From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi, which celebrates the conquering of a priest's doubt by a Eucharistic Miracle in 1246. Without going into all the details, suffice it to say that it was yet another in a seemingly infinite series of ways God has drawn extraordinary good out of rather dire circumstances. As you already know, we're hosting a modest Eucharistic Procession after the 10:30 a.m. Mass, which is our way of bringing Jesus to people who may not yet know Him or His ability to heal and instill hope. Of course, as the following quote points out, it's not easy to stand before Almighty God:

"Prayer brings us inexorably face-to-face with what we really are. Every single person has his or her dark side, that part of themselves that sometimes weighs heavily and is a source of shame, guilt, and anguish: human limitations, weaknesses, emotional wounds, areas of complicity with evil, incapacities, falls in different kinds, etc. Prayer makes us enter more and more deeply into God's light, and like a ray of sunlight coming into a dark room and revealing the tiniest speck of dust floating in the air, that lays bare our imperfections and our sins," (Jacque Philippe, [Thirsting for Prayer](#)).

One of the issues for us as human beings is that we tend to run to extremes. Whether it's raging with fury at the state of the world or cultivating a comfortably numb approach to it all (one made possible by the latest combination of chemicals that we've decided are no longer dangerous), we're invited to remember that virtue is generally somewhere in the middle. Edmund Burke insightfully discovered that balance when he once wrote, *"The only thing necessary for evil to prevail is for good people to do nothing."* What follows is an initiative that invites us to refrain from doing nothing (and even gives us sage advice as to what we can do to make a difference):

Last fall, Sanofi Pasteur decided it would no longer use an aborted fetal cell line to produce its polio combination vaccines Pentacel and Quadracel. After the move was approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, Greg Schleppebach, associate director of the pro-life secretariat sent an alert to diocesan pro-life directors about the development and asking them to in turn send a message of thanks to Sanofi Pasteur.

"One important step we can take to ensure the production of ethical vaccines is to recognize and thank drug companies, like Sanofi Pasteur, when they move away from unethical vaccine production," Schleppebach said in his alert. "We can hope that, with some encouragement, other vaccine manufacturers may consider creating other morally acceptable vaccines."

The USCCB letter-writing campaign is aimed, then, at encouraging the development of vaccines that do not use these cell lines. In promoting this campaign, Valerie Schmalz, director of the Office of Human Life & Dignity in the Archdiocese of San Francisco, urged Catholics there to participate in it because "we can never allow ourselves to become calloused to this gross violation of human dignity and life. We have an obligation to speak up for life and for a return to respect for all life in our society."

Thank God for good news – Sanofi Pasteur is, after all, the largest company in the world devoted entirely to vaccines. For them to choose a more ethical route will undoubtedly challenge other companies to do the same. But it's not all a bed of roses out there. One of the more troubling developments has to do with the widespread confusion regarding gender and human sexuality. As a case in point, consider the following story:

"Drag Queen Story Hour is designed to encourage children to see "glamorous, positive, and unabashedly queer role models." Its adoption at local libraries was among the issues that triggered a vigorous debate about the future of conservatism. What does a culture of freedom look like in a society so decadent that drag queens reading to six-year-olds is celebrated as widening our horizons and imparting to the young an open and capacious attitude toward 'difference?' The question remains open. But recent news sheds light on the less-than-upstanding character of sexual progressives. From 2017 to 2020, Brett Blomme served as the president of Cream City LGBTQ+ Foundation in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, the sponsor of the local Drag Queen Story Hour program. In March, he was arrested for possession of child pornography. (First Things, May, 2021, pg. 67).

At this point, you might be upset and want to cast stones. However, a better response is to pray. We're in the dairy state and it's the beginning of the growing season. Let's pray to Saint Isidore for all who are raising the food that will sustain us through another winter (if you want to pray for those who raise the flowers that lift our spirits, that's fine too):

Prayer to St. Isidore: Good Saint, we are told that your devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass was so great that you would rise before it was light in order to be able to attend Mass before beginning your work in the fields. Obtain for us, we pray, some of that loving devotion to the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. There it is that the fruits of our farm labor, bread and wine, are brought and offered to God by the priest. Then, in the Consecration, Christ Himself, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity, becomes present on our altars under the appearances of this same bread and wine. And in what was the altar bread, He comes to us to be the very food of our souls. If we deeply realize the value and beauty of Holy Mass, we will be very happy to attend as often as we possibly can. Help us to understand that in the Mass we offer ourselves to God with Christ by the hands of the priest. There we can bring to God all that we do, and offer it to Him in union with His Holy Sacrifice. The more often we do this now, the happier we shall be hereafter. Good Saint Isidore, bless us and our labors, that we may someday reap the reward of good works with you in heaven. Amen.

Finally, we end in a spirit of jest – the following little ditty was passed along by a parishioner and it's downright delightful to read it outloud:

"I'm on a Committee"
Oh, give me some pity, I'm on a committee,
Which means that from morning to night,
We attend, we amend, and contend, and defend
Without a conclusion in sight.

We confer and concur, we defer and demur,
And reiterate all of our thoughts.
We revise the agenda with frequent addenda,
And consider a load of reports.

We compose and propose, we suppose and oppose,
And the points of procedure are fun!
But though various notions are brought up as motions,
There's terribly little gets done.

We resolve and absolve, but we never dissolve,
Since it's out of the question for us.
What a shattering pity to end our committee;
Where else could we make such a fuss!

Because of the recent relaxation of certain restrictions due to the COVID situation, Bishop Callahan has granted us permission to follow suit. Here are the changes that were already put into effect this past weekend:

- 1) Holy Water and music books were restored to their previous places. Keep in mind that if you are nervous about germs, we will retain the hand sanitizer stations (and maybe one of the blessings of this past year is a return to good hygiene, i.e. regular washing of our hands).
- 2) Social distancing is still in place, but we have removed the ribbons on every other pew. Please be conscious of how close you sit to others with whom you might not be in frequent contact (which means you're encouraged to sit with family or friends).
- 3) Wearing a mask is highly encouraged for those who are not vaccinated. Because we don't know who is vaccinated and who is not, we will not be patrolling this in any way. We presume that you know both the recommended safety precautions and the risks for those who do not follow them. Let's continue to respect that some will want to wear a mask while others will not. The devil loves division, but so far the people of Holy Name have done a solid job of being docile to the things we've been asked to do. That has saved a lot of hurt feelings, and for that I thank you.
- 4) Finally, during quarantine last spring, we worked on creating a lending library for those of you who are looking for a good book to help you grow in your faith. That bookshelf is open and available to you and it can be found in the west entrance. Please help yourself. The only request is that you do not leave any books that have not been approved by the pastor.

Again, thank you for your cooperation.


