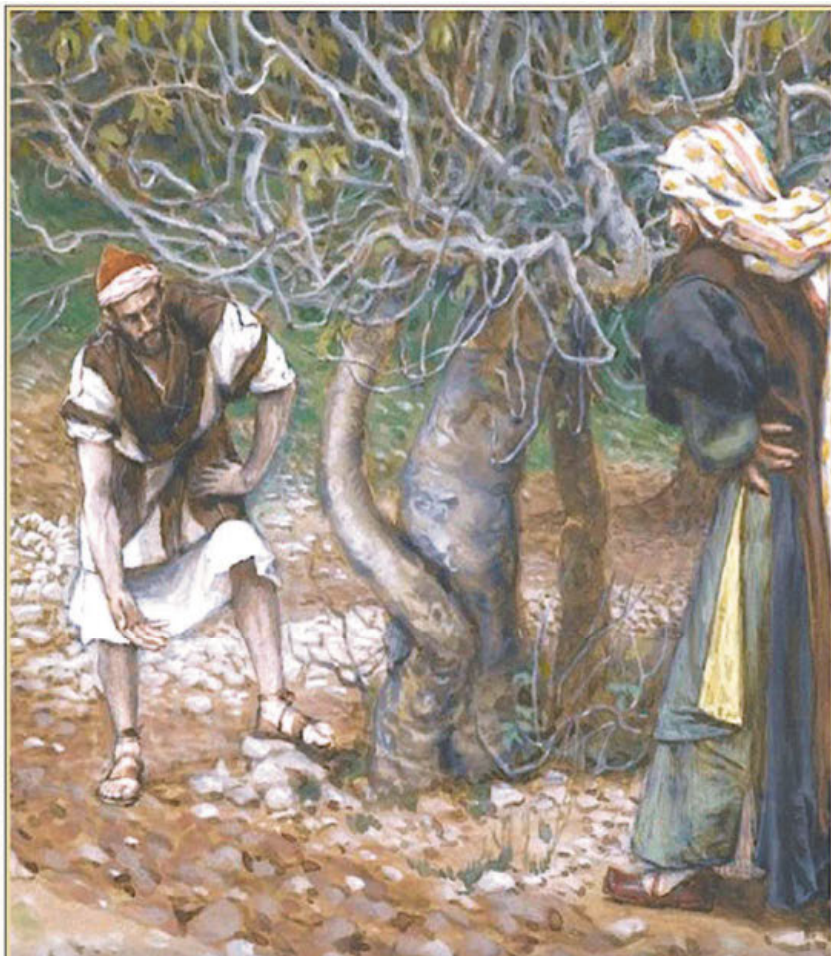

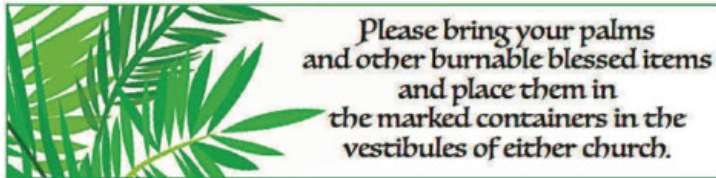

STEWARDSHIP

EMPOWER ILLINOIS A donation made to Saint Paul School, or the Diocese of Peoria re: Schools (SPS/DoP), via Empower Illinois (EI) provides the donor an Illinois Tax Credit or taxes due that year of up to 75% of the donation. For example, if one owes/paid \$100 in Illinois State Tax (IST) and makes a \$100 donation to SPS via EI, the donor will receive a \$75 tax credit/back respectively. If they owe/paid \$200 in IST and donate \$100 as above, they will receive a \$75 credit/back respectively. If donor owes/pays \$300 in IST and donates \$200 via EI, the donor will receive a \$150 credit/back respectively. Of course, the tax credit could then be donated to Saint Paul School!

Please contact SPS for more information and assistance in donating via EI. A \$1 for \$1 match is being made up to \$10,000 = \$20,000 over 5 students full, or several more partial tuition scholarships for Saint Paul School! This provides more funds via tuition for the school!

“A FAVORITE TIME”

Lent is a favorable time for personal and community renewal, as it leads us to the paschal mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

DON'T GIVE UP

... We will do well to reflect on Saint Paul's exhortation to the Galatians: "Let us not grow tired of doing good, for in due time we shall reap our harvest, if we do not give up. So then, while we have the opportunity ..., let us do good to all" (Gal 6:9-10)

“A CHANGE IN MINDSET”

Lent invites us to conversion, to a change in mindset, so that life's truth and beauty may be found not so much in possessing as in giving, not so much in accumulating as in sowing and in sharing goodness.

“OPEN AND DOCILE”

Regular listening to the word of God makes us open and docile to His working ... and bears fruit in our lives. This brings us great joy, yet even more, it summons us to become God's co-workers.

“FREEDOM FROM SIN”

Serving God in freedom from sin brings forth fruits of sanctification for the salvation of all (cf. Rom 6:22).

A DAILY CHALLENGE

Each year during Lent we are reminded that "goodness, together with love, justice and solidarity, are not achieved once and for all; they have to be realized every day ... Let us ask God to give us the patient perseverance of the farmer ..., and to persevere in doing good, one step at a time. If we fall, let us stretch out our hand to the Father, who always lifts us up. If we are lost, if we are misled by the enticements of the evil one, let us not hesitate to return to God, who is "generous in forgiving" (Is 55:7)

DON'T GROW TIRED

In this season of conversion, sustained by God's grace and by the communion of the Church, let us not grow tired of doing good. The soil is prepared by fasting, watered by prayer and enriched by charity. Let us believe firmly that, with the gift of perseverance, we shall obtain what is promised (cf. Heb 10:36), for our salvation and the salvation of others (cf. 1 Tim 4:16).

“THE GIFT OF PATIENCE”

May the Virgin Mary, who bore the Savior in her womb and "pondered all these things in her heart" (Lk 2:19), obtain for us the gift of patience. May she accompany us with her maternal presence, so that this season of conversion may bring forth fruits of eternal salvation.

DIVINE MERCY DAILY

Reflections from the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska

~ OFFER ME YOUR MISERY ~

MEDITATION:

Write, My daughter, that I am mercy itself for the contrite soul. A soul's greatest wretchedness does not enkindle Me with wrath; but rather, My Heart is moved towards it with great mercy (Diary, 1739).

For you, I am mercy itself; therefore I ask you to offer Me your misery and this very helplessness of yours and, in this way, you will delight My Heart (Diary, 1775).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Jesus, You are mercy itself. I offer You my misery and that of the whole world. May Your Heart of Mercy delight at this offering of our misery to You. Jesus, have mercy on us and on the whole world.

~ NOTHING WILL STOP ME ~

MEDITATION:

Today the Lord said to me, My daughter, My pleasure and delight, nothing will stop Me from granting you graces. Your misery does not hinder My mercy. My daughter, write that the greater the misery of a soul, the greater its right to My mercy; [urge] all souls to trust in the unfathomable abyss of My mercy, because I want to save them all. On the cross, the fountain of My mercy was opened wide by the lance for all souls — no one have I excluded! (Diary, 1182).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Thank You, Jesus, that nothing will stop You from granting me Your graces. I rely on Your Heart opened on the Cross to bathe me in Your mercy. Bathe me and the whole world in Your mercy!

~ A VESSEL FOR GRACES ~

MEDITATION:

Once, Jesus said to me, My gaze from this image is like My gaze from the cross (Diary, 326).

I am offering people a vessel with which they are to keep coming for graces to the fountain of mercy. That vessel is this image with the signature: "Jesus, I trust in You" (Diary, 327).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Jesus, look at me from the Cross, so I may trust in You even more each time I gaze at You portrayed in Your image. I want to keep coming to this image as a vessel for graces. Keep my gaze fixed on You.

~ THE GREATER THE SINNER ~

MEDITATION:

Today, I heard these words: The graces I grant you are not for you alone, but for a great number of other souls as well. ... And your heart is My constant dwelling place, despite the misery that you are. I unite Myself with you, take away your misery, and give you My mercy. I perform works of mercy in every soul. The greater the sinner, the greater the right he has to My mercy. My mercy is confirmed in every work of My hands. He who trusts in My mercy will not perish, for all his affairs are Mine, and his enemies will be shattered at the base of My footstool (Diary, 723).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Lord Jesus, work miracles of mercy in the souls of the miserable, especially those trapped in sin, because they so need Your mercy. Help us all to trust in Your mercy.
