From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! A friend passed along a letter she received from Father Norm Boneck many years ago. It contained a jingle titled "Ten Little Christians" and I think you'll find it worthwhile. To quote Father Boneck, "*Please read it carefully and prayerfully!*"

Ten Little Christians

*Ten little Christians came to church all the time;
One fell out with the preacher, then there were nine.*

*Nine little Christians stayed up late;
One overslept on Sunday, then there were eight.*

*Eight little Christians on their way to heaven;
One took the low road, then there were seven.*

*Seven little Christians, chirping like chicks;
One didn't like the music, then there were six.*

*Six little Christians seemed very much alive;
One got travelitis, then there were five.*

*Five little Christians pulling for heaven's shore;
One stopped to rest awhile, then there were four.*

*Four little Christians, each busy as a bee;
One got his feelings hurt, then there were three.*

*Three little Christians, couldn't decide what to do;
One couldn't have his way, then there were two.*

*Two little Christians, the story almost done;
One of them grew weary, then there was one.*

*One little Christian, can't do much; 'tis true;
But he brought a friend last Sunday, then there were two.*

*Two little Christians, each brought one more;
Now, don't you see? You add them up and $2 + 2 = 4$.
Four little Christians worked early and late;
Each of them brought one, and then there were 8.*

*Eight little Christians, if they double as before;
In just seven Sundays we have one thousand and twenty-four!*

*In this jingle, there is a lesson true:
You belong either to the building . . . or the wrecking crew!*

This weekend we celebrate the First Communion Mass of ten of our little ones. God willing, they're a part of the building crew that is bringing hope and new life to Holy Name. One key to living the faith is to remember that there are significant obstacles. Jesus suggested that the poor sower had to contend with birds, rocks, and weeds. But some seed did fall on good soil and it produced a tremendous harvest. As a parish family, we storm Heaven for our First Communicants, hoping that among them are some of the future saints of the 21st century. As we congratulate our First Communicants, we help them best with our prayers, sacrifices, and example.

Speaking of First Communion, I read about a seminarian from the Diocese of Madison who was raised in a family that rarely went to Mass. He made his First Communion, but after the thrill wore off, it was back to Mass only once or twice a year. Then one weekend while he was in high school, he happened to come across the Rosary that he received as a First Communion gift. He felt the strong urge to pray it, and so he did. That began some pretty impressive spiritual growth in his life, leading him eventually to the seminary where he is searching to know if God is calling him to serve as a priest someday. Seeds were sown that only God could see for many years. Now they're beginning to bear fruit and that's a blessing for the whole world. Please keep this little story in mind as we support the First Communicants and their families with our prayers.

Our next Sacramental milestone is Confirmation for six of our high school students on May 16th. Receiving the Holy Spirit completes the process of initiation as an adult Catholic in the Church and it comes with tremendous grace and responsibility. Sadly, the joke about how to get rid of bats in church is based on what often happens after Confirmation. Three ministers were discussing their issues with bats and the Lutheran minister admitted he had tried a professional service, but that hadn't worked. The Methodist minister recalled that he had built bat houses outside the church to attract them, but that hadn't worked either. The Catholic priest enthusiastically responded, "*Heck, I baptized and confirmed those bats, and they never came back!*" Sad, but too often true. Again, we're praying that our young people receive the faith deep down in their souls so that it won't fall prey to birds, rocks, or thorns.

May the reception of Jesus in Holy Communion help us to be passionate and persevering in our faith!

5th Sunday of Easter

“Spiraling out of control,” is a phrase that can easily describe the current display of human existence. In addition to the violence, unrest, uneasiness and turmoil that are common elements of our daily news, other essential pieces are misplaced or missing. Many lack an objective center around which to order and structure their lives or a clear set of definable goals or mores to act as guideposts and life directives. It appears that “feelings” have become a “new god” and traditional structures and ideals set aside. It is almost as if history only shows that we got this whole thing wrong and many are determined to finally set things right. The real truth, however, is that while wrongs and errors are certainly a part of our often-checkered past, it is hardly the case that all was wrong. It is not our task to rewrite the history of our lives, but to learn from mistakes that were made, and preserve the perennial wisdom at the root of our successes. Learning is an essential part of being human.

The question becomes, however, from whom do we learn? Some have such a hard time placing God in that position, but that is precisely where God needs to be. God is the Master Teacher from whom all of humanity learns and gets its cues. It is in and through this relationship with the Gardener of Life that we are fashioned and pruned into the people we are intended to be and can be. It is only in God that we are able to find our best selves. Sadly, many think that religion too, as well as history in general, has also gotten all this wrong. Yet, our resurrection faith tells us differently. We are reminded, today especially, that we are meant to remain in Christ as Christ remains in us. We are also reminded that Jesus, the Incarnate God, is the vine upon which we grow, the branches that flow from the source of God’s life.

Giving up our will to God’s can be a painful endeavor. It is not easy to set our own desires and wants aside and allow God to step in and direct and guide our growth. But this is the only way to prevent deadly weeds from overtaking us and bringing us to a place of self-destruction. God’s commandments are the very guideposts and benchmarks we need, yet many seek to remove them from all public view because they appear to limit self-expression and suppress what is considered by many to be “human freedom.” They are the only way we can find freedom, however. And, until we learn this fundamental lesson, we will continue to spiral out of control, never really knowing who we are, what our potential can be or how life really can be lived. We will not know peace.


