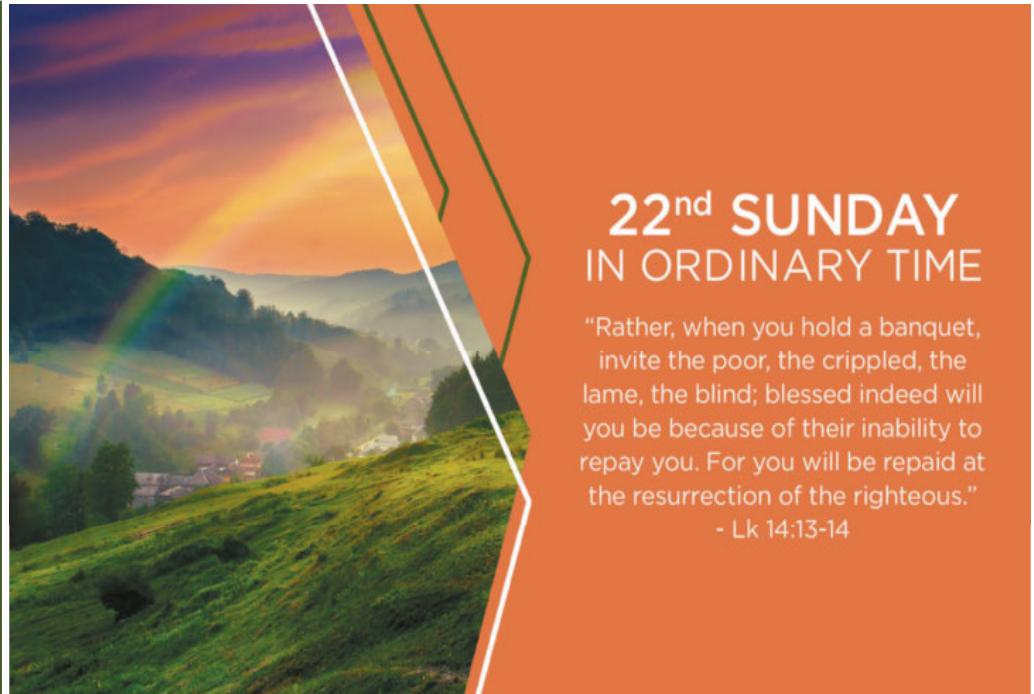

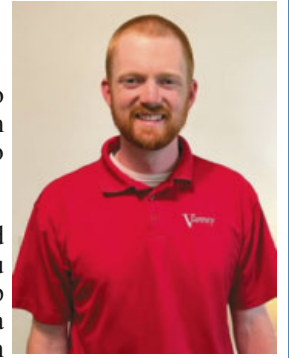

## From the Pastor's Desk



Praised be Jesus Christ! This weekend we bid a fond farewell to Jared Clements, who has been with us all too briefly this summer. Jared is one of three children, and his devoted parents gave all three of them names with the initials JNC. Some of you may have noticed the vanity plate on their car that reads *JNC3DAD*. There's no doubt about who owns that car.

Jared grew up in Holmen and did his college work at the University of Saint Thomas. A self-described extrovert, Jared is an easy guy to get to know and an impossible guy to forget. I'm only sorry that more of you didn't have a chance to spend quality time with him, as he was summoned all over the diocese drumming up interest in the priesthood at places like Adventure Camp and at vocation events. Any time we've been at a social event of any kind, I've been impressed with how naturally and easily Jared meets people and puts them at ease. Sometimes while leaving it seemed that he'd met more people than I had (and I'm very competitive, so I started keeping track). I have no doubt that one of Jared's many gifts will be in building community among people by his joy, deep faith, and authentic friendliness.

As you know, Jared is returning to Rome for his fourth and final year. It will be an incredibly eventful year for him because he'll be ordained as a transitional deacon on September 29<sup>th</sup> at Saint Peter's Basilica by Bishop Austin Vetter from Helena, Montana. At that time Jared will begin his life as a cleric, making the vows of chastity and obedience. It's a singular event in that he'll be ordained at the Altar of the Chair of Saint Peter. Like the Galilean fisherman who once sat on that chair, Jared and his classmates will be reminded to courageously put out into the deep, always trusting that the Lord will raise up followers who desire to hear the Gospel preached, and more importantly, to witness it lived. Please keep Jared and his classmates (including Isaac Pecha, who was with us last year) in your prayers, especially on September 29<sup>th</sup>. The Church rejoices because she is always being renewed with these radical vocations of service.

Speaking of ordinations, Jared and Isaac (and two others) will be ordained as priests in La Crosse at our Cathedral next June 24<sup>th</sup>. If you've never been to an ordination, you owe it to yourself to go someday (or at least watch one online now that so many things are live-streamed). My own ordination stills resonates in my heart and mind each year as I celebrate my anniversary. As you might recall, I asked the Bishop to let me stay at least until I celebrate my 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary and so far, so good. That means on June 26<sup>th</sup> of 2024 we'll have the occasion to thank God for being so patient with me and showing me His faithful love. But more on that some other time.

Now, by way of leaving us with a swan song of sorts, the following is written by Jared and will show how much God is working in his heart. Without further ado, here's Jared!

*Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough.*

*The problem of Evil is something that people have been pondering for many, many years. The question of suffering is one of the most difficult to grasp. One rendition of this question is how can an all good, all loving, and all-powerful God allow so much evil in this world? Either God is not all good, hence, why the world is so corrupt, or God is not all powerful (He wants the world to be all good, but He cannot actually make that happen). There is no doubt that evil and suffering exist; but what is astonishing is God's response to it. In the beginning, when God created man in His image and likeness, He created man with the gift of freedom – the freedom to choose good and evil and act accordingly to that choice. Man chose evil and the cataclysmic eruption from that choice is still felt today. In the fulness of time, God sent His only son to save us from our sins. Most shockingly, the way in which He saves us is through the most gruesome and painful way imaginable: by the Cross. God sent His only son to die by the cross to both allow us to enter and to show us the way to heaven. As Jesus said: I am the way, the truth, and the life (John 14:6). But even more astonishing is that Jesus tells us: strive to enter [heaven] through the narrow gate (Luke 13:24). What is the narrow gate? The narrow gate is the way of suffering. Those who pick up their cross and follow Christ are the ones which will enter the kingdom of God. Jesus, through His death and resurrection, mystifies suffering as the means by which we enter into heaven. Jesus is the perfect model as for how we enter heaven – and He suffered a lot. Thus, suffering well is a big part of our journey to eternal life. As the letter to the Hebrews tells us: at the time, all discipline seems a cause not for joy but for pain, yet later it brings the peaceful fruit of righteousness to those who are trained by it (Hebrews 12:11). It is by suffering that we learn patience. It is by suffering that we learn perseverance. It is by suffering that we learn how to be joyful in suffering. Jesus redeemed suffering. So too we must take our suffering and unite it to the Cross of Christ. Jesus turns suffering on its head: it goes from being the ultimate curse to being the gateway to eternal life. Satan hates those who suffer (that's why in society there is such a push for euthanasia) because their prayer united to Christ's suffering is super efficacious for tearing down Satan's kingdom. Our Freedom is perfected in suffering. By us choosing to be joyful in our suffering, our freedom is strengthened because we defy Satan's bidding. Now, this does not mean that we should actively seek out suffering in our lives – we have enough suffering as it is – but we should strive to unite the suffering which we are in with Christ on the Cross.*

*So, back to the problem of evil. Evil is allowed by God through His passive will (not His active will) such that He honors our freedom to choose Him who is the ultimate good. He also allows us to choose against Him so that when we do choose Him, it carries the true weight of love. When we choose against Him, suffering naturally follows. God does not want this, but to help us to come back to Him, He, who is all good, decided to take on all of Man's suffering so to redeem both us and suffering itself so that we can one day be with Him in paradise. I pray that we all learn to suffer well those sufferings that have been placed upon us so that we may be with Him in paradise. May God Bless you all!*

**August 28, 2022 - 22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time**

People who are concerned with their own advancement and agenda have little room for anyone else. With an almost addictive pursuit of esteem and acknowledgment from others, they become little more than entitled embodiments of the vice of pride. Public humiliation or embarrassment can hit them hard. While avoiding humiliation and embarrassment may be advantageous to obtaining worldly success, they are much less desirable motivations for entering the Kingdom of God. Avoiding embarrassment is a self-serving motivation. Pride and all of its manifestations have no place on God's agenda, neither do worldly success and fulfillment. In fact, we have been clearly told that if we love our lives, we will lose them. Therefore, if you really want to find your true station in life, learn to give yourself away.

While this may sound foolish to secular ears, it actually makes perfect sense. God, who is love, makes each of us in His image. Love, and therefore God, is in our DNA. That being the case, love is never love if it is kept to oneself or hoarded. Love needs to be shared and given away. Therefore, it is the only proper motivation for entering the Kingdom of God. The door to happiness is only opened when we realize that all we are and all we have is due only to God's grace. Without God we are nothing.

Love is the remedy for pride and protects us from ourselves. God asks us to be humble. Only when we are free from the traps of pride and arrogance that we can begin to follow the path to true humility. Only one who is humble can rightly love and be of service to God. "God makes use only of the humble as his instruments (Jean-Pierre de Caussade)." The humble one does not need others to give them worth and value. Their self-esteem comes from the much more secure foundation of God. Only those who are entirely free can give themselves freely to others. Love must always be our motivation for doing all things. Be content that God has invited you to the banquet of life. Concern yourself with accepting the invitation, and don't worry about where you will sit.

**Getting to know Jesus Christ in a deeper way:**

Reading the Catechism in 10 months We grow in our love for someone as we get to know them better. Would you like to grow in your love for Jesus Christ through coming to know Him better? Reading the Catechism, a few pages each day, will help you to deepen your understanding of His incredible love for you. A modest schedule of 15 paragraphs per night (roughly 3 pages) has been arranged that will take about 10-15 minutes of reflective reading, 5 nights a week over 38 weeks. 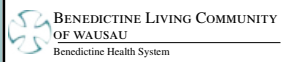
