

From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! Fads are funny things. They come and go and mentioning them dates you in a rather specific way. For example, if I mention the song "Macarena" and you immediately start dancing in peculiar ways, that means you were of age in the 1990s and are still recovering from what became an international phenomenon. Then again, if butterfly collars and bell bottoms were your thing, that means you were born before me and were embarrassed when my generation came along and rolled up our jeans and grew mullets. Thankfully, all of that was before social media, which seems to have an infinitely long memory. In other words, Polaroids were a lot easier to destroy.

This is a long preface to a man who needs little introduction, Billy Ray Cyrus. He of the "Achy Breaky Heart" fame struck gold when it came to the line dancing movement. Please know that I would never say anything derogatory about line dancing at least not in a bulletin column. For those of us who suffer with phobia for anything that has to do with a dance floor, line dancing was just about the most intimidating thing ever. Not that there weren't reluctant converts who eventually fully embraced the movement (watch "American Underdog," the fantastically true story of Kurt and Brenda Warner. Kurt is a source of hope to all who have hitherto stood on the sidelines of the line dancing scene). Cyrus' song lit up the line dancing circuit like a Christmas tree and it probably allowed him to retire a little sooner than the rest of us will. But that's not even close to his best song.

For my money, "Some gave all" is his much more meaningful and hauntingly beautiful song about patriotism. The refrain goes as follows: "All gave some, but some gave all. And some stood through for the red, white, and blue, and some had to fall. So if you ever think of me, think of all your liberties and recall... that some gave all." Profound stuff, especially as we begin to prepare for Memorial Day and all that it means to our country and its veterans. By the way, for those of you who will be in town on Memorial Day, Mass will be offered in the Saint Joseph and Saint Michael Cemetery (Pine Grove) at 9:00 a.m., weather permitting. Please bring a chair if you're able to attend.

Okay, now we're going to make a rather unexpected segue: the connection between patriotism and our current diocesan campaign ("Inspired by the Spirit"). Campaigns are not always very popular things, especially when they're aligned with parish life. In church we want to hear about spiritual things, and that's all well and good. But we do have to turn on the lights, not to mention the air conditioning or the heat, (sometimes one right after the other, like this year). So we have campaigns periodically to make sure we're staying afloat, financially speaking.

Let's tie together the Cyrus song about some giving all and the capital campaign. I was on my way back to Holy Name after visiting my Mom on April 29th when I ran into one of our biggest donors yet. It was just after 3:15 a.m. (I wanted to be back in time for 7:00 a.m. confessions and 8:00 a.m. Mass) when I ran into him – let's call him "Billy Ray Buck." I'm not sure how fast I was going, but it was certainly an all-conference tackle. I hit him square and his soul must have left his body immediately. And while I was thankfully okay, when I stopped in Viroqua for a cup of coffee and to survey the damage, I knew it wasn't good. Billy Ray Buck did a real number to my car, but he was thoughtful enough to not damage the alignment. I was able to drive to Wausau without any further difficulties.

Running into Billy Ray like that led to the body shop's conclusion that the car was a total loss. Honestly, at times I've felt sorry for myself and the inconvenience of having to buy a new car. But then I remember Billy Ray, who had probably crossed that road hundreds of times without incident. But it was not all in vain: State Farm gave me a five-figure payout for the value of the car, and in honor of Billy Ray, I gave it all to the campaign. "All gave some" – yes, that's our hope for the campaign, that all participate in some way. "But some gave all" – when any of us begins to pout and complain about the campaign, we'd do well to remember that Billy Ray gave his life for this campaign. Not that he would play the guilt card, but just the same

That's enough about the campaign and Billy Ray (I bought a Ford Escape, for those of you wondering). In two weeks Summerfun will be here and that means it's time to start praying for clement weather. Last fall when we celebrated our 75th anniversary as a parish, I heard more than once the admission, "*Father, when we put up tents in the parking lot, bad things happen!*" I suppose it just wouldn't be Summerfun without some bad weather. Just the same, I say we all pray for sunshine, 75 degrees, and big crowds of people who are obviously enjoying themselves.

It's not too late to sell raffle tickets: we have both the cash raffle and the special raffle. The winners will be drawn for both raffles on Sunday, so we still have time to hit the streets and sell more tickets. It's also not too late to sign up as a volunteer. We have a lot of new families at Holy Name and one of the best ways to get to know each other is to work together. Summerfun has been around for over 40 years and the money raised has done untold good for our parish and for our community. As the old adage puts it, "many hands make light work." If you haven't already done so, please sign up as a volunteer in the back of church.

By the time you sit down to read this article, we will have passed the halfway mark of our campaign goal. We feel very confident that we will make our goal sometime in the next couple of weeks. More important than the monetary amount is the participation level. A healthy family is one in which each person contributes something to the common good. We each have different gifts and are at different places in our lives. As Mother Teresa put it, "There is something that you can do that I can't do; there is something that I can do that you can't do. Together, let's do something beautiful for Jesus." That's what parish life is all about!

May God be praised in every act of charity, no matter how big or how small!

Jesus tells his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you." The peace that Jesus gives is far different than the kind that comes from the absence of war, conflict, or affliction. The peace that God offers is found alongside suffering and hardship, not necessarily in their absence. St. Teresa of Avila offers us a bit of wisdom regarding peace: "May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be. May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith. May you use those gifts that you have received and pass on the love that has been given to you. May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise, and love. It is there for each and every one of us."

In order for us to experience the divine peace that Jesus offers, we have to allow God's presence to settle into our bones! It is only when this happens that we can be truly taught by the Holy Spirit to discern the true path to peace and find ourselves with untroubled hearts. The world and our lives are so unpredictable and changeable. If we look for a source of lasting and real peace only there, our search will never be satisfied. Something will always unsettle and disturb us. The Jewish disciples could really relate to what Jesus was saying about peace (shalom). They already knew that it was more a matter of achieving wholeness and wellbeing than anything else.

Wholeness and wellbeing are precisely what is uncovered when we begin to really see and know the height, depth, and breadth of God's presence and promise. The elegance of God's Divine life flows through our blood and the marrow in our bones. It is that close and deep. As we breathe in and exhale God's life, peace becomes what we know within and what is exhaled out. This remains in the midst of intense conflict, persecution, suffering, rejection, and even death.


