

## From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! I put my socks on with greater ease this morning than I've experienced in many months. Maybe that's not information that you find inspiring. Just the same, sharing our little victories can help us find joy in the seemingly mundane and ordinary aspects of human existence. After struggling through the deterioration of my last original hip, I am elated to be able to do some of the things that have not been so easy as of late. Now if I could only find my old skateboard . . . . (just kidding, Mom!)

It's Lent and that means we're a bit more receptive to some of the spiritual truths that God is perpetually trying to teach us. As Saint Thomas Aquinas put it eight centuries ago, "a thing is received according to the mode of the receiver." In layman's parlance, that means we're not always in the right frame of mind to truly learn the lessons that life entails. For example, people who are distressed, fatigued, or distracted are not going to be as receptive as folks who are rested and who truly relish the truth. While only God can truly change hearts and amend attitudes, there are some other factors that make us more or less open to the truth. The three transcendentals of beauty, goodness, and truth often have a way of opening our hearts and minds. A co-worker many years ago was visibly moved as he described the birth of his first child. The beauty of life just blew him away.

One of the realities that rather surprisingly can open us to the truth is suffering. While we don't like it and many times do our utmost to avoid it, suffering stretches us in some remarkable ways. The good news is that we do not have to seek out ways to suffer – many of them are built in. Take aging, for example – we're only going to experience it once. But it can become a source of real sorrow, self-pity, and even depression. A friend sent along some little gems of wisdom, including the following that especially fits this topic: "Don't resent growing older. Many are denied the privilege." That's a good perspective for us to consider when we start to complain about how hard it is to put our socks on in the morning.

Incidentally, there were other pearls of wisdom that my friend shared and I thought you would enjoy them too: 1) Accept the fact that some days you're going to be the pigeon and some days you're going to be the statue. 2) Speak your mind but ride a fast horse. 3) And remember, life should NOT be a journey to the grave with the intention of arriving safely in an attractive and well-preserved body, but rather to skid in sideways – Bible in one hand, cigar in the other – body thoroughly used up, totally worn out and screaming, "Woo-Hoo, what a ride!" As for that last piece of advice, a friend often employed a malapropism when he said, "I resemble that comment!" (he should have said "resent" instead of "resemble").

Moving along, any good parish wants to offer marriages and families as much support and good advice as possible. Holy Name is growing and we have more and more families joining us. That's a tremendous blessing and a genuine answer to our prayers. Raising a family has never been easy, and the challenges today are very different from the challenges of previous generations. As a way of encouragement, Chuck and Judy Neff are coming from their home in Saint Louis to share some lessons they've learned in their over 50 years of marriage. They'll be speaking at Holy Name on Sunday, March 27<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. and you won't want to miss it. This will be especially relevant to married couples or young people hoping to marry someday. Chuck has written two books and he'll be happy to sign one for you in exchange for a free will offering. The talk will last an hour.

I have known Chuck for a good fifteen years. We worked together during that time on the Relevant Radio show titled "The Inner Life." If you've never heard the show, it's a way of offering spiritual direction to people who call in with their hopes and their heartaches, their grief and their gratitude. Chuck was fantastic as the host and I miss him dearly (even though the new host, Josh Raymond, is extraordinary too). A friend and I drove to Saint Louis last summer to surprise Chuck in his retirement. We spent the night in the home that he and his wife Judy raised their four children. It was a blessing and an honor to be there. I hope you'll join us next Sunday evening for what will be an edifying and educational hour.

When my Mom visited during the week of my surgery, she brought along a poem titled "*Beatitudes for Parents*." She thought I should have a copy. Upon reading it, I knew it was worthy of being shared here because it's an encouragement from God Himself for our young parents and families. For those who are more seasoned and who have survived the toughest years of marriage, this might come as a valedictory address, reminding you of how difficult but also how glorious those years of active parenthood really were. Enjoy!

- You delight Me when you long to be just and good. When you work so hard to nurture your children and provide them with good example, I am deeply pleased.
- You delight Me when you are kind and merciful. When you forgive your children countless times, despite their continual mischief, I am deeply pleased.
- ♦ You delight Me when you are pure of heart. When you sacrifice your comfort, and pray for the strength to persevere, I am deeply pleased.
- ♦ You delight Me when, in order to do My will, you suffer persecution. I am deeply pleased with you. Rejoice and be glad, for I am preparing a fabulous reward for you. Even now, when you call upon Me with an unwavering faith, I promise to send blessings of peace and joy. Persevere in My strength and know that your care is of My own.

#### March 20, 2022 - 3rd Sunday of Lent

Deserts can be lonely, isolated, and treacherous places. When a person wanders in a desert, they can easily get disoriented, dehydrated, confused, lost, and vulnerable. Temptation is at its peak, especially when confronted with something that may offer some respite or relief, even a mirage. Deserts can bring us to our weakest moment and tempt our faith. The Christian journey can be described as a desert experience as we vacillate back and forth, falling victim to the mirages of our lives versus the true, life-giving water offered by God. We need a burning bush experience in our lives that convinces us of the power of God and reveals Him as the "I am" of all existence.

Moses was leading his flock across the desert when he found himself at Mount Horeb. Mountains give us a fuller perspective of life, a panoramic view of what would otherwise be hidden from the limitations of our sight. That's when Moses met God. We have to find our way to a mountain experience where our vantage point can take on a wider view of life. Many things can do this for us: the birth of a child, the death of someone we love, the joy that comes from marveling at the beauty of God's work, the pondering of life's mysteries, and the ache of longing found deep within our souls. There are many things in life that can wake us up, give us a clearer, better view of things and become occasions where a bush may burn and God's presence as the eternal uncreated One is revealed.

God is very patient and gives us the time and space we need to figure things out and bear some good fruit. He doesn't rush to cut us down or get frustrated with our barrenness. But we have to remember that the desert journeys of our lives come with some risks. The major risk is that we will mistakenly believe that the mirages are real. Thus, we fall victim to thinking that the respite and refreshment we seek is discovered in a place other than where it actually is. Our faith and the life of the Church are the safeguards we need to keep us properly orientated so that we don't get lost or confused and stay on course.

Please consider becoming a mentor to help participants in a successful St Vincent de Paul program called "Getting Ahead in a Just Getting-By World." This 16-20 session workshop helps individuals build their own personal plan to get out of poverty. The program helps participants explore their "Life Now"; develop their "Future Story"; and learn how they can apply the "Theory of Change" to "Get Ahead." Mentors are a powerful part of this process. Those living in unstable environments need people in their lives who can support them through the very difficult changes necessary to build skills, change relationships, connect with resources, and develop the attitudes and behaviors necessary to complete this journey. Typically, Mentors meet with their investigators once a week for one hour and are available for occasional phone calls. Mentors are not a 24/7 hotline, nor do they provide financial support.
