

IN OUR PARISH COMMUNITY

I was trying to imagine what it was like to be a Jewish person at the time of Jesus' birth. The prophets foretold the coming of a king from the line of David who would lead them back home. He would come to save them from the restraints of other nations and give them their freedom back. He would be their King and theirs alone. He would be strong and powerful, and nobody would get in his way. He certainly would be recognizable when he comes, or would he be?

In our Gospel today we celebrate the Epiphany because God is revealed to us through Jesus Christ. He is revealed not only to the Jewish people but to all nations. People from outside the Jewish community came to recognize Jesus even though a lot of the Jewish people did not. There was such a powerful presence that the Magi came from long distances to honor the newborn King. The Magi were not sure what to expect on their journey but when they finally met up with Jesus their lives were changed forever.

Jesus came to fulfill the words of the prophets, but it was certainly not in the way that the Jewish people expected. A different way of thinking needed to take place. Jesus came to show us the way to true happiness. Power would be given to the people through forgiveness and love. We are free when we trust in Jesus to lead us, and we are free when we love others as he showed us.

Let us open our hearts to what God has revealed to us through his Son Jesus Christ and let our lives be changed forever like the Magi. May we be open to recognizing Jesus in the people we are with every day, whether they know Jesus or not, and may we trust that Jesus will lead us in every aspect of our lives.
