



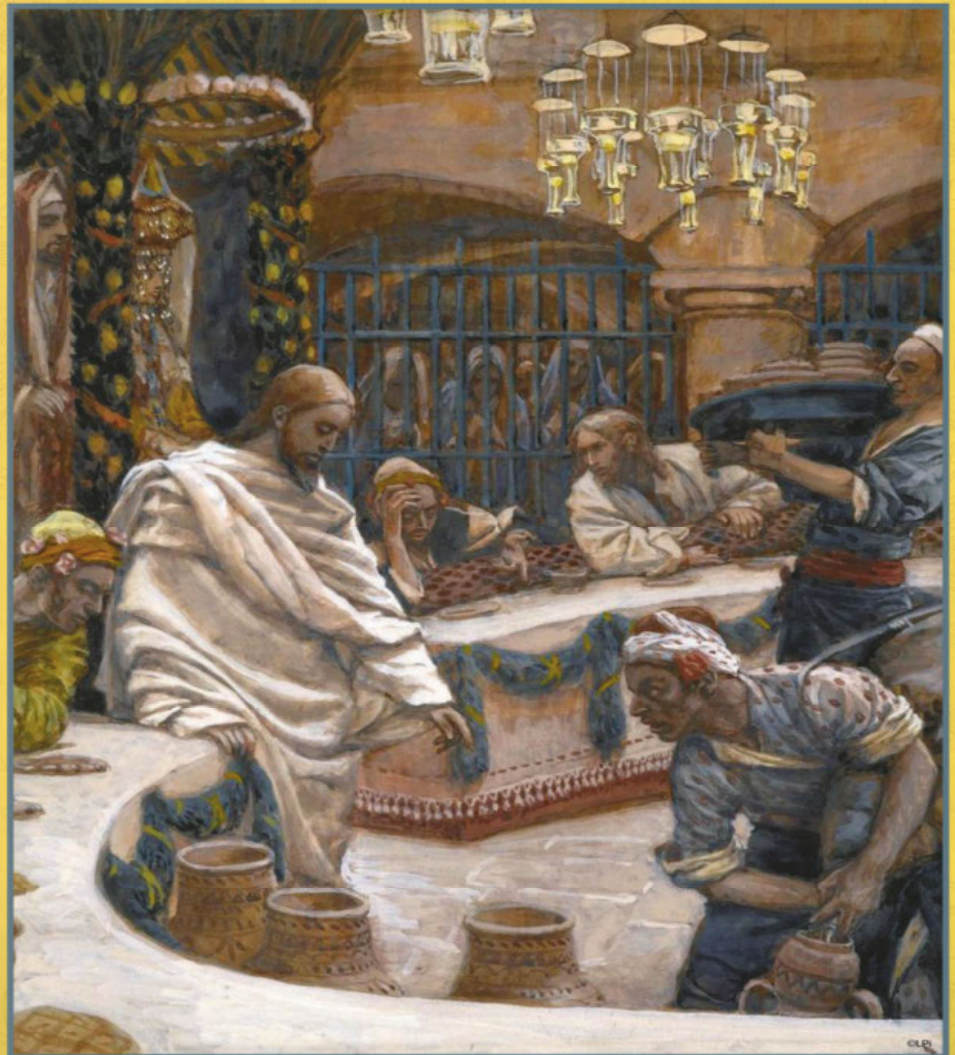

From the Desk of Father Don



A COMMUNITY OF MANY GIFTS

“There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit. There are different forms of service but the same Lord. There are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone.” I begin my column this weekend with this quote from Saint Paul’s First Letter to the Corinthians chapter 12 so that you might know the intent of my words. As I reflect on the scripture, I know that I am experiencing great pride at being part of this community that we call All Saints Church. Our community is a place where this scripture comes alive. We are not perfect, but we are God’s community.

If you take a look around our community, you will see that this scripture is certainly true. We have many different gifts and God has created them all in every single one of us. The Parish Journeys with the RCIA

The Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation

Today's RCIA session is focused on the *Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation* and the effects and responsibilities they have from receiving them. For Christians, community has always been an essential part of life with Christ, the Church. The outward sign of Baptism is the pouring of water three times on the person's head or the immersion of the person in water three times accompanied by the words: "I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." The waters of baptism remind us that Christ has washed us clean of original sin and all our sins and has reconciled us with God. The anointing with chrism signifies that God has put His seal upon us and we are united to the spiritual body of Christ. The white garment symbolizes purity and we are a new creation being clothed in Christ. The lit baptismal candle is a reminder that Christ is the light of the world and that we, as a baptized Christian, must live as a child of light.

The word *confirmation* means "strengthening." The Catechism of the Catholic Church states that the Sacrament of Confirmation "both confirms baptism and strengthens baptismal grace." (CCC 1289) One of the outward or physical signs of this sacrament is the bishop (or priest) laying his hands on the head of the candidate and praying for the gift of the Holy Spirit while the sponsor, who is representing the Christian community, places a hand on the candidate's shoulder. Another sign is the anointing in the form of a cross with sacred chrism on the forehead while praying, "[Name] be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit." Just as the apostles received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost which enabled them to go out to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ, we who have been baptized and confirmed are obliged, strengthened with the gifts of the Holy Spirit, to be witnesses to Christ in our daily lives. Are we using and sharing those gifts not only to transform our own lives but to touch the lives of others? Our parish community offers many opportunities through its many ministries to share our gifts with others.

Take time to discern your charisms (gifts from the Holy Spirit). Experience the supernatural Peace and Joy God desires for each of us.

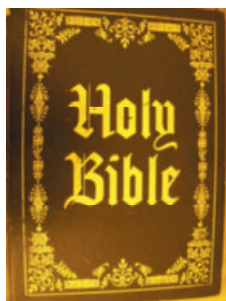

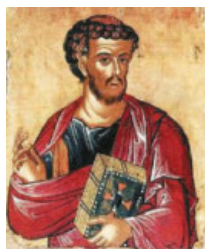
