## From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! Travis Tuttle set a lot of school records at Argyle High School. For those of you wondering, "*where in the heck is Argyle?*," it's south of Madison and is a member of the Six Rivers Conference. Travis moved to Argyle his freshman year of high school and it wasn't long before he became a household name. A member of the class of 1992, Travis was a phenomenal basketball player who could score at an unprecedented rate. He still has several state records and is in the national record books too. One night against Barneveld he scored 70 points, including 17 3-pointers. At the time, that was the most 3-pointers in a game by a high school player *EVER*. And I couldn't stand the kid.

Now before you accuse me of being envious, let me point out that we held Travis to under 50 points both times we played him my senior year (he is a year younger than me). I'm pretty sure I fouled out both games. And when it came time to shake hands after the game, I don't recall ever giving him the respect he deserved. So yes, that was a clear-cut case of envy, through and through.

Envy enters the human story early in the book of Genesis with the fratricide of Abel, killed by his brother Cain. For the record, envy is pain at another's good fortune, or the worse, when we revel in another person's pain. Some wonder if there is any difference between envy and jealousy, and the answer is "yes." Jealousy is what you would almost certainly feel if you were to see my car – it's a 2016 blue Ford Focus with a noticeably different color blue on the hood from the time I hit a deer a few years ago. Jealousy, as my Dad used to define it, is the feeling that, "*wow, I wish I had one of those.*" Coveting others' goods is not a recipe for happiness, and that means it's a sin. But jealousy is not nearly as disordered as envy, as we'll demonstrate now.

Of the seven capital sins, the one that leads most readily to hatred is envy. It sometimes moonlights as "*schadenfreud*," which means joy at another's misfortune. It's the reality that we love to see the great ones fall. Many of you remember the remarkably talented cyclist Lance Armstrong's fall from grace. While some felt genuine pain as his sins were revealed to the whole world, what sells is the enjoyment we derive from feeling superior to those who were previously put on an unreachable pedestal. And while it's hard to admit it, this disorder lurks for all of our life, luring us into feeling good when someone who has hurt us is suffering. Yes, revenge is another manifestation of envy: let's consider one example.

When Timothy McVeigh ended 168 lives by bombing a building in Oklahoma City in 1995, it was only a matter of time before he would be sentenced to death. Many of the parents and relatives of the victims petitioned for permission to see McVeigh die by lethal injection, and their request was granted. While we can sympathize with their terrible and insufferable pain, such a response does not heal the hurt. On the contrary, it deepens the suffering by adding the twisted enjoyment we derive from seeing those who hurt us suffer grievously and infinitely. Scripture reminds us that "*vengeance is mine, says the Lord. I will repay,*" (Rom. 12:19). Seeking revenge is a type of envy and only fills our heart with disordered thoughts, feelings, and desires.

On a lighter note, maybe you heard the one about the truck driver who pulled into a greasy spoon one day and ordered a burger, fries, and a Coke. His order had just arrived when three tough-looking motorcyclists walked in, looking for trouble. They walked over to the truck driver, sized him up, and made their move: one took his burger, another took his fries, and the third took his Coke. They walked to another table, sat down and proceeded to eat it. The truck driver, looking frustrated, got up, walked to the cashier, paid his tab, and left the diner. When the waitress came over to talk to the motorcyclists, one of them said to her, "*That truck driver wasn't much of a man, was he?!*" The waitress responded, "*I'm not sure what kind of a man he was, but he sure wasn't much of a truck driver. He just backed over three motorcycles.*" Oh yes, see how we enjoy revenge! One of many forms of envy that, with God's help, we can root out of our lives.

As with pride, there is a way to overcome our tendency to be jealous or envious. The first step is to become aware of what's bothering us and why. Then, the goal is to imitate that quality, not resent it. For example, Travis Tuttle was the hardest working player in the conference and possibly in the whole state. His Dad worked at the school and gave Travis a key to the gym. Nobody put more time in than Travis, as he was in the gym every morning before school at 6:00 a.m. Hard work is a good thing, certainly worthy of imitation. While I was never going to have his athleticism, I did learn to respect his work ethic. So it is with the people who cause us envy because of how they look or who they are friends with or where they live. We cannot imitate all of these things, but we can be honest about what is bothering us and bring it to the Lord. Or we can let it eat our heart out. Either way, God gives us a choice.

Next week we will discuss wrath. I'm running out of space in this column, which makes me really angry. Why can't I have more space for my bulletin articles? What is so special about all the other parish news that always cramps my style? Boy, I'm really getting angry just thinking about how many ways I'm being slighted around here. It seems that it will be a good time to discuss wrath . . . I'll try to calm down a bit before I write my next column (do you know that this is all tongue-in-cheek?!).

May God's grace in Holy Communion and Reconciliation help us to confront and overcome all envy in our life!

## 2nd Sunday of Lent

A pregnant woman was walking in the store and met an old friend. Her friend exclaimed, "You are absolutely beaming!" The new life God placed in her womb radiated throughout her body. It was brightly visible on her face and in her eyes. Transformation and change usually happen from the inside out. It is very rare that simply imposing structure from the outside does any good. Yes, it is true that routines and habits can change when things are done differently. But, for this change to last there has to be an interior renewal and metamorphosis as well. Simply regulating behavior and bringing someone into conformity with accepted protocols doesn't mean their heart and soul come with them.

Peter was a homeless man who lived in a very remote and rudimentary tent community. He was happy to make his daily trip to McDonald's and always welcomed a gift card or two so that he could buy some coffee and something to eat. A generous advocate worked to secure him an apartment in hopes of moving Peter out of his makeshift housing and into something safer. Peter finally got the grand tour of his new "digs," received his own key, remarked how wonderful the place was, closed the door behind him when they left and never returned. He preferred his tent. No matter how much things changed on the outside, Peter was happy where he was. A poignant lesson was learned that day.

How is your Lent going? By now you ought to have a sense of whether you're really "into it" this year and something transformational is happening. For many, it's only the stuff on the outside that changes for a few weeks and then they return to business as usual. For others, there are some real inner changes happening that are deepening their relationships with God, others, self, and creation. If we are serious about moving to a new place and radiating with the presence of new life and joy, then we have to clear the way to listen for God's call. Then, there is God's request to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. After realizing we have been called and given a mission, we have to trust that this is where we need to be. And then, after all of this hard work we are asked to act. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic. The brilliance of conversion will begin to shine on our faces as we contemplate the One to whom we are asked to listen.


