From the Pastor's Desk

The "Mission World" is one of my favorite places to be. I am there when I sit before the Blessed Sacrament during adoration and many memories flood like a flowing river of grace into my prayer.

I remember the time I peddled my bike down the dry dusty main road from the parish where I was living in Uganda to the next mission outstation about 4 miles away. It was Christmas morning and I was heading off to lead my first Communion Service in the absence of the priest. I was nervous about the language but comfortable with the people. I enjoyed every moment. Then they loaded me up with what was collected during the offertory. There was a little cash in a black plastic bag which I put in my pants pocket. The two fresh eggs



they put in my shirt pocket. The huge stalk of bananas someone had cut whole from the plant they hung from the rack over the back tire. It weighed about 30 pounds and was balanced by a large bag of fruit (mangoes, papaya, avocado, pineapple and a small jackfruit) on the other side. Finally, they topped off the back end with a chicken whose wings and feet were wrapped in dried banana leaves so it would not fly or run away. I wish they had tied its beak, because it was not prevented from squawking for 4 dusty miles as I swerved between deep potholes and washed out shoulders.

I remember Dwayne Bowen, God rest his soul. I shared with him some years of his long-term prison ministry at the Jackson County Correctional Institution. He played the organ at every Sunday Mass while I joined him once a month for 16 of his 30+ years there. He once told me that some people join the mission with their lives and travel time. Others join the mission in prayer and financial support. Then he would hand me a card and generous donation to take with me for the people he would never meet, but with whom he was united in Christ. From his place in God's mercy, I feel his advocacy streaming from God's glory.

I remember arriving early for our national Pontifical Mission Societies meeting scheduled one year in Puerto Rico. It's timed with an international gathering of Spanish speaking nations on the subject of Catholic Evangelization. That year, we went early to visit a parish which had begun a sister relationship with St. James the Greater in Eau Claire. After a devastating tropical storm followed by Hurricane Maria, people from our diocese wanted to help. The exchange continues, and it was such a great joy to be able to tap into the work, the faith and personal relationships. The sometimes troublesome language barriers never seem to stifle the love of Christ. Instead, all bridges are formed, gaps are filled, and the highway to the Savior is made straight.

Today, in Lurín, Peru, we are making the pilgrimage up the hill of Casa Hogar to the tomb of Servant of God, Fr. Joe Walijewski. The crazy and wonderful group I am with will be praying a Rosary for all the intentions we have carried with us here. Some of the youth will be in their afternoon and evening classes, but many of the children will join us for the walk and rosary. They are such bundles of energy and unconditional love. Although their lives are difficult, and they are likely witness to human vice beyond what any child should have to suffer, their smiles are contagious and their hearts are generous. They carry us as we seek the inspiration of Padre José, as well as any miracles that show us he is at the right hand of our Heavenly Father. Know that I carry you, Holy Name of Jesus Parish, Newman Catholic Schools and Newman Classical Schools, in my prayer on this beautiful hillside overlooking the orphanage and ocean. Stella Maris, Our Lady, Star of the Sea, pray for us.

May you be strengthened in whatever mission God has given you to accomplish on His behalf during your own pilgrimage through life.

"Despite the rule that only one plenary indulgence can be obtained per day (cf. Enchiridion Indulgentiarum, IV ed., norm. 18, § 1), the faithful who have carried out an act of charity on behalf of the souls in Purgatory, if they receive Holy Communion a second time that day, can obtain the plenary indulgence twice on the same day, applicable only to the deceased" (Decree on the Granting of Indulgence during the Ordinary Jubilee Year 2025, III).

Before I was a priest, I was a lazy worker for a retail Apple store. Hearing a rumor that my boss was going to fire me, I secretly sold iPhones for half-price, gave away dozens of free iPads, and donated several brand-new laptops to managers in other stores in the mall. After a week, my boss called me into his office. He knew what I was up to. He said I had cost the store thousands of dollars. "Really great work, John," he said. "I am going to recommend you to be my assistant manager and double your pay." I was amazed.

And so are you. Which is understandable because it never happened. How could it? My tall tale is a retelling of Jesus' brow-furrowing parable we hear this week. A lazy, dishonest steward defrauds his boss and then the "master commended the dishonest servant for acting prudently" (Luke 16:8). What is the Lord saying to us?

Most of us treat our spiritual lives like a lazy teenager at an Apple store. We really don't care. We go through the motions. Then, if we are lucky, something happens that shakes us to spiritual action; to employ whatever time, money, and resources we have to build around us a strong network of love. Every saint did that. Our Lord is so good he wants us to use his stuff to forgive debts and to bless others. He wants us to ensure our future. So do it!

Bishop Gerard Battersby will celebrate a Mass of Hope and Healing on Tuesday, September 23, at 6:30on at the Cathedral of St. Joseph the Workman 530 Main St, La Crosse. This Mass will be offered for anyone grieving the loss of children through miscarriage, ectopic pregnancy, abortion, stillbirth, accident or infant death. A book of remembrance will be available before and after Mass for those who would like to inscribe the name(s) of their child(ren). Votive candles will be given to families before Mass in remembrance of each child. Candles will be lit and carried forward by family members, just before the entrance procession, and placed before the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. After Mass, refreshments will be served along with a display of resources and books in the Gathering Space. Volunteers with name tags will be present to offer assistance, support, and comfort.


