

From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! This Sunday we'll feature our first "Movie of the Month" and we'll be meeting in the school for a 2:00 p.m. showing of "The Scarlet and the Black." This is one of the finest films of the 20th century and you'll be grateful you took the time to watch it. Based on a true story, it shows the heroic nature of Catholicism when it's lived fully. We have comfy chairs, a big television, and great sound. You're welcome to bring your own snacks and non-alcoholic drinks.

Yes, there is a lot going on in the world right now, but not all of it is bad. For example, we're looking forward to celebrating our 75th anniversary in two weeks. Hopefully you're praying for nice weather. As you know, Saturday evening we're hosting the band "Hyde" for a concert. Four food trucks will supply plenty of good eats and there will be beer and Holy Name's famous hospitality. On Sunday, after the 10:30 a.m. Mass we're offering all of our parishioners a delicious pig roast, compliments of Holy Name and some generous benefactors. If the weather is nice, we'll serve the meal outside in the tent. At the end of the meal there will be homemade desserts provided by our own parishioners. Then the excitement will begin . . . we'll draw the winners of the bucket raffle and move right into the auction. You've seen the list of raffle prizes and the amazing items for the auction. This promises to be an enjoyable afternoon and we hope it will be a fond memory for us in the years to come.

When it comes to celebrating milestones, someone is generally asked to say a few words to set the mood. Many years ago, when our Cathedral of Saint Joseph the Workman in La Crosse was dedicated to God, it was Cardinal Cushing of Boston who spoke the following eloquent words:

"There is not one window, one altar, one column, one piece of work in this cathedral without immortalizing the generosity of someone who contributed to its building. Each sacred vessel, each statue, each thing of beauty or devotion in this cathedral immortalizes someone's faith, someone's hope, someone's charity, someone's devotion to his beloved dead, someone's prayer for his friends or kinsmen alive, someone's gratitude to God for a blessing received or confident petition of a mercy desired. Every nail, every stone, every element brought or ornament paid for is someone's act of adoration, reparation, petition or thanksgiving. This cathedral is the indestructible, monumental accumulation of the prayers, the hopes, the ideals, the acts of faith . . . of all the people of the Diocese of La Crosse. It is the sanctuary in which a people speaks to God," (May 13th, 1962). Very beautiful words that could be accurately applied to our own church and all the generous prayers and sacrifices that made it possible. May the men and women who made it possible intercede for us and may we honor them by living our own faith generously and joyfully.

Okay, lest someone accuse me of being Pollyannaish, there are many struggles and discouraging things happening in our world today. We did our best to respond to the terrible suffering in Haiti and we sent a check for over \$3,000 to assist in the rebuilding of their country following the devastating earthquake. Now many Afghans are coming to Fort McCoy and will need to be relocated sometime in the not-so-distant future. While that's all being sorted out, both Catholic Charities and Saint Vincent de Paul are coordinating efforts to provide for their basic needs. If you'd like to help out, please go to the website cclse.org and you'll find a link to Afghanistan Refugee Assistance. If and when the relocation of families takes place, I'll let you know of any opportunities for us to help out.

Another opportunity to do some good for others is coming to Holy Name the weekend of October 9th and 10th. Monsignor Joseph Hirsch will be speaking at the Masses about the remarkable work being done at our diocesan orphanage in Peru. Monsignor Hirsch has served at Casa Hogar for nearly 10 years and he's done fantastic work continuing the legacy left by Father Joseph Walijewski. There will be the opportunity to support Casa Hogar when Monsignor Hirsch comes.

Of course, you might be wondering about the Diocesan Annual Appeal. For a variety of reasons, it's been a bit delayed this fall. But don't you worry, it's as inevitable as death and taxes. We've managed to make our goal for the past two years and we intend to continue this positive trend. Among other things, the Diocesan Annual Appeal supports our future priests and our Lay Formation Institute. We'll be hosting the Lay Formation Institute on October 8th and 9th and again in February and March. Holy Name is honored to be fostering such a fantastic program, even if it means our parking lot will be a bit more crowded those weekends.

As long as we're on a roll, let's welcome the Knights of Columbus to Holy Name. They sold their clubhouse on 1st Avenue and have relocated to the basement of the Parish Center. Besides keeping me up with their raucous parties and loud music, it's been a blessing to have them with us. The Knights are valiant in their work with people with special needs, which is simply a fruit of their commitment to the sanctity of human life. They've done yeoman's work in building up marriage and family too. We are very happy to welcome the Knights of Columbus to their new home at Holy Name (and I was kidding about their penchant for partying)!

Lastly, as mentioned in the homily last weekend (which is always recorded – you can find it on our parish website), there will be the first-ever March for Life in Madison on Saturday, October 2nd. The bus will leave Wausau that day at 9:00 a.m. If you're interested, please sign up at prolifewi.org (scroll down under the "Get Involved" tab) and you'll help bring the light of God's truth and compassion to our fallen world. If you've never been on a march for life, this is a wonderful opportunity. For the record, you'll be home in time for Hyde and a jumbo hot dog.

May God help us see the good and to become bearers of light in the midst of these shadowlands!

There is something about being first. Whether it be first in line, first to be picked for the team, or the first one to finish their work, great satisfaction is achieved. Our egos love being first. It somehow sets us apart from everyone else, gives us a sense of pride and positions us to feel better than others. When we are first, we can glory in our efforts, skills, and achievements. Isn't that what really matters? After all, we are taught from a very young age to be proficient, stay on top, be the best at what we do, and win the praise and esteem of others. This is the stuff that makes us successful and provides us with a comfortable, satisfying life.

Jesus wants none of it. All of the details we anguish over mean little to the kingdom of God. You want to be first? Then, be a servant and welcome a child. All of this is the opposite of our often vehement pursuits. If we are serious about following Jesus and living the Gospel, then we must put the needs of others before our own. If we continue to listen only to the noise of the world, we are going to continue to believe the illusions we inherit. Those illusions come in many forms, but all have things in common: me before you, being on top and not the bottom, us versus them, personal security over universal harmony and peace. When are we going to learn that always striving to be the best and first is an empty pursuit in our struggle for happiness? While satisfying our ego with this momentary boost of esteem may feel good for a moment, is it what we really desire?

If we can break from the world's noise and create a space of sacred silence in our lives, we can begin to listen and see that we are being called in another direction. What we really desire is not the bolstering of our egos but the innocence we lost somewhere along the way. When we can be playful, joyful, and even somewhat carefree, life is good. We want our relationships to work, a place to call home, and to live peaceful lives with our sisters and brothers. Only a servant can do this. The servant's prayer seeks to detach from self-concern in order to be used by God. Rather than worrying about being first and coming out on top, we can be inspired, guided, empowered, and led to do good works. Stop worrying about being first and put greater energy into feeling joy.




