From the Pastor's Desk

Praised be Jesus Christ! "The world is a book, and those who do not travel read but one page." These words come from Saint Augustine who lived sixteen centuries ago. More recently, Mark Twain put a similar idea in his own inimitable style: "Don't let schooling interfere with your education." The idea of both quotes is that education is not exclusively achieved in a classroom setting. For example, those of you who have travelled have learned some impressive things by seeing and doing. This is especially true when we're outside of our comfort zone. To wit, I learned more about the United States during the years I lived in Italy than I had while actually living here. That's because I was confronted with how other people see us, and with how other people see themselves. As the ancient Native American adage puts it, "Never judge someone until you've walked a mile in his moccasins." There are many ways to learn, and travelling is one of them.

During my years in Marshfield and Spencer we were blessed to go on four different pilgrimages with my friend Juan Landa and his company, *Mater Dei Tours*. First, we went to Italy and that was a wonderful trip that introduced us to Rome, the Adriatic coast, Assisi, Siena, Orvieto, and a handful of other spectacular sights. What makes *Mater Dei* unique is its focus on the Catholic faith with daily Mass and devotional prayers mixed in with the fantastic sightseeing, unbelievable food, and remarkably comfortable accommodations. We went to the Holy Land for our second pilgrimage, then to Ireland for our third one, and finally to Lourdes and Fatima for our fourth and final trip. Every pilgrimage is a life-changing experience because it inspires people to grow closer to the Lord by a more robust practice of the faith. Moreover, traveling with other pilgrims fosters a community that points to the friendship we hope to one day share with God and with each other in Heaven. In case you're wondering, I'm a big fan of *Mater Dei* and the trips they sponsor.

Which brings us to Holy Name and our chance to go on one of these pilgrimages. We're planning on August of 2023 and the trip will be to Portugal, Spain and France. We did a similar trip in 2018, but in the reverse order. It was one of the best trips I've ever been on and my Mom said the same thing after she returned from it many years earlier. Soon we'll have specific dates (roughly August 7th-18th, 2023) and cost (c. \$4,500). It will be a first come, first served pilgrimage with Holy Name parishioners getting first dibs. These trips can only take 50 people, so now is the time to think and pray about whether you'd like to go. Our basic itinerary is that we'll fly into Lisbon and first see some of its sites (Saint Anthony of Padua was born and grew up there). Then we'll head north to Fatima, where the Blessed Mother appeared to Lucia, Francisco and Jacinta in 1917. Next, we'll head east across Spain, stopping at some amazing places (including Sevilla, Segovia, Avila, and Madrid) before crossing the Pyrenees and entering France.

Once in France, we'll spend significant time at Lourdes, which will take your breath away by its beauty and the powerful sense of Mary's presence (she appeared to Saint Bernadette there in 1858). From Lourdes we'll head north to Paris and spend our last days there before flying home to Wausau. If such a trip intrigues you, be sure to attend an informational meeting that will be held sometime later this fall. God willing, we'll look at other pilgrimages in the years to come. Because of Covid, we missed a significant amount of time. In the past, I generally would help lead these pilgrimages every two or three years. However, some have suggested going every year until we make up for the time we've missed! We'll see. Future trips will definitely include Italy, the Holy Land, and one to Poland/Lithuania or Germany/ Hungary. All on God's time.

Other ways of learning include the ancient art of reading. For some, that takes a lot of discipline because it's not always so enjoyable. However, when it's something we want to learn about, we are able to overcome our natural aversion and pick up a book and start reading it. How many times have you picked up something to read because you were preparing to travel and wanted to know more about the significant sights and some basic history of what you would be seeing? There's a whole industry based on travel books and if you're thinking of coming on the pilgrimage next year, allow me to suggest a couple of good books to read between now and then.

First, Franz Werfel's The Song of Bernadette is a classic and is a great way to open your heart to the graces you'll receive at Lourdes. Werfel's own story is an amazing tale of courage, compassion, and the Providence of God. For those who might be a little less ambitious, there is a movie by the same name that came out in 1943 and is a very accurate depiction of the powerful events that took place in that little French village all those years ago.

Speaking of movies, "The Day the Sun Danced" is one of the best descriptions of what happened in Fatima in the year of Our Lord 1917. It's a short movie for children, but its accuracy and endearing presentation make it very memorable – watch it once and you'll remember details for years. There are many movies about Fatima, including one by that very name that came out in 2020 (it's excellent). One way to get more out of the movies and the books is to make a consecration of your heart and soul to the Mother of God. Saint Louis de Montfort's "Total Consecration to Mary" is my favorite, but maybe a better place to start is with Father Michael Gaitley's 33 Days to Glory. Either way, you'll become a better friend of Jesus.

Speaking of Jesus, allow me to end by sharing a beautiful prayer titled, "Trust Me" from the Association of Marian Helpers in Stockbridge, Massachusetts:

Do you believe that I am the Son of God? And do you believe that I died for all men and women and that I rose from the dead? Then why do you continue to be distracted and anxious about your loved ones? Do they not also belong to Me? Would I refuse to work in their lives just as I work in yours?

I have not put you in charge of redeeming them. I have already done that. Nor do you have the power to change their hearts; only My Holy Spirit searches and knows the deepest hearts of men and women, and only He can heal their deepest wounds.

Your task is to love, to forgive, to pray for them and to turn them over to Me. Come closer to Me yourself, and I will do the rest. TRUST ME!"

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is built on the foundations of the Word of God and the Liturgy. All presentations are based directly on liturgy or Scripture, without any additions or simplifications. The Word of God is not "taught" as in a traditional classroom, but is rather received and explored by the child, together with the catechist. It is also an



intrinsically liturgical program, and exists with the aim of allowing the child to enter and participate in the life of the Church with a fuller understanding and joy. For this, the curriculum of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd follows the cycle of the Liturgical Year, focusing on the feasts of Christmas, Easter, and Pentecost.

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is an approach to the spirituality of children that especially focuses on the child's relationship with God. It is rooted in the Bible, the sacred liturgy of the Church, and the educational principles of Dr. Maria Montessori. Dr. Maria Montessori's approach follows St. Thomas Aquinas' understanding that "all our knowledge has its origin in the senses." Children gather in an "atrium," a room prepared especially for them, which contains simple yet beautiful materials to help them absorb and respond to the most essential proclamations of the Catholic faith.

Children ages 3-12 years are invited to attend CGS (children can begin anytime during the year). For information on the dates and times of the sessions or if you would like to bring your child and walk through the atrium to see if it would be a good fit, please contact Stacie at 715-842-4543 to set up an appointment.
