

From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! *"I'm so glad I live in a world where there are Octobers. It would be terrible if we just skipped from September to November, wouldn't it?"* ([Anne of Green Gables](#), LM Montgomery). We're enjoying one of the most beautiful autumns and the temperatures have been fantastic. Just last weekend God blessed us with remarkable weather as we thanked Him for the 75 years Holy Name has completed since being founded in 1946. It was an incredible weekend and to everyone who had a part in bringing it together, may God reward you. Elsewhere in this bulletin you'll find the list of those who generously purchased items in the auction, as well as the winners of the raffle prizes. We thank God for all who made it such a fun weekend.

Before delving into our October theme, some of you may be scratching your heads, wondering if I've really read [Anne of Green Gables](#). No, I haven't, though I did read LM Montgomery's [The Blue Castle](#) this past summer and it was a great book that I would recommend to anyone who enjoys reading. Probably the best book I've read so far this year is titled [Late Have I Loved Thee](#) by Ethel Mannin. But let's get back to the month of October, which is, among other things, "Respect Life" month. We're living in historic times as Roe vs. Wade is facing its staunchest challenge since it was codified by law in 1973. Here is some heartening news that appears in the October issue of the magazine, "First Things":

"Let me offer a prediction, free of any face-saving hedge: Next year, the Supreme Court will hold that there is not constitutional right to elective abortions. In Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization, a case pending before the court, it will return the issue to the states for the first time in forty-nine years. It will do so explicitly, calling out by name, and reversing in full, the two major cases that confected and then entrenched a constitutional right to elective abortion: Roe v. Wade (1973) and Planned Parenthood v. Casey (1992). And the vote will be six to three.

As I write – as you read – unborn children are being slain. As a practical matter, Roe and Casey must be reversed before any of these children can enjoy the full protection of the law. Abortion will not end overnight. Some states will continue to permit the procedure until the Court acknowledges that the unborn possess the right to life. Even women who live in states that prohibit the procedure will be free to cross state lines. But we know that even modest obstacles save lives. The denial of federal funding for elective abortions is estimated to save some sixty thousand unborn children each year. So let us be frank. There is a cost to delay, and that cost comes in innocent lives. That is yet another reason to expect the only defensible outcome: Next year, the Supreme Court will reverse Roe and Casey." (Robert George).

Prayer and fasting are the most potent spiritual weapons when it comes to driving out demons. Terminating the lives of innocent babies is an ancient demon, one that was once called Molech (cf. Leviticus 20:2ff). As people committed to loving God and our neighbor, we're obligated to work to protect all human beings, from conception until natural death. Please consider praying the Rosary more frequently for the legal protection of all of God's children, and for the conversion of those who oppose Him in any way.

Today we find ourselves in serious straits, and it's easy to give in to darkness and a feeling of futility. It's precisely in such times that a dose of perspective is necessary so that we can recover our fortitude and inner peace. There's a great book titled [A Song for Nagasaki](#) that tells the true story of Dr. Takashi Nagai and his heroic faith. As the book makes clear, Nagai's faith was only possible because generation after generation of Christians before him had struggled valiantly to pass along this precious gift. After Saint Francis Xavier brought the faith to Japan (1549), it wasn't long before it was forced underground because of some of the fiercest persecutions Christians have ever faced. While he was dying of crucifixion, Saint Paul Miki spoke these words to his fellow Christians: *"I am a Japanese and a brother of the Society of Jesus. I have committed no crime. The only reason I am condemned to die is that I have taught the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ. I am happy to die for that and accept death as a great gift from my Lord."*

"Miki assured them there was no fear because heaven was real. He had only one dying request: that they believe," (pg. 52, [A Song for Nagasaki](#), Glynn). The Church had to go into hiding, and at various points the Japanese authorities were confident that it had been vanquished once and for all. Nevertheless, the Catholic faith was preserved and handed on time after time in one of the most remarkable and clandestine way the world has ever seen. Somehow the Catholic faith endured from 1571 until 1865 without any access to the Sacraments, when a French missionary priest was approached and asked if he honored the Mother of God. In the face of extraordinary hostility, the Japanese faithful had endured many threats and constant fear so that Catholicism would survive in their land. No matter what our struggles are today, they do not approach what those intrepid people faced.

Before leaving His Apostles, Jesus promised that *"in the world you will have trouble,"* (John 16:33). Standing up for the sanctity of life is not always easy or popular. And these are volatile times. What made the Christians in Japan risk life and limb to pass on their faith? They truly believed and were willing to suffer and even die so that others might share their beliefs. The good news is that we know that a new life begins at conception – there is no doubt about that among embryologists or any other type of scientist or doctor. Some are willing to deny that the new organism is human, but give it just over two weeks and its heart begins to beat. Give it time and it will look like you and me, so human in fact that someone will give him or her a name. Wittingly or unwittingly, Dr. Seuss got it right when he wrote, *"A person's a person, no matter how small."* No human person is so small, in fact, that we don't owe him our love and protection. It won't be long, please God, that our laws will begin to recognize this too.

May we defend and protect all of God's children, especially those who are most vulnerable!

October 10, 2021 - 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

If we are truly in love with God, then the basics are not going to be enough. That love is going to want to be expressed in going above and beyond, in leaving the comfortable and familiar, in stretching and growing, and in following a voice other than our own. St. Teresa of Calcutta rightly instructs us that for "love to be real, it must cost, it must hurt, it must empty us of self." Being in love with God requires more than just checking the boxes of the commandments. It requires a sincere and unconditional self-investment. Desiring God with our whole heart, mind, and soul means that I must also desire a relationship with my neighbor with that same degree of fervor.

Biases and prejudices usually occur when people are kept at a distance and treated as objects. We cannot truly know our neighbors, especially if they are different than us, if we keep them in boxes and do not listen to their stories. When we open ourselves to listen to another person's story, we begin to realize more how similar we are than dissimilar. Being overly attached to our possessions, ideologies, agendas, lifestyles, and personal needs are absolute barriers to achieving the type of personal investment love demands. This is why following Christ can be difficult. It is less a matter of intellect and more a matter of heart and soul. It requires that we transfer our treasure from an investment in tangible secular things and move it into the Kingdom of God. It is only the gift of wisdom and discernment that can help us decide what to do and how to do it.

Contemporaries of Jesus would know that a camel could not enter through the portal of a city weighed down with the baggage it was carrying. In order to enter, the baggage must be removed so that the animal could fit through the entry way. The same is true for us. We carry a lot of excessive baggage around with us that keeps us tethered to our past histories, wounds, myopic world views, prejudices, fears, and suspicions. To invest ourselves in the Kingdom of God, do God's work and live out our love relationship with God, we need to shed the extra weight. While it may seem that a lot of that stuff is necessary, it really is not. We are much more than the things that we think define us and more secure than we think. The more there is to hold on to and the more that we carry with us, the harder it will be to leave it all behind. Many choose not to and walk away sad because they are not ready to trust.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd at Holy Name

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS) is a religious education method centered around the parable of the Good Shepherd and based largely on the Montessori method of education. Through interactive lessons and hands-on experiences, children learn about God and faith in a way that is experiential, tangible and developmentally appropriate.

The focus of the program is to deepen the child's existing relationship with God; to encourage the formation of a personal prayer life; to participate fully in the liturgical and sacramental life of the Church; and to develop a deeper understanding of Catholic identity and tradition.

CGS is divided into three levels, and each level differs in tasks and instruction according to the developmental needs of the child. Level one is for ages 3-6, level two for ages 6-9, and level three for ages 9-12. All sessions will be from 2:30-5:30 pm with Level I on Wednesday, Level II on Tuesday and Level III on Thursday. If you work, perhaps a grandfather or grandmother, an aunt or uncle, or a big brother or sister could do the pick up and drop off for you.

CGS can be the program of choice for any of our religious education families. However, it does not have to be one or the other. Last year we had children that attended CGS and Religious Education classes, and other children that attended both CGS and Newman Catholic schools. It's an entirely different experience for the children in the Atrium.

Families that are interested are invited to schedule a walk through the Atrium to find out more about CGS and determine if it would work for your child. Please call the office at 715-842-4543 to set up a time for a visit.
