## From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! It is time to congratulate all of the graduates of 2021 and to assure them of our prayers as they take the next step in their earthly pilgrimage. And even though they'll receive a lot of it from family and friends, I too would like to offer some unsolicited advice. The first is my prayer that you have an adventuresome, which is to say, a very challenging life. In the words of the Russian dissident Irina Ratushinskaya, *"In a way, it's lucky to have a turbulent life. When everything is too easy, sometimes people lose their love of life, they lose enthusiasm."* Here's to you having enough crosses so that you will become both humble and holy.

Oh, and don't forget to laugh regularly. Many studies show that good humor is restorative of our health, both mental and physical. One of the struggles of being human is that we take ourselves too seriously. The other extreme is the kind of self-deprecation that fails to recognize that our life is a unique gift. Virtue lies in the middle of these extremes, and learning to laugh is a sign that we are grateful to God for the life He has given us. I once saved a stack of my favorites from Gary Larson's "The Far Side" and would pull them out once in a while just to enjoy a good chuckle. There's a monthly column in "Reader's Digest" that is titled, "Laughter, the best medicine." I hope you laugh often so that your soul remains young, innocent, and pure.

Finally, don't forget to floss. This might seem even more random than the previous advice, but it's really an accurate predictor of many things. Flossing requires discipline, which is necessary to pretty much every type of success in the history of the world. Moreover, flossing is good stewardship as it is a daily reminder of the care we owe our body and our physical health. One day we will die, that is inevitable. But being a good Christian requires respect for our health so that we may serve longer and more charitably. Plus, if you don't floss, you'll laugh less – we become more self-conscious as our teeth fall out. Jesus Himself said that fidelity in small matters leads to fidelity in greater matters. Brushing your teeth is the bare minimum. Flossing is for those who will go above and beyond the call of duty.

Okay, that's three points and that's probably as much as you can bear at this time in your life. So many of us learned things that we didn't understand or thought were patently false. The great thing about life is that there are two kind of people (and God knows you've heard this before): those who are humble, and those who are about to be! Life shakes us out and that's a good thing. Congratulations to all our graduates of 2021 – may your futures be characterized by good humor, courage at the cross, and a healthy set of teeth!

Okay, given that we're on the cusp of summer, a little humor is in order to put us in the mood for true recreation. The following is from a skit put on by the National Evangelization Team. I apologize that it's set in the context of the Chicago Cubs – otherwise, it's really well done.

*Harry: "Hello fans, this is Harry Carey alongside Steve Stone, we'd like to welcome you to today's game between the Bethlehem Braves and the Jerusalem Giants. Kind of a sparse crowd here today, as a plague of locusts made it tough to get out to the ballpark. You could hear the vendors go, 'hey manna, get your manna here, who wants bread from heaven? **Pentecost Sunday**

Begin by taking a moment to calm yourself, focus on your breathing and become aware of the life force that flows through your veins. Center yourself in the words and affections of St. Augustine’s Prayer to the Holy Spirit, “Breath in me, O Holy Spirit, that my thoughts may all be holy. Act in me, O Holy Spirit, that my work, too, may be holy. Draw my heart, O Holy Spirit, that I love but what is holy. Strengthen me, O Holy Spirit, to defend all that is holy. Guard me, then, O Holy Spirit, that I may always be holy.” Sanctifying, bringing things to wholeness, blessing, restoring and creating are just some of the fruits of the presence of the Holy Spirit. Being filled with the Holy Spirit is not always about proclaiming loud cries of praise or singing alleluia from a roof top. It is about unfolding and encountering the ordinary in an extraordinary way. Being filled with the Holy Spirit means being filled with the fullness of God’s life and in touch with the power and wonder of God’s presence. It’s about becoming holy.

It is not just for saints or people who have a religious vocation. Holiness is for the ordinary, simple run- of-the-mill person who desires to love God, others, and all of creation. When an ordinary, humble person becomes connected with life and the wondrous power of God’s love, they begin to live life more deeply, a bit more reverently, desire a simple fare and find themselves relishing in ordinary beauty. Their senses become attuned to the Author of life and they realize that they are not alone. The Holy Spirit connects all of the dots of human experience and existence, bringing everyone to center on the Divine Presence. The Holy Spirit does not just breathe “on me” but “in me” and is the force behind every breath I take. Take a moment to soak that thought in. There is the Divine Presence of the Holy Spirit in me, right now. When a person becomes in touch with truth, they know that when inspired by the Holy Spirit, his or her actions are not solely their own. They realize that they are moved by Divine Grace and drawn to things not found in secular affairs.

We live in a world where it is hard to discover truth. Real truth is veiled by so many imposters that it is hard to find, especially for those who are young. It is easy to get fooled and duped and often, without full conscious awareness of doing so, we choose to walk down a path of self-absorption and destruction. It is only the Holy Spirit, through the ministry of the church most especially, who guides us to truth and shows us the way to be the graced and holy human beings God made us to be. The wonders and inspirations of today’s Feast of Pentecost are necessary to share with both those we love and those who only casually cross our paths. The first disciples, touched by the Holy Spirit, brought the Gospel to the ends of the earth one step at a time. Is it unrealistic to ask that we assist in that same mission by helping people understand who they are and who God is one at a time? Ask the Holy Spirit to alleviate the fear in your heart that prevents you from doing so.




