From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! Gilbert Keith Chesterton was an incredibly gifted speaker and writer who died in 1936. Recently some of his devotees attempted to open his cause, believing that he had lived a saintly life. And while it's no longer likely that he'll ever be canonized a saint, Chesterton left a pretty difficult act to follow. From his incredibly quick wit to his devastating logic that made him a formidable opponent in any debate, Chesterton was one of the brightest lights of his generation. For those of you who would like to read a book or two by him, why not start with his fiction, for example The Man Who Was Thursday or The Ball and the Cross. Keep in mind that Chesterton was a genius, and his British syntax might throw you off for a bit. But give it time and your efforts will be rewarded with the realization that this author had the heart and soul of a child.

Among other things, Chesterton was a convert to the Catholic Church (his wife converted too, shortly after he did). Born and raised in the Church of England, Chesterton grew up hearing about the threat of the "papists" who were only interested in undermining the British empire. Some of you reading this are also converts and you're well aware that the Catholic Church gets slandered on a regular basis. On one level, that's a good sign: in the spiritual realm, things that are attacked and criticized inordinately are usually threats to the evil one and his desire to sow seeds of dissension and division. Watch, for example, how often the Catholic Church is being vilified now that Roe vs. Wade is dead. Sure, the Catholic Church has been the greatest advocate for the sanctity of human life since the beginning of legalized abortion in America. But other denominations are pro-life too. Why don't we hear about them? Why aren't they targeted as often as the Catholic Church is? These are fair questions, and they give us something to think about.

Jesus famously gave the keys of the kingdom to Peter, and He made the claim that not even the gates of hell would be able to prevail over His Bride, the Church. Jesus never makes idle promises and for the past twenty centuries He has faithfully guided, protected, and sanctified the Church through some terribly tumultuous times. People like Chesterton, Gerard Manley Hopkins, and John Henry Newman joined the Catholic Church because they came to believe that the historical Church, the one founded by Jesus in the first century, was the Catholic Church. Listen to Chesterton's inner tug of war that finally led him to become a Catholic: "The moment men cease to pull against the Catholic Church they feel a tug toward it. The moment they cease to shout it down the begin to listen to it with pleasure. The moment they try to be fair to it they begin to be fond of it. But when that affection has passed a certain point, it begins to take on the tragic and menacing grandeur of a great love affair."

So many people fight the Catholic Church and say crazy things about her. Part of the problem is that she is faithful to her Spouse, Jesus Christ. And that makes her come across at times as terribly counter-cultural. Of course, the goal of the Church is not to be intentionally contrarian. It's just that the spirit of the world is so often at odds with the will of God that she must stand up to the world with courage and candor. Again, Chesterton recognized this and put it best when he wrote, "We do not want, as the newspapers say, a church that will move with the world. We want a church that will move the world." Such an insight is reminiscent of Jesus' words about salt that goes flat and how useless it is for flavoring insipid food. The Church would be like flat salt if she failed to remain faithful to Christ and His teaching. This means that it will rarely be popular to be a Catholic. Just the same, we do well to remember that we're not against the world, we're for it in the same way that Jesus was and is always a being "for others." As He was treated, so many of us will be treated. But He has always loved this world and He invites His followers to do the same.

Now there is a dark side of the Church, one that causes confusion, scandal, and even the death of one's faith. Another famous convert, this one the American author Flannery O'Connor, put it in perspective when she wrote, "It seems to be a fact that you have to suffer as much from the Church as for it." Some of you reading this understand this well, as you've endured real suffering at the hands of someone who was representing the Church. This can become a seemingly insurmountable challenge for our faith, and we end up walking away for good. If you or someone you know has experienced something like this, then please read on.

A friend of mine went through some terrible trials at the hands of Church officials. After serving the Church for many years in heroic and exemplary ways, one day he was treated so shabbily that it left him deeply wounded and so disillusioned that for the first time in his life he felt like his faith was dying. It was then that someone providentially recommended a book of healing titled, <u>Hurting in the Church</u> by Father Thomas Berg. It was just what my friend needed, as it diagnosed the pain, confronted the cause, and suggested the means of healing that God would provide. Among many pearls of wisdom found in the book, the following is a list of reasons that induce people to walk away from the Church:

- "You were chewed out by a priest once when you were an altar server.
- You were horribly embarrassed by a priest's harsh reaction to something you said in confession, and you've never stepped inside a Catholic church since.
- You were abruptly let go from the Catholic grade school where you taught for many years in a manner you found cold, spiteful, ungrateful, and degrading.
- You were received into the Catholic Church at Easter but are now dismayed by the lack of fellowship and indifference of your new "parish family."
- You've turned utterly cynical about the Church because of the scandal of clergy sexual abuse.
- You experience same-sex attraction and feel conflicted about the Church's teaching on homosexuality.
- ♦ You are a woman who has experienced a Church seemingly dominated by male clericalism.
- You are an elderly Catholic widow who never receives a visit from any parishioners, much less from your own parish priest.
- You were sexually abused by a member of the clergy as a child.

If you or someone you know has ever been hurt in any of the ways listed above, please know that none of this represents how God or the Church really feels about you. You are loved, now and forever. People are fallen creatures and we do terrible things to one another. But God sent His Son to forgive, heal, and reconcile the whole world to His love. Talking about our hurts with someone who cares is a huge step toward putting the past behind us. Please know that my door is always open for such things.

May God grant peace to all who have suffered at the hands of the Church in any way! And may He reprove all who have harmed His children and damaged the reputation of His Church.

July 10, 2022 - 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

We can learn a great deal from Mister Rogers. Remember him? He was the gentle soul who found his way into living rooms worldwide starting as far back as 1968. Mister Rogers' Neighborhood was a beloved program that celebrated and exalted people, especially children. He taught us that we are neighbors and that everyone has a place. Everyone matters. He had a vision, born of his relationship with God that highlighted every human life's innocence, beauty, and uniqueness. To that end, he called us to be responsible for each other, saying nothing different than what Jesus said. Viewers quickly learned that life is not just about me.

"We live in a world in which we need to share responsibility. It's easy to say, 'It's not my child, not my community, not my world, not my problem.' Then there are those who see the need and respond. I consider those people my heroes (Fred Rogers)." It is so easy to look the other way. After all, I'm not the one who needs to leave home out of fear and try to find somewhere safe. I am not the one who is hungry and without shelter or food. I am not the one who has a child being bullied or ridiculed because of the way they dress or act. I am not the one being threatened with violence or unable to find meaningful work. The distress and agony of our neighbors are our distress and agony. We cannot walk by it with an attitude of indifference, especially if we call ourselves believers. When we no longer care, we have suffocated our souls. This is a great sin.

God's law "is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out." We all have a need for love and acceptance. That's why Mister Rogers' television show was so popular. It spoke to something deeper, something sacred about humanity. God didn't give us his law in a book. He wrote it on our hearts. We know what we need to do. It's a matter of choice. Love is sacred. When we love another human being, especially without regard for ourselves, it is a holy moment. These moments are


