win over others dependent upon the environment for the battle, whether they were fighting as an individual or a pack, and other factors. The students also participated in some really interesting hands on projects like dissecting chicken wings to learn about muscle groups and the process of dissection. They also culminated their study of body systems with a dissection of a bull frog. The students applied a lot of knowledge during this dissection and got to see the way the body systems were connected in a really up close way.

Mrs. Wilson is the homeroom teacher for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade homeroom and she is also the English Language Arts teacher for the full middle school. In ELA, the students study works of literature and also different styles and genres of writing. The 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade is currently studying argumentative writing.

We are so proud of our middle school and how well-prepared our students are for high school.

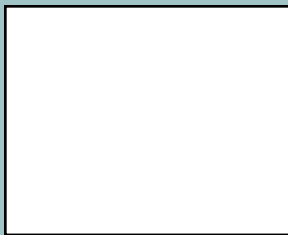


