

# From the Desk of Father Don



#### IT'S TRANSITION TIME!!

We celebrate the feast of the Baptism of Jesus as the end of our Christmas Season. You might ask why it isn't the Feast of the Holy Family or the Feast of Epiphany and that would be a great question to answer so that we know how to move forward in transition from the Christmas Season to Ordinary Time.

I would encourage you to take some time this week to read the scriptures that are presented to us for this feast. The reading from the Prophet Isaiah is one of the readings that we heard through our Advent Season and the Gospel of Luke tells us the narrative of the Baptism of Jesus. I would especially draw your attention to the scripture reading from the Book of Titus, chapter 2:11-14 and chapter 3:4-7. The reading from Titus gives us our marching orders that come out of the Baptism of Jesus. What should we do because we celebrate this feast?

We are supposed to reject godless ways and worldly desires. Once we are rid of those things, we are instructed to live temperately, justly and devoutly. As we do that personal cleansing of unnecessary things and live with those noted virtues, there remains room for hope and anticipation. Our hope and anticipation comes from the gift of Jesus. We are assured that he came to us not because we have done some things so well, but because of his great mercy for us. We are reminded that we are justified by his grace.

This proclamation on the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus should carry incredible weight for those of us who are baptized. We have been baptized into this inheritance. This should have the power to free us from anxiety and fear about living up to God's expectations and instead responding to God's love and mercy. Responding out of love and mercy will bear much different fruit than responding out of fear and anxiety.

Have you really ever taken into your heart and mind God's proclamation to you that you are His beloved son or daughter? Have you ever really believed and acted on the truth that you are chosen by God to be an emissary of his in the world today? Have you ever really experienced the freedom of acting out of love rather than fear? Will this simply be the end of the Christmas season or a continuation of closeness to God and loving in God's name in the world?

You may be putting away the decorations or maybe you did that the day after Christmas, but please don't put away what the birth of Christ promises to us. Let it live and breathe in you and give it access to your mind and heart. Be willing to be converted and changed by the birth of Christ and the love that has been shown to each of us through him. Please take that gift and unwrap it every day of your life.

# The Parish Journeys with the RCIA

#### The Sacraments: An Introduction

During the next several weeks, the RCIA will focus on the seven sacraments of the Church. But before discussing each individual sacrament, this Sunday's topic will explain what a sacrament is... "A sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace." This basic definition contains three distinct ideas.

Because we're physical beings, God conveys His love and grace into our spiritual souls through material symbols which we can perceive through our senses. The **outward signs** of the sacraments can include oil, water, and such, along with the words or gestures of the specific sacrament.

Between the time Jesus began His public ministry and when He ascended into heaven, He instituted the seven sacraments. The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist. While most Catholics receive these in separate rites over several years, our catechumens this year, Chrystal and Matt, will receive all three in one combined rite at the Easter Vigil. Our candidates, Justin, AJ, Gary, and Adam have already been baptized so they will be Confirmed and receive their first Eucharist at the Vigil. The Sacraments of Healing are Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick. The Sacraments of Service are Marriage and Holy Orders.

The third element in the definition of a sacrament is **to give grace** which is the gift of God's love and presence into which we grow. God's grace is totally free and ever present. What we do with that gift is ours to choose and our eternal salvation is affected by our choice.

While the sacraments benefit us as individuals, they also bring life to the entire Church. As members of Christ's body, when we are strengthened as individuals, the family of God is strengthened as a whole. Living a sacramental life is a great gift and calling of every Catholic. Through frequent reception of the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation, we are responding to Jesus' signs of love keeping our connection to God and to others alive and strong. What a gift!



#### The Baptism of Our Lord

"John answered them all, I baptize you with water; but he who is mightier than I is coming...he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit..." (LUKE 3:16)

The Catholic Catechism states that "Jesus' immersion in the water is a sign for all human beings of the need to die to themselves to do God's will." In other words, as baptized Catholics there is only one gift that we need to give to Jesus – the gift of ourselves. Surrender yourself to God, place your trust in Him and allow the Holy Spirit to work through you for the greater glory of God.




We use a small booklet and meet every two weeks for six sessions.


