From the Pastor's Desk

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday! Years ago, a young couple was on their way to church for their wedding. They were so excited that they ran a red light and were killed in a tragic car accident. There they were, standing before Saint Peter and the pearly gates. They mentioned to Saint Peter that they'd been about to get married and wondered if they could tie the knot before entering Heaven. Saint Peter sighed, then went in search of a priest. After a long time, Saint Peter returned with a priest in tow. However, while he was gone, the young couple had been doing a lot of thinking, which led them to tell Saint Peter that they were worried about what they would do if it didn't work out and they decided to divorce. At which point an exasperated Saint Peter exclaimed, "*My goodness, it took me a year to find a priest up here. Do you think I could find a lawyer too?!*" With due respect to lawyers, I am grateful there's at least one priest in Heaven!

Jesus appeared to Saint Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s and made an appeal to the world through her regarding His Divine Mercy. If you've never read Faustina's Diary of Divine Mercy, you might want to start with Drew Mariani's new book that is now available through Relevant Radio. Mariani is very knowledgeable and shares Jesus' messages to Saint Faustina in simple and accessible ways. Saint Faustina summarized the messages (and essentially, all of the Gospels), by exclaiming, "*Jesus, I trust in You.*" This is a devotion that helps us better prepare for Heaven by learning and living Christ's teaching regarding forgiveness. As the following prayer makes clear, sometimes we actually need to begin by forgiving God:

'Lord, help me find it in my heart to forgive you for making me the way I am. Blasphemy? Perhaps. Honesty? For lack of a better word, yes. In this one repeated blinding moment of clarity I honestly need to forgive you, Lord. I know I am the work of your hands,' (Fr. Michael Monyahan, S.J., Hearts on Fire.)

This is a prayer that sometimes shocks us, as we don't often think about how we judge God as deficient in the way He runs the universe. We probably judge God more often than we think. Not that God needs to be forgiven, but unless we acknowledge this tendency, we unknowingly live in increasing darkness. God told us early and often that His ways are not our ways. And He wasn't kidding. We struggle to understand a God Who is both supremely good and all powerful, yet allows bad things to happen to people who don't deserve it. Though it seems somehow backwards to us, learning to forgive God for the way He does (or doesn't) do things is important if we're ever going to learn to truly trust Him. Only in this way will we ever begin to cherish the gift of our life – maybe not the life we would have chosen, but a gift nevertheless.

Divine Mercy is a Feast because it reminds us of the joy that comes through healing. Part of the problem with healing is that many of us don't realize that we need it. Pope Francis said once that Catholics coming out of Mass often times look like they're coming back from a funeral. He further explained that this stems, in part, from priests who give homilies that they don't enjoy giving to people who don't enjoy listening to them. Sound familiar? Please say "No!" The Pope makes a valid point: we should be more at peace and joyful after Mass than we were before. If that is not the case, something is awry and needs attention. More often than not, we're not able to receive God's joy because we're resistant to His healing touch. That means we are really saying, "*Jesus, I do not trust in You . . . but I want to.*"

"*When was your last confession?*" I have been thinking about using that as my response to people who ask whether I've been vaccinated yet. After all, Jesus was famous for responding to questions with questions of His own. Without wading too far into the weeds, there are things that we would only disclose to certain people because we know it opens us up to judgement. When we went to confession last is rather personal, and probably not something we'd feel comfortable discussing with anyone but a priest (analogously, it might be better to refrain from asking others about whether they've been vaccinated – this could cause division and hurt.) Trust is one of the deepest and most vulnerable facets of love, and it's the part that can only be healed by God's mercy. Any priest who has heard confessions for very long begins to see how God uses that encounter not only to forgive sin, but to heal the hurts that would otherwise leave us more and more sad and lonely. But so many stay away from confession – here is one more reason to return.

Pope Francis, upon his election as Holy Father in 2013, said "*The Lord never tires of forgiving, never. It is we who tire of asking His forgiveness. Let us ask for the grace of asking forgiveness because He never tires of forgiving.*" Many of us get tired of falling to the same sins; we confess, only to fall again and again. It's the seeming futility of it all that leads us to give up and stay away for years and years. If only we'd realize how much God loves to help us and clean up our messes. Jesus said there's joy in Heaven when one of us repents on earth – in our life, some of us have done more than our share to make sure they're happy in Heaven!

Struggles with temptation and sin are a part of human existence. There's simply no way around it. But for those who let God help them and forgive them, the spiritual fruits of humility, kindness, compassion, and true love for sinners (including the one we see in the mirror each morning) become more and more beautiful. Honestly, many of us fall only so that we learn to become humble and kind to sinners. Were it not for our own sins, how many times would we pick up stones to cast at the politicians we dislike or the neighbors who drive us crazy? Pope Francis alluded on the second day of his pontificate when he said, "*I am a sinner whom the Lord has looked upon. I am a sinner, but I trust in the infinite mercy and patience of Our Lord Jesus Christ and I accept in a spirit of penance.*" Even the Pope goes to confession – in this, he becomes a better spiritual father who truly loves and understands you and me.

So, when was your last confession? If it's been a while, ask God to send the Holy Spirit Who encourages us to do what's best for our soul. Resistance to confession is resistance to healing. And it's next to impossible to trust and to be joyful when we're hurting deep down inside. "*Jesus, I trust in You.*" Someday, please God, we'll all be able to say that together forever.

May God be praised for His Son's victory over sin and death! May our lives reflect His Mercy.

2nd Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

What a wonderful joy fills us today as we ponder the inexhaustible mercy of God. "Mercy is the heart of God," Pope Francis tells us. The image of a heart has been used to point to the very life source of a person as it is the organ that allows life to flow through our veins and sustain us. Mercy is the heart of God. Imagine this dynamic, powerful, compassionate, piercing, embracing, loving, propelling, penetrating, absorbing, and enveloping, transforming presence of God flowing into the very depth of our souls. It is God's mercy that allows blood to flow through our veins. It is God's mercy that forms every atom of our being and leads us to what is true. God's mercy reveals all superficiality and falsehood, and lays bare all distortions, empty promises, weakness, and sin.

"Mercy is the force that reawakens us to new life and instills in us the courage to look to the future with hope," Pope Francis continues. God's all forgiving, compassionate love is with us. When we finally believe and accept that Christ's resurrected transfigured presence resides with us, we then find within us a strong confidence to accept life's imperfections and disappointments and move on. Every day is a new adventure in new life. God leaves the past behind and opens doors to the future. It doesn't matter how many mistakes we made yesterday. All that matters is what we do tomorrow and what we learn along the way. It is so easy to remain tethered and mired in the past, but there is no need to do so. God is all about tomorrow and the work God has yet to do in our lives.

Mercy gives birth to hope. Hope for the greatest of sinners and hope for the worst of disasters. There is nothing God cannot do and nothing God cannot fashion. After all, everything we know and treasure was once nothing, and look what God did with the nothing God had! The resurrected Christ stands before us with nail marks in his wrists and wounds on his body as a testament that not even injustice, suffering and death can trample over and destroy God's mercy. What have we to fear? Why do we keep ourselves from peace? Our lack of faith prevents us from going forward and fully receiving the holiness God desires to breathe upon us. Breathe in God's mercy, allow the wind of God's presence to kiss all of your sins and caress all of your fears. Exhale peace.




Annual Appeal reached as of February 8, 2021

With grateful hearts we are excited to share that we have reached our Diocesan Appeal Goal. We would like to thank each of you for the generosity and support that you have given Holy Name of Jesus Parish. We couldn't have done it without you!

Debt Reduction – Smashing success! Thanks to the almost unbelievable generosity of so many Holy Name parishioners, we've reduced our parish debt by \$83,000! We had set a goal of raising \$14,000 so as to meet a matching gift, and we exceeded that goal within the first week of Lent. Therefore, we've eliminated the \$37,000 line item on our debt and reduced the \$96,000 line item by \$50,000. By this time next year we'll have moved from four line items of debt to two. Well done, good and faithful servants of God!






