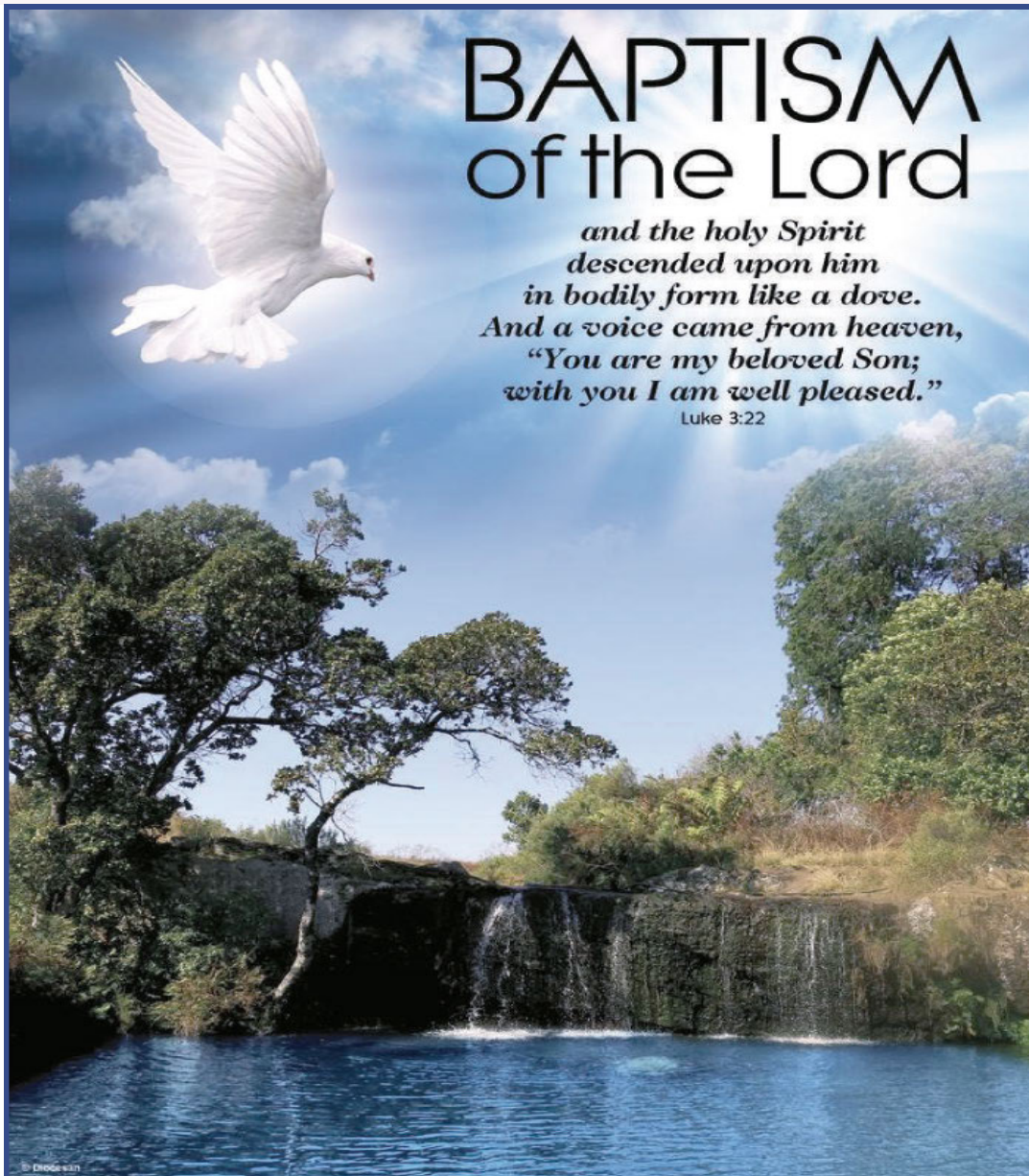

GOSPEL MEDITATION – ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE – JANUARY 9, 2022 – THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

“We are called to live our baptism every day, as new creatures, clothed in Christ.” –Pope Francis

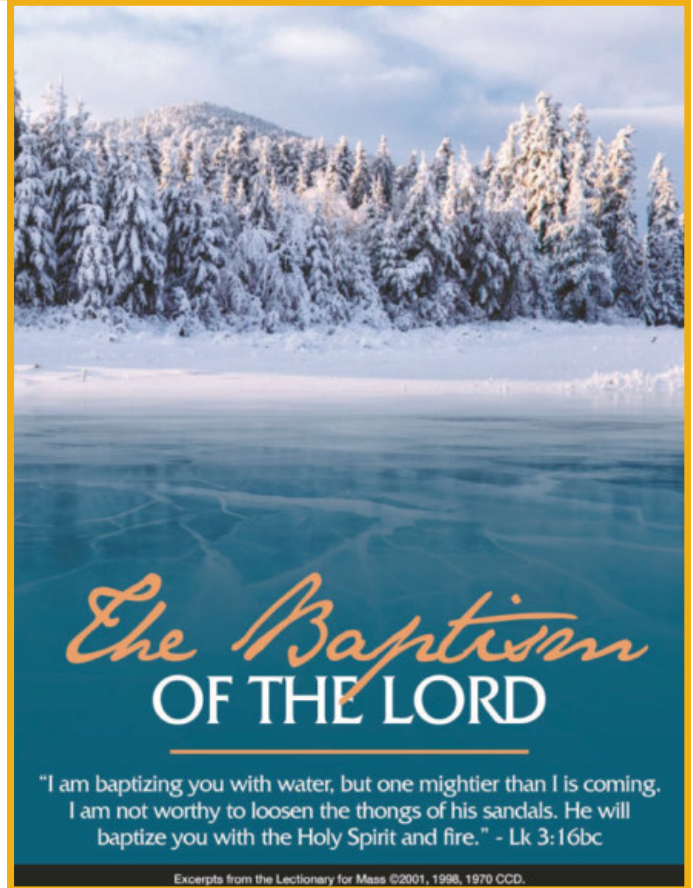
What reference point do you use when making decisions? Many times, impulse takes control, and decisions are made based solely on emotion and desire. We all know that these types of decisions can often get us into trouble. When a person has a confident sense of who they are, and a real understanding of what is important and of value, the likelihood of kneejerk impulsive choices diminishes. Baptism gives us what we need to make well informed and purposeful decisions. By this simple gesture, God claims us as His own, and provides us with the identity and purpose we need to properly live life.

It is tremendously reassuring, when we truly embrace this revelation, and realize that we no longer have to wonder about the purpose of our lives, or struggle to find our way. The answer of who we are in God has been given to us. We no longer have to fumble around, trip over ourselves, or walk

aimlessly about. Issues surrounding the sacredness of life, the meaning of death, the protection of those most vulnerable, care for the weak and the poor, offering hospitality to those in search of a home, the purpose and proper place of work, how to create a just social order, caring for creation, and understanding our roles as heralds and stewards, are just a few of the wonderful gifts baptism brings. When we make decisions based on things such as these core Gospel truths, we really act as Christ Himself, revealing to others the new creations that we are. This is how we live our baptism.

It is difficult to walk against the tide. Yet, that is precisely what baptism calls us to do. Although we are sinners, in need of mercy, and far from perfection, we are called to order our life and make decisions based upon the wisdom and guidance of Almighty God. He alone is the One who can claim us as His sons and daughters. Standing up for our principles will not make us popular. *But who ever said Christianity is a popularity contest?* Baptism calls us to stand up for that which goes against the grain of secularism. Standing in line with other sinners, we have our anchor to steady us in the tempests of life, and God is very pleased. Forge ahead. There is nothing to fear.

All Seniors are welcome, and we hope to see you there.



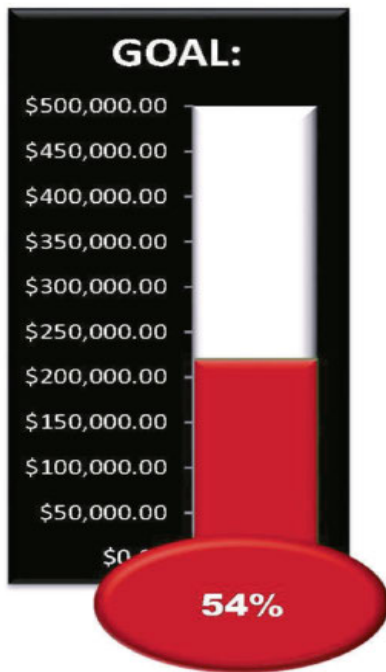

Quinceanera Requirements

We have many requests for Quinceaneras, and want to ensure everyone is aware of the requirements for scheduling this celebration. We offer a Quinceanera Service performed by a Deacon.

We require that your family be registered participating parishioners at Our Lady of Humility Parish for a minimum of one year prior to requesting a date for the Quinceanera celebration. Please note, registration for Our Lady of Humility School or Religious Education Classes, does not register you as a parishioner. The Parish has a separate form available online, at the entries of the Church, or in the Parish Office. A participating parishioner receives Parish donation envelopes, and regularly attends Mass here at Our Lady of Humility Parish.

Registered parishioners should contact the Rectory a minimum of 9 months in advance to schedule the Quinceanera, as Preparation Classes must be scheduled prior to the celebration.

We cannot guarantee specific dates will be available, so it is best to register early, prior to reserving any reception facilities.

Tax Credit 2-For-1 Match

Many OLH Families need assistance with their tuition, and are in need of your help! Any donation to Empower Illinois earns you a 75% Tax Credit on your Illinois Taxes, and for a limited time earns OLH double your donation. Example: A donation of \$500 earns you a Tax Credit of \$375 off your Illinois Taxes, and OLH receives \$1,000 for Scholarships for families in need. The 2-For-1 Match is available now until February (or when funds are used up).

If the donation was made by December 31st of 2021, the Tax Credit can be taken on your 2021 Taxes.

Everyday Stewardship – Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments – I Hope I Am Like Him

“Who is this Christ? Is He like you?”

Perhaps you have heard this story, often attributed to the life of St. Teresa of Calcutta. A sick man asked her this question, as he marveled at her tireless service to himself and others in the name of someone named Jesus Christ.

“He is nothing like me,” the Saint is said to have answered. *“But I hope I am like Him.”*

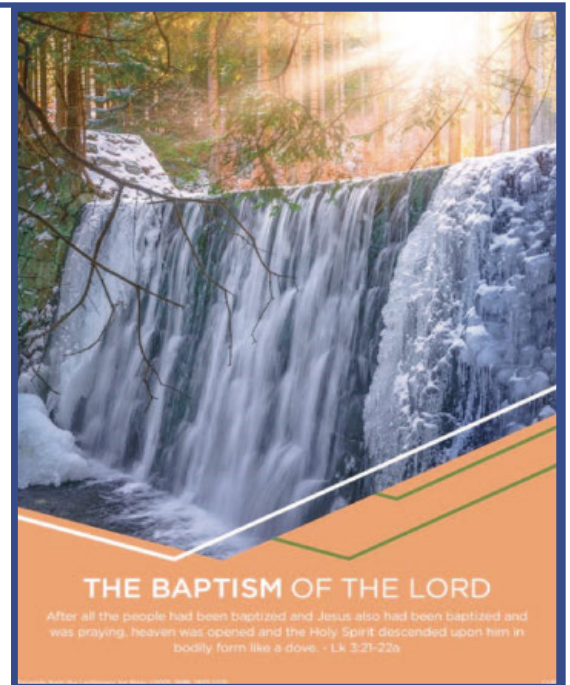
Though the authenticity of this exchange cannot be verified, its message rings perfectly true: all the value of our stewardship lies in its relativity to the One in whose name we perform it.

Consider the figure of John the Baptist – a magnificent, towering character, even purely from a literary or historical perspective. A martyr who fed on wild locusts, and boldly spoke truth to power – a man so great some mistook him for the Messiah.

But why is he great? Because he prepared the way. All his accomplishments and escapades mean nothing if they are taken out of the context of salvation history. He only makes sense relative to Christ – and this is exactly as he wanted it. *“One worthier than I is coming,”* he insists. And because of that humility, and that total embrace of God’s will, he is given one of the greatest honors in the New Testament – he baptizes the Son of God.

Let’s examine our lives in the light of their relativity to Christ. *How do we prepare the way? When Christ comes to us, what do we do? How do we leave ourselves open to be actors in God’s plan?*

Why Do We Do That? – Catholic Life Explained Baptismal Bib

Question:

At my grandson’s Baptism, the priest put a bib on the baby. I do not remember seeing this before. *Why is this done? Is it something new?*



Answer:

When an adult is baptized, there is a part in the ceremony when the newly baptized is vested in a white garment. It is symbolic of the changes that baptism brings in the life of the baptized as they are freed from the bonds of sin, and brought into the saving grace of Christ. Realities that are so profound are symbolically presented so that we might better grasp and understand them.

Infants are often dressed in a baptismal dress, which is the baptismal garment. In some places, the bib is used as a kind of baptismal garment. At the place in the ceremony where the investiture takes place, the bib is used. Some are poncho-like, and fit over the baby’s head. Others are simply placed on the baby’s chest. If the baby is dressed in a white garment, nothing else is needed. The prayer says it all:

“See in your white garment the outward sign of your Christian dignity ... bring that dignity unstained into the everlasting life of Heaven.”

In baptism, we are given our purpose and goal in life as believers, and this is symbolized by the white garment.

Bringing Children To Christ In Eucharistic Adoration

Father Antoine Thomas Developed A Program For Kids

PRINCEVILLE, Illinois, October 6, 2004 (Zenit) – Thanks to a French Priest's vision and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, hundreds of children are engaging in Eucharistic Adoration, and experiencing the real presence of Christ.

Father Antoine Thomas, 46, a Priest of the Congregation of St. John, has been working in Youth Ministry for 15 years, and began leading children's Holy Hours more than 10 years ago. Now he has started a program, "Children Of Hope", that helps others lead Adoration for children.

The Priest, who came from Paris, shared with us how children can embrace and be enriched by spending time with the Blessed Sacrament in their schools and parishes, and what adults can do to encourage the practice.

Q: Why is it important for children to engage in Eucharistic Adoration?

Father Thomas: "Jesus said, 'Let the children come to Me'; I think we had better obey, and bring Him the children."

Pope John Paul II said back in 1996: "I urge Priests, Religious, and Lay People to continue and redouble their efforts to teach the younger generations the meaning and value of Eucharistic Adoration and devotion. How will young people be able to know the Lord if they are not introduced to the mystery of His presence?" By learning the words of the prayer of the heart, they will be closer to the Lord, who will accompany them in their spiritual and human growth. ... All interior life needs silence and intimacy with Christ in order to develop.

"This gradual familiarity with the Lord will enable certain young people to be involved ... and to take a more active part in Mass; for young boys, to be near the altar is also a privileged opportunity to hear Christ's call to follow Him more radically in the priestly ministry." The Holy Father continues to stress this importance today.

What we learn as children will remain in us, and help us to stay close to Jesus. Before young children have received their First Holy Communion, Eucharistic Adoration is a great way to help them receive Jesus in their heart through Spiritual Communion. And afterward, it helps increase in them a desire for more frequent Communion. Hopefully, during the teen years, these same children will find in Jesus a best friend, strength, and light. They also may be more disposed to hear and follow their vocation in life.

Q: What benefits have you seen from children spending time with our Eucharistic Lord?

Father Thomas: "The children have a great excitement about being part of this kind of Prayer Group. They enjoy being at the feet of Jesus, resting under the loving gaze of He, who is no longer hidden in the tabernacle. The children experience a pacification of body, mind, and spirit. They have a deeper desire to pray, are more attentive at Mass, and have an unshakeable Faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament."

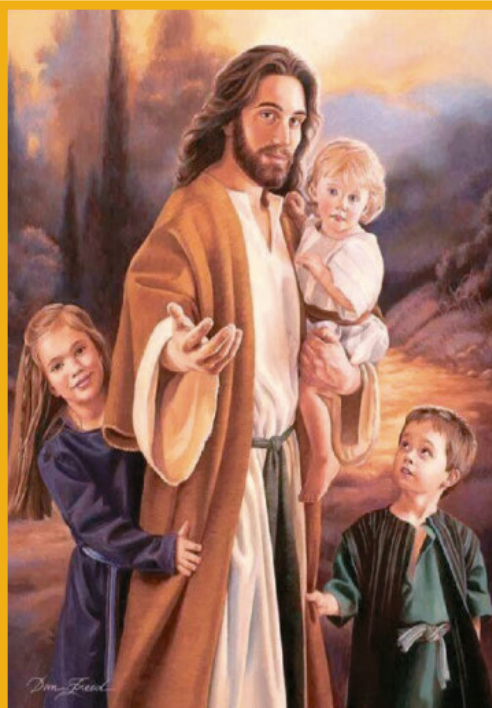
Q: How do you help kids understand Adoration, and get the most out of the experience? How do you keep them focused and engaged for an entire hour?

Father Thomas: "None of us will ever fully understand this mystery. What we do with the children is to remind them of the love that Jesus has for all.

On the night before He died 2,000 years ago, driven by love, and a desire for us not to forget, He chose this way, the Eucharist, to remain close to us in a more visible way. He chose this not out of necessity, but out of His infinite and merciful love.

The children are reminded of the words of consecration, and that Jesus gave this power to all priests. Once they realize they are spending time with Jesus, they are thrilled to come each week; it is their time with Him. (From Catholic Online)."

Sacrament of Marriage:

An appointment, at least 6 months in advance (Diocesan Policy), is made with the Pastor prior to setting a date. Catholic persons will have to obtain new Certificates of Baptism.

Sacrament of Baptism:

Baptisms are scheduled for individual families after each of the weekend Masses. Attendance is required at a Preparation Session. Please call the Parish Secretary for arrangements.

Sacrament of the Sick:

Please notify the Rectory if a member of your family is in the hospital or sick at home, and wishes to receive the Anointing of the Sick. Phone the Rectory for home communion calls.

Welcome New Parishioners:

We would like you to become a parishioner. Registration packets are available at each Church door.

The Rosary:

Prayed Daily at 7:30AM on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays (during the summer only) before Mass. On Fridays (during the school year) prayed at 8AM before Mass.

Handicap Accessibility:

There is an access ramp on the west, and a lift on the east side of Church. Handicap parking is available.

Quinceaneras:

Call the Rectory 9 months prior to setting a date. It is required that you are Registered Participating Parishioners for at least one year prior to requesting a date for the Quinceanera celebration.
