From the Pastor's Desk

Happy Easter! The amazing victory that we celebrate today is meant to fill our hearts with an unshakeable hope. Sometimes we find it difficult to rejoice because the meaning of Easter is not explained in an accessible way. Mother Teresa of Calcutta was one of the best teachers because she not only lived her faith with joy and generosity, she could explain it simply and in the most inspiring way. The following letter is an example of how Mother Teresa could say so much in so few words; reading it almost feels like she is talking directly to us:

"My dear Children,

God loved the world so much that He sent us His only Son to save us from sin. And Jesus brought us the Good News that God loves each one of us with a most tender love. We are precious to Him. He has carved us in the palm of His hand. And we are created for greater things: to love and to be loved.

It is so important for us to know the Word of God. Because if we know it, we will love it; and if we love it, we will keep it and live it. Let us ask Mary, the Mother of Jesus and our Mother, for the grace to imitate her. She kept the Word of God and pondered it in her heart. And to be able to do that, we must pray. Prayer gives a clean heart, and a clean heart can see God and know His will for us.

Jesus tells us, 'Love one another as I have loved you.' And how do we do that? Love begins in the family. I begin by loving my father and my mother, my brothers and sisters; my friends in the neighborhood and at school and all those I meet in my town or city. Love to be true must hurt, must cost us something. When we love like that, ready to make a sacrifice, we will find peace and joy.

Look around and see if there is anyone around you who is sick, poor, lonely, or feeling unloved or unwanted. We don't have to do big things. What counts is that we do small things with great love – giving a smile, a kind word, a helping hand, bringing a glass of water, sharing a sweet. Remember that we do it to Jesus because He said, 'Whatever you do to the least, you do it to Me.' So let us pray much, that we may be the sunshine of God's love to all we meet.

Let us pray.

A frequently asked question is why Easter moves around the calendar so much. The *Adoremus Bulletin* recently addressed this as follows: "A formula . . . was settled at the Council of Nicaea in 325: the date of Easter will fall on the first Sunday after the first full moon of the spring equinox. To further complicate things, the actual equinox can move between March 20 and 22, but it is always dated as the 21st for the sake of computation. According to this formula, the earliest date of Easter is March 22nd (the last time was in 1818, the next time will be in 2285), while the latest date of Easter is April 25th (the next one coming in 2038). In 2021, the first full moon after the March 21 equinox is Sunday, March 28th, and the first Sunday following that is April 4th."

Finally, to enhance your Easter joy, my Mom passed along the following: *Paraprosdokians are figures of speech in which the latter part of a sentence or phrase is surprising or unexpected and is frequently humorous (Winston Churchill is said to have loved them).*

- 1) *Where there's a will, I want to be in it.*
- 2) *The last thing I want to do is hurt you . . . but it's still on my list.*
- 3) *If I agreed with you, we'd both be wrong.*
- 4) *War does not determine who is right, only who is left.*
- 5) *To steal ideas from one person is plagiarism, to steal from many is research.*
- 6) *I didn't say it was your fault, I said I was blaming you.*
- 7) *Women will never be equal to men until they can walk down the street with a bald head and a beer gut, and still think they are attractive.*
- 8) *You do not need a parachute to skydive. You only need a parachute to skydive twice.*
- 9) *I used to be indecisive, but now I'm not so sure.*
- 10) *Going to church doesn't make you a Christian any more than sitting in a garage makes you a car.*
- 11) *I'm supposed to respect my elders, but it's getting harder and harder for me to find one now.*

May God be praised for His Son's victory over sin and death! May our lives reflect His Mercy.

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Who are you? This question was most assuredly asked of Jesus on the day of resurrection and it is a question asked of each of us. Our identities can be described in so many ways. We can start with our gifts and our talents, expertise and unique personality expressions. We can describe things we like and things we prefer to set aside. As descriptive and captivating as these can be, none come close to our essence, our real and true self. While accurate in their own right, the self who lives and interacts with the world is the self we want others to see, the one we project. But there is much more to us just as there is much more to Jesus.

Jesus could describe himself based on all of the same criteria we use for ourselves. After all, Jesus is totally human. With all that people witnessed and all that Jesus knew about his physical human self, his divinity also shined forth. There was so much more to know about him. Whereas once Jesus was transfigured on top of a mountain before his disciples' eyes, so today he is transfigured before our eyes as he reveals his resurrected self as the Christ. Alleluia, Christ is risen! His glorified presence stands before us showing us that we are all much more than we see ourselves to be and show to others. We have a depth, purpose, and essence that go way beyond the superficial treasures of our existence to the very core of who we are.

Within each one of us is a spark of Divine Love where creature and Creator meet, and we are known uniquely by the name God whispers to us. It is not the earthly name that was given to us but the one that flows from Divine Power and claims us as one who is special and chosen in God's eyes. This is the self that will rise one day with the eternal Christ of God and live eternally as God provides. This is the self that when free from all superficial constraints layered upon it in this life can discover and know freedom in a way never possible before. This is love lifting us up and transforming us into who we really are, not who we want or need ourselves to be. Who are you? A special, unique child of God who has been fashioned in God's image, sustained by the power of God's love and kept eternally with the Blessed Trinity in heaven. Get to know this deeper, truer self as it is who you really are.

We'll meet on **Tuesday, April 13th at 6:30 p.m. in Simons Hall**. Some members of the young adult group from Marshfield will be joining us and sharing their experiences with us (i.e. what works, what doesn't). I, Father Martin, will give a talk and we'll have some time to meet each other in COVID safe ways. Please plan on joining us and bring a friend. Of course, you might wonder how we define "young adult:" anywhere from 20-39 seems reasonable, but we're not going to be checking ID's at the door. The goal is to form a group that periodically gathers to grow as friends with each other and with the Lord.

By the way, an event that is open to younger adults (18-25) will be hosted at Middle Grounds (the corner of Thomas and 10th Ave) on March 25th from 6-9 p.m. The folks who run Middle Grounds are sincere Christians and they graciously invited us to participate. They even invited me – maybe they don't know how old I am!


Annual Appeal reached as of February 8, 2021

With grateful hearts we are excited to share that we have reached our Diocesan Appeal Goal. We would like to thank each of you for the generosity and support that you have given Holy Name of Jesus Parish. We couldn't have done it without you!

Debt Reduction – Smashing success! Thanks to the almost unbelievable generosity of so many Holy Name parishioners, we've reduced our parish debt by \$83,000! We had set a goal of raising \$14,000 so as to meet a matching gift, and we exceeded that goal within the first week of Lent. Therefore, we've eliminated the \$37,000 line item on our debt and reduced the \$96,000 line item by \$50,000. By this time next year we'll have moved from four line items of debt to two. Well done, good and faithful servants of God!

Holy Name will host a Holy Hour on Sunday, April 11th from 2:00-3:00 p.m. We'll have Eucharistic Adoration, an inspiring talk by Deacon Michael Maher, opportunity for confession, the sung Chaplet of Divine Mercy, and Benediction. 


