
Sewardship Reflection

When we use our gifts in the way that God intends, He fills us with supernatural joy, a joy that others notice and are attracted to!

We will welcome Saint Mary School for Mass and the Field Day with Saint Paul School on Friday, May 13th. Mass will begin as close to 8:30 a.m. as possible (once Saint Mary School has arrived and is settled in the pews).


