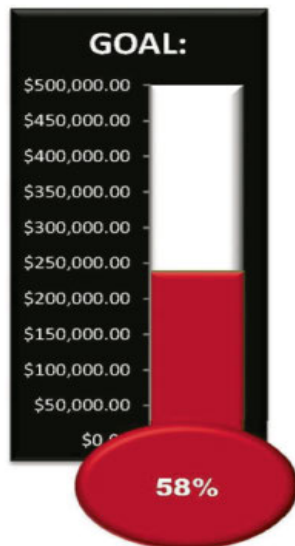

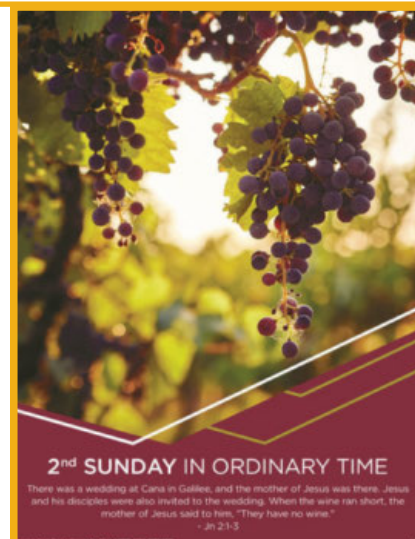
Gospel Meditation – Encourage Deeper Understanding Of Scripture January 16, 2022 – 2nd Sunday In Ordinary Time

God delights in you. *How do you feel when you hear that?* Delight usually comes with an exuberant flow of joy that seemingly arises from one's toes with the expression of great glee. Reflecting upon the deep measure of joy God has in us, can be a source of joy for ourselves. Delight is infectious. A very young brother and sister were playing on the beach when the all too familiar ice cream truck made its daily rounds. The boy shook with excitement and delight as he took his sister's hand and exclaimed, *"The ice cream man is here, isn't it great!"* As they ran off toward the truck, one could hear the girl reply, *"Yeah, I can't wait!"* The experience of a child's delight in something so simple as ice cream, lifts our spirits from our burdens, and transports us to the lighter, more innocent side of life.

Life is not meant to be a burden. Believe it or not, God actually wants us to be happy! In fact, the Wedding Feast at Cana shows us that God even puts His blessing on our happiness. It is okay to celebrate the wonder of ourselves and others. Life is good. It is always interesting to note that Jesus saves the good wine until last. You would think it would be the other way around. The superb quality of Jesus' wine points to the superior quality of life we find in Christ. It is not a life of burdens, but a life of wonder and delight! In Christ, we are lifted from the superficial and mundane, to a life of purpose, hope, and love.

God is with us through the long haul, through the challenges and sorrows, as well as the successes and accomplishments. In spite of the fact that we often wander from the path, God's celebratory delight in us remains. As spouses are asked to remain faithful to each other through whatever life brings, God remains faithful too. This promise remains through this life, and into the next. All we have to do is take the advice of Jesus' Mother to heart when She says, *"Listen to Him."* This wisdom saves us from foolishly giving in to the illusion that we can make better wine than Jesus.

2 Reserve

Reserve your tax credit with the Illinois Department of Revenue (IDOR). You will receive your Contribution Authorization Certificate (CAC) via email. Once you have your CAC, you are ready to donate.

3 Donate

Once you receive confirmation of your tax credit and your CAC from IDOR, you have up to 60 days to donate to the Scholarship Granting Organization of your choice.

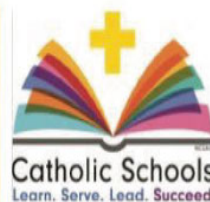

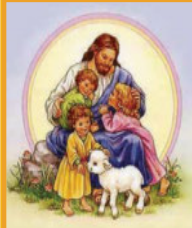

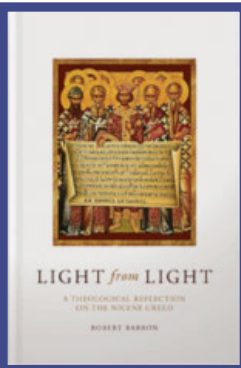


Eucharistic Adoration – Adoration Of Our Lord

“Jesus waits with loving patience for His servants, His children; day and night He is waiting for them.” (–St. Peter Julian Eymard).

New Thursday Morning Bible Study!

Please join St. Patrick's in Wadsworth, as we explore **THE CREED** in our Thursday Morning Bible Study. It started last Thursday, January 13th, 2022, and continues every Thursday morning until Thursday, February 24th. All are welcome and encouraged to attend.

In **THE CREED**, a new film series blending documentary conversations and dynamic talks, Bishop Robert Barron guides viewers into the depths of the Nicene Creed, a fourth-century statement of faith that has profoundly influenced Christian spirituality, theology, and liturgy in both the East and West.

Explore the meaning of *"belief"*, and whether it contradicts reason; the creative love of God the Father; the shocking mystery of His Son's Incarnation, and the great drama of His Crucifixion and Resurrection; the life-giving power of the Spiritus Sanctus, or *"holy breath,"* shared between them; and the mystical reality of the Church, which calls all of humanity out of the world of sin to receive forgiveness, and participate in Christ's divinity – not only in the next world, but here and now.

"Many former believers have simply turned their backs on Christianity, and no longer accept its' teachings. But what are those teachings? And are they the same as what so many people reject?"

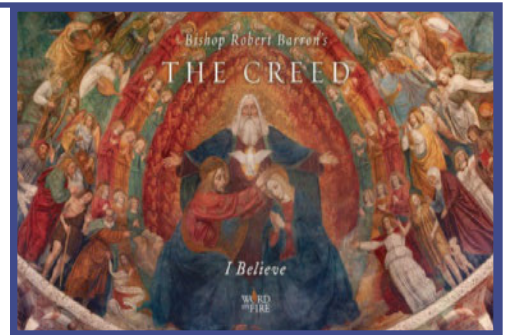

Everyday Stewardship – Recognize God In Your Ordinary Moments – It Takes All Kinds

"If every flower wanted to be a rose," wrote St. Therese of Lisieux, *"Spring would lose its' loveliness."*

Who is God asking you to be today? There is an obvious answer that springs to mind right out of the gate. God wants me to be a good person (a good father, a good husband) today; today, God wants me to be a saint.

But this answer fails to get to the heart of the question. We are all striving today to serve the same Spirit, but we are given different gifts to do so. The one who has the gift of knowledge may fail if today he decides he wants to be a healer. The one who has the gift of *"varieties of tongues"* might falter in the expression of wisdom.

Think about the Wedding at Cana, and the players in the scene: the servers, the guests, the bride and groom. They all have a unique role to play, and though it is to the servers that Mary gives the instruction, *"Do whatever He tells you,"* Her words apply to all.

Today, are we called to be the servers — *do we wait on God's instruction and carry it out, no matter how foolish or impossible it may seem to our human ears? Are we asked to be the disciples, to bear witness to a miracle, and to give our testimony? Are we called to imitate the Blessed Mother, Herself, and give encouragement to follow God's word?*

Let us examine our gifts, and listen in the silence of our hearts to the direction of the Spirit. Then and only then, let us do whatever He tells us. —Tracy Earl Welliver, MTS ©LPi

Sacrament of Marriage:

An appointment, at least 6 months in advance (Diocesan Policy), is made with the Pastor prior to setting a date. Catholic persons will have to obtain new Certificates of Baptism.

Sacrament of Baptism:

Baptisms are scheduled for individual families after each of the weekend Masses. Attendance is required at a Preparation Session. Please call the Parish Secretary for arrangements.

Sacrament of the Sick:

Please notify the Rectory if a member of your family is in the hospital or sick at home, and wishes to receive the Anointing of the Sick. Phone the Rectory for home communion calls.

Welcome New Parishioners:

We would like you to become a parishioner. Registration packets are available at each Church door.

The Rosary:

Prayed Daily at 7:30AM on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays (during the summer only) before Mass. On Fridays (during the school year) prayed at 8AM before Mass.

Call the Rectory 9 months prior to setting a date. It is required that you are Registered Participating Parishioners for at least one year prior to requesting a date for the Quinceanera celebration.
