From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! And a very Blessed Easter to you! Today's Mass celebrates the greatest miracle God ever produced, the victory of His Son over sin and death. Every Sunday points back to that first Easter morning, so characterized by shock, grief, hope, and exhilaration. It takes us a lifetime to begin to appreciate and fully believe what that event means for us: that even though we must die, that will not be the end of us. No, because Jesus lives, we shall live, and even if we must leave this beautiful world, we are awaited in a place which allows no sorrow, no suffering, no sin. Easter is the crossroads of human history because it marks the beginning of the end of the darkness. The Light is here now, and it is our greatest joy to believe in it and to proclaim it with our lives.

All that being said, we still tend to cower in fear and settle for the disappointing pleasures of this world. Many years ago, a movie by the name of "Good Will Hunting" did a remarkable job of showing how often people settle for the path of least resistance. Without spoiling the plot, the Italian title for the film is very insightful: "Genius Rebels." It's a story about a boy named Will Hunting who is a mathematical prodigy. Except that he's broken on the inside and has no desire to use his gift except to embarrass others, especially those who are blinded by their own conceit. Will's best friend (Chuckie) finds all of this to be entertaining, except one time when he admits that it upsets him to see Will wasting his God-given potential. In one of the more poignant scenes of the movie, Chuckie finally confronts Will and this is what he says: *"Let me tell you what I do know; every day, I come by your house and I pick you up. And we go out, we have a few drinks, and a few laughs, and it's great. You know what the best part of my day is? It's for about ten seconds when I pull up to the curb to when I get to your door. 'Cause I think maybe I'll get up there and I'll knock on the door, and you won't be there. No goodbye, no "see ya later", no nothin'. You just left. I don't know much, but I know that."* Chuckie hopes that someday Will's incredible gift will inspire him to go out into the world to use it for good.

You'll have to watch the movie if you want to see what Will decides, (Caveat: it has a lot of rough language, and some pretty tough scenes about abuse and sexuality). It's a theme that fits with Easter because Jesus saw us settling for mediocrity and He knew that would never be enough for us. He entered our world to save us, and He did so by challenging us. He wants our best and so He gave us His best first. As the old hymn put it, *"How can you say 'no' to this man?"* Witnessing His death and Resurrection is a clarion call for each of us to respond with a generous spirit. We drag our feet and complain about so many things, and we think we're justified. But that's only because we don't really know Him or what He did for us. There's a scene in "The Chosen" when the Apostles are bickering about worldly and ambitious things. Just at the height of their argument, Jesus walks by, heading for bed because He's absolutely exhausted. Having just spent the entire day healing people and forgiving their sins, Jesus' body and soul are completely worn out. Seeing Him in such a pitiful condition, the Apostles feel embarrassed to have been caught arguing about such worldly and superficial things. When we truly consider the life, death, and Resurrection of Jesus, we feel something happen in our heart. It's called the beginning of true love.

Until we realize the depths of what Jesus did for us, we're just too weak to be able to pull ourselves up by our bootstraps and follow Him. Unless we come to understand His gift, we're really not all that inclined to make a heroic gift of our own. Like Will Hunting, we tend to play it safe and to become bottom feeders. We could live a remarkable life if we really wanted to, but we're afraid to try. And we're not the first to note this fear.

As Marianne Williamson once put it, we're more afraid of what we could be than of what we really are. Her famous quotation puts it best: *"Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness that most frightens us. We ask ourselves, 'Who am I to be brilliant, gorgeous, talented, fabulous?' Actually, who are you not to be? You are a child of God. Your playing small does not serve the world. There is nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We are all meant to shine, as children do. We were born to make manifest the glory of God that is within us. It's not just in some of us; it's in everyone. And as we let our own light shine, we unconsciously give other people permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others."*

If you've read this far, you might regret it. After all, God has to challenge us and that tends to make us uncomfortable. Someday we'll regret that we didn't come to Mass every Sunday – when we see who Jesus really is and all the good that the Mass does for others, we'll feel terrible that we missed it so often. And when we realize all the times we excused our sins by judging others to be far worse than us, we'll feel the shame that comes with a recognition of our own guilt. And should we be confronted, not only with the sins we committed, but by all the good we neglected to do, our sorrow will be complete.

Easter is a chance to start again, to remember that we don't have to squander our God-given gifts forever. It's time for us to start living according to God's plan, not our own; to do His will and not always what we want. A wise inscription above the seminary gym in La Crosse put it this way: *"Better to aim high and miss than to aim low and hit."* It's time to stop aiming low. Easter is God's invitation to live His life and to begin today.

May God bless you and your family with the hope and courage of His Easter Victory!

April 17, 2022 - Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

There are many stones in our paths that keep us from truly living and being free. Some of these boulders have been there for a very long time. They have been there so long that they have even settled into the soil of our lives with other weeds, vines, and compacted soil keeping them firmly in place. We find them hard to move and trying to do so can be exhausting. What are these suffocating albatrosses that keep us so tethered and immobile? They are many things.

They are past childhood wounds and hurts that stem from disappointment, rejection, or abuse. People may have told us we were unwanted, that the world is frightening, that there are only some acceptable feelings you can have and others you cannot. We may have tried to love someone or struggled to figure out how and were met with rejection. Maybe we trusted someone completely and were betrayed. We come to life collecting barnacles that begin to attach to other barnacles and before you know it, we have a mass of solid matter blocking our vision and keeping us from moving. We live in fear. We are afraid of losing what we have, afraid that the future will be empty, afraid that we won't succeed and even more afraid that we will not be loved. There is so much fear. Didn't Jesus tell us not to worry and to not be afraid? Either we believe in the message of Easter, or we don't!

Go confidently into the night. Walking with God you will find the light and strength you need. Often without even knowing, God will move those boulders and stumbling blocks that bind us and, with putting one foot in front of the other and looking forward, we will move. The resurrection of Christ is really all about receiving the gifts of trust and faith and doing new things. The rocks that bind us keep us spinning the same wheels and doing the same things. When was the last time you threw caution to the wind and actually did something totally out of character and different? This is where we find God, in the spontaneous, the adventurous, the fun, and the creative choices we make! God is not boring and stuck. God is exciting and engaging. Jesus Christ is risen from the dead! Find a way to trust that this is true and live.

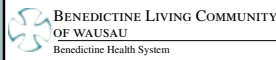
