

# From the Desk of Father Don



# **CAN YOU IMAGINE?**

Imagine if you could that you, like Jesus, as we hear the gospel, are sitting in a place of worship where the Scriptures are being proclaimed. Not too hard to imagine since most of us do this on a regular basis. Jesus is given a scroll to read and he does that. Many of you, even though the lector is proclaiming the Scriptures, read the scriptures from the Breaking Bread book or from your apps on your phone. Some of you have even taken the time to read the Scriptures ahead of time and prepared for what you were about to hear. Imagine that God is expecting you to say either aloud or inwardly that the scripture that is being proclaimed is going to be fulfilled in your life.

Our reading from Saint Paul this weekend should make that easy to imagine. Saint Paul uses the image of a body to leave room for all of us to have some way of embodying the scriptures that we hear. We know that Jesus is the head of the body, but do we realize that each of us is a part of that body that keeps it functioning and allows the Word to become flesh through us? As you participate in any of the activities of our parish, including our worship, you can see that many people fulfill various functions so that the community can be the presence of Christ here at All Saints. Some of you have already begun to imagine what it means for you to use your life to bring about the presence of Christ in our world today.

Statistical studies show us that about 24% of all registered Catholics in a parish attend mass regularly. But only 7% do anything other than attend Mass. What would it take for those of us who come to Mass regularly to make that jump from simply coming to worship to actually using the gifts that God has given to us in a way over and above our participation in worship? As your pastor, I would certainly like to help you make that shift in any way that I can. What skills, what training, what permission or what encouragement do you need from me or from others to exercise your rightful place in the Body of Christ? Please let me know and I will do my best to be an instrument of encouragement for you to make that step.

No matter what our circumstance in life is, we are capable of adding our gifts to the community's gifts so that Christ becomes more present in our time. Whether your life is at the best points ever been or the lowest, think about how you might exercise your gift for the sake of others. Whether you are the richest you've ever been or the poorest, how might you be able to add your gift to the gifts of others? Whether you are the busiest you've ever been or you might be looking for something to do to pass your time, how can you bring forth your blessings for others? If you are unable to come out of your home or very mobile in your abilities, how can you gift others through your presence?

Please understand that there are no excuses for burying our gifts out of fear or frustration, stubbornness or hatred, disagreement or hurt. We all have some of that or all of that in our lives and it can't be an excuse for failing to live out our call to be the Word made flesh and members of the Body of Christ. As the priest, Ezra, says in the Book of Nehemiah, now is not a time to weep but a time for rejoicing for God is our strength.



# The Sacrament of Eucharist

The Sacraments of Initiation are Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist which will be celebrated at the Easter Vigil. Last Sunday, our session delved into the Sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation with this week's session being devoted to the third Sacrament, the Eucharist. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and oriented toward it." (CCC 1324)

The outward or physical signs for the Eucharist are bread and wine. During Mass when the priest says the blessing, "This is My Body" . . . "This is the chalice of My Blood" as Christ instructed at the Last Supper, we as Catholics believe that the substances of bread and wine truly become the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of our Lord Jesus Christ. Transubstantiation is the term the Church uses to describe this change.

Today's catechist will explain and answer questions regarding the Eucharist being celebrated as a meal and the Eucharist as an offering of ourselves to God united with Jesus' sacrificial death on the cross. One of the most important aspects when discussing the Eucharist is that by consuming the Body and Blood of Christ, we are nourished by Jesus, the Living Bread. This nourishment strengthens and increases our personal union with Christ begun at Baptism. Receiving the Eucharist reinforces the unity of the Church as the Mystical Body of Christ. The Living Bread increases the grace and virtues within our souls which strengthen us to go out into the world to live the Eucharist imitating Christ and being the bread for others.
