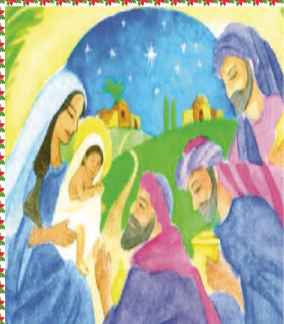

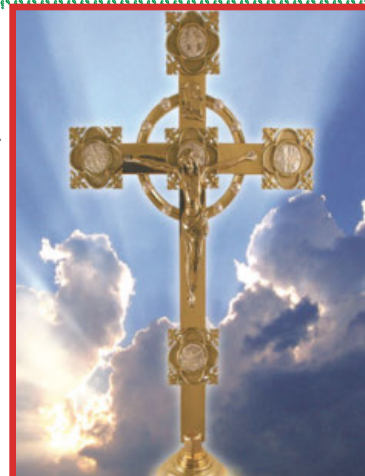

A Note From The Pastor...



I hope that you all had a Merry Christmas. On Saturday, we celebrated the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God. It wasn't a Holy Day of Obligation this year because it fell on a Saturday.

On Saturday, we celebrated Mary's role in the Mystery of Christ's Birth. Mary's role in salvation history has always been connected with the Christmas Mystery. The Church declared at the Council of Ephesus in



431 A.D. that Mary may rightly be called "*The Mother of God.*" On this day we also pray, through Mary's intercession, for peace in the world.

Fr. Charles is back! He's visiting for a "*limited time only*" as he will return to Uganda around January 10th. We are blessed to once again have him with us. Please give him a warm welcome – I am sure he would love to hear from you.

This Sunday we celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany. The word '*epiphany*' comes from the Greek *epiphaneia*, meaning manifestation or appearance. So we are celebrating God in Jesus Christ being manifested to the world represented by the Magi. But really, in the history of Christianity, particularly in the East, the Epiphany celebrated two additional events as mentioned in *The Catechism of the Catholic Church*:

The Epiphany is the manifestation of Jesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God, and Savior of the world. The great Feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of Jesus by the wisemen (Magi) from the East, together with His baptism in the Jordan, and the wedding feast at Cana in Galilee. In the Magi, representatives of the neighboring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The Magi's coming to Jerusalem in order to pay homage to the King of the Jews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the One who will be King of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus, and worship Him as Son of God, and Savior of the world only by turning towards the Jews and receiving from them the messianic promise as contained in the Old Testament. The Epiphany shows that "the full number of the nations" now takes its "place in the family of the patriarchs", and acquires Israelitica dignitas (is made "worthy of the heritage of Israel").

As we celebrate the Epiphany and begin a New Year, may we resolve to be intentional about our faith with a daily program which includes prayer, Mass each Sunday, and spiritual reading, so that we may draw ever closer to the King of kings this year.

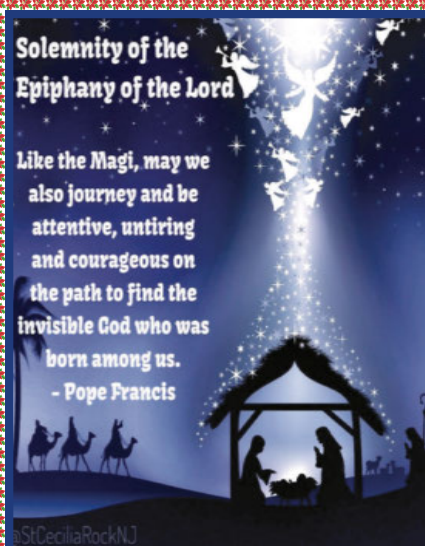
New Year's Blessing

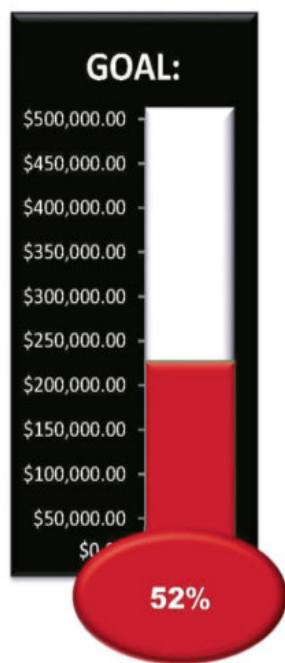

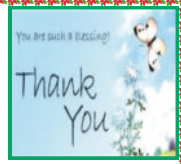
Parish Secretary Needed

Epiphany Blessing Of Chalk For Your Home

Each year around the Feast of the Epiphany, many parishes throughout the world

participate in an annual Blessing of Chalk. It is an ancient tradition that not only places God at the entrance of your home, it places your entire family under His protection. It is a powerful blessing that lasts the whole year.

What does the inscription '20 + C + M + B + 22' mean?

The letters have two meanings. First, they represent the initials of the Magi – Caspar, Melchior, and Balthasar – who came to visit Jesus in His first home. They also abbreviate the Latin phrase, *Christus mansionem benedicat*: "May Christ bless the house."

The "+" signs represent the cross, and the "20" at the beginning, and the "22" at the end mark the current year. The chalking of the doors of a home encourages Christians to dedicate their life at home to God and to others. Seeing the symbols over our doors can help to remind us, while passing in and out on our daily routines, that our homes, and all those who dwell there belong to Christ. It also serves as a reminder of the welcoming the Magi gave to Jesus. We should strive to be as welcoming to all who come to our homes to visit us!

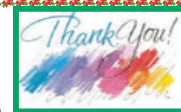
Tax Credit 2-For-1 Match

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

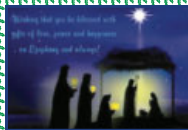

**Gospel Meditation – Encourage Deeper
Understanding Of Scripture – January 2, 2022 –
The Epiphany Of The Lord**

In his Apostolic Exhortation, The Joy of the Gospel, Pope Francis references a thought from Pope Benedict XVI: *“Being a Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.”* Today we celebrate an encounter with the Person of Jesus Christ! This simple, but holy event, in time dramatically changes human life, pointing it toward a new horizon, and giving it a decisive direction. This is a message and truth that is not meant to be shared with only a select few who qualify, but with the entire world. Pope Francis continues saying, *“Thanks solely to this encounter or renewed encounter with God's love, which blossoms into an enriching friendship, we are liberated from our narrowness and self-absorption. We become fully human when we become more than human, when we let God bring us beyond ourselves in order to attain the fullest truth of our being.”*

Look around at people. *Where is life heading for them? What gives them direction?* Even we who are people of faith can get distracted and lose our focus. God, in all of His fullness, is revealed in Jesus Christ, and we can encounter Him! God is tangible, real, vulnerable, poor, and full of wonders, surprises, and opportunities. For those who are struggling and lost, today is a day of great joy. All they have to do is reach out and touch the truth of Christ. This presence is revealed in the poor, exploited, and vulnerable ones who cry out for compassion and love. But it is also found in the faithful ones who see in the Epiphany of God a liberation from structures and systems that hurt us, a narrowness of mind and heart that constricts us, and an absorption in our self-agenda that prevents us from seeing anything other than ourselves as important.

We have been given the charge of preaching this Good News. If only we could find a way to be more effective, it might stand a chance of doing what God intended it to do. There is always tomorrow, and our memory of that bright new light that shone so brilliantly that Bethlehem night pointing us to truth, and reminding us that we are loved. ©LPi
