

From the Desk of Father Don



WHAT GIFTS DO YOU BRING?

We hear the familiar story of the Magi visiting the birth of Jesus with their gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Each of those gifts is symbolic of a portion of Jesus's life that is ahead of him, but not yet come about. This Feast of the Epiphany is our attempt to move from celebrating the birth of Jesus to actually contemplating the implications of the birth of the Messiah in human flesh.

If you still have your manger set up, which I hope you do, and you have included the Magi in the scene, I'd ask you to try to place yourself in their place. Instead of the gifts that they brought with them, what would be the gifts that you possess that you could offer to Jesus on this feast as a way of carrying his life and its power to those you'll meet. The gifts that the Magi brought had to do with Jesus being of royal lineage, about his body being anointed at his death and a recognition of him being both human and divine. What particular aspects of Jesus will your gift bring to the world?

Some of you have been through great suffering. If you have embraced that suffering and allowed it to change you, out of that suffering will come the gift of compassion. Instead of shouting at the world out of your pain, you have a deep understanding for others who are in pain and you can actually stand with them as a sign of hope even as they are hopeless.

Some of you have endured poverty and the lack of essentials in life. Because of the goodness and generosity of others, you are here today. You understand what it means to do without and what it feels like to get your head above water again. You can stand with those who are fighting for their lives and be a source of hope for them even when they are hopeless.

Some of you have experienced rejection, betrayal or being belittled. You know deep in your mind and heart how harmful that is and what damage did to you. In your fighting for your life, you've come to understand that you are much stronger than you ever imagined and that you are worth your life. You can stand as a witness to those who are still fighting that struggle and simply need someone to stand with them in the darkness.

Some of you have, from time to time, turned your back on God because God has disappointed you or because of some great loss that simply didn't make sense. You know the anger and hurt that was within you. I know the sense of being adrift and not knowing which way to turn. You know that time when you might've even cursed God or shouted at God. You can stand with those who are in that place right now and you can be the lighthouse that calls them out of their current storm and back to Jesus.

This and many other examples are ways that the Epiphany happens today. It's not just about statues in a crib set. It's about the word made flesh and dwelt among us. It is about the presence of Jesus becoming so real that another person might be able to experience Jesus through us. We can be the light in the midst of darkness, the strength in the brokenness and the hope in the midst of despair. Would you like to use the gifts that you bear simply for yourself and your family or would you like to make your gifts a place where people experience Jesus and come to him?

Gospel of Luke, the Second Half of this Gospel


