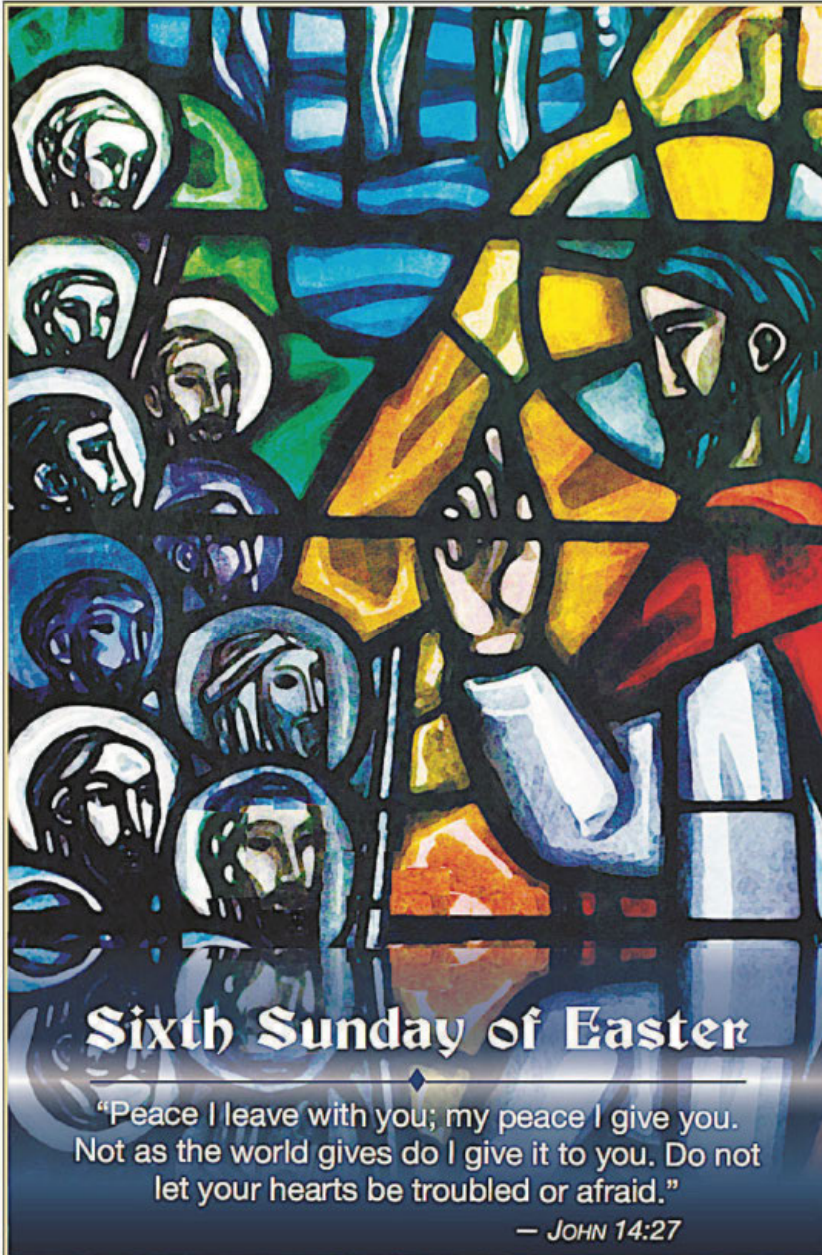

DIVINE MERCY DAILY

Reflections from the Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska

~ OUR DUTY ~

MEDITATION:

December 16, [1936]. I have offered this day for Russia. ... After Holy Communion, Jesus said to me, **I cannot suffer that country any longer. Do not tie my hands, My daughter.** I understood that if it had not been for the prayers of souls that are pleasing to God, that whole nation would have already been reduced to nothingness (Diary, 818).

When once I asked the Lord Jesus how He could tolerate so many sins and crimes and not punish them, the Lord answered me, **I have eternity for punishing [these], and so I am prolonging the time of mercy for the sake of [sinners]. But woe to them if they do not recognize this time of My visitation. My daughter, secretary of My mercy, your duty is not only to write about and proclaim My mercy, but also to beg for this grace for them, so that they too may glorify My mercy** (Diary, 1160).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Lord Jesus, thank You for instructing St. Faustina not only to write about Your mercy toward sinners but also to beg for mercy for them.

~ MOVING HEAVEN ~

MEDITATION:

Good Friday [April 15, 1938]. I saw the Lord Jesus, tortured, but not nailed to the Cross. It was still before the crucifixion, and He said to me, **You are My Heart. Speak to sinners about My mercy.** And the Lord gave me interior knowledge of the whole abyss of His mercy for souls, and I learned that that which I had written is truly a drop (Diary, 1666).

I heard these words: If you did not tie My hands, I would send down many punishments upon the earth. My daughter, your look disarms My anger. Although your lips are silent, you call out to Me so mightily that all heaven is moved. I cannot escape from your requests, because you pursue Me, not from afar but within your own heart (Diary, 1722).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Lord Jesus, through the intercession of St. Faustina, teach me how to beg for mercy on the whole world and move all of heaven like she did! Give me Your Heart, Lord, so I can appreciate better the whole abyss of Your mercy for souls.

~ FOR THE WHOLE WORLD ~

MEDITATION:

My daughter, I have inclined My Heart to your requests. Your assignment and duty here on earth is to beg for mercy for the

whole world. No soul will be justified until it turns with confidence to My mercy, and this is why the first Sunday after Easter is to be the Feast of Mercy. On that day, priests are to tell everyone about My great and unfathomable mercy. I am making you the [dispenser] of My mercy. Tell the confessor that the Image is to be on view in the church and not within the enclosure in that convent. By means of this Image I shall be granting many graces to souls; so, let every soul have access to it (Diary, 570).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Lord Jesus I unite myself with St. Faustina, the dispenser of Your Mercy, to beg for mercy on the whole world. May every soul have access to the image of You as the Divine Mercy and to the Feast of Mercy.

~ DISTRUST IS TEARING AT MY INSIDES ~

MEDITATION:

Jesus complained to me in these words, **Distrust on the part of souls is tearing at My insides. The distrust of a chosen soul causes Me even greater pain; despite My inexhaustible love for them they do not trust Me. Even My death is not enough for them. Woe to the soul that abuses these [gifts]** (Diary, 50).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Jesus, open the hearts of distrusting souls, especially the hearts of chosen souls to Your mercy. As they receive Your mercy, may they give You joy!

~ A BURNING DESIRE TO SAVE SOULS ~

MEDITATION:

The Lord said to me, **The loss of each soul plunges Me into mortal sadness. You always console Me when you pray for sinners. The prayer most pleasing to Me is prayer for the conversion of sinners. Know, My daughter, that this prayer is always heard and answered** (Diary, 1397).

March 25, 1938. Today, I saw the suffering Lord Jesus. He leaned down toward me and whispered softly, **My daughter, help Me to save sinners.** Suddenly, a burning desire to save souls entered my soul. When I recovered my senses, I knew just how I was to help souls, and I prepared myself for greater sufferings (Diary, 1645).

MY PRAYER RESPONSE:

Lord Jesus, I want to respond to Your "mortal sadness" caused by the loss of each soul. Give me a "burning desire to save souls" like that of St. Faustina. Give me the graces to even suffer for the conversion of sinners.

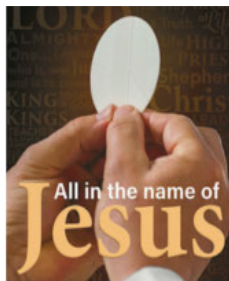

LISTEN FROM THE HEART

Pope Francis, Shepherd of Truth

Notable quotations from Pope Francis
and official teachings of the Roman Catholic Church.



THE LORD'S CALL

The Lord explicitly calls the human person to a covenant of love, so that they can fully become what they are: the image and likeness of God in His capacity to listen, to welcome, to give space to others. Fundamentally, listening is a dimension of love.

"LISTEN WELL"

... Jesus calls His disciples to evaluate the quality of their listening. "Take heed then how you hear" (LK 8:18): this is what He exhorts them to do after recounting the parable of the sower, making it understood that it is not enough to listen, but that it is necessary to listen well.

OPEN HEARTS

It is only by paying attention to whom we listen, to what we listen, and to how we listen that we can grow in the art of communicating, the heart of which is not a theory or a technique, but the "openness of heart that makes closeness possible" (cf. Apostolic exhortation Evangelii Gaudium, 171)

DON'T FORGET

"Christians have forgotten that the ministry of listening has been committed to them by Him who is Himself the great listener and whose work they should share. We should listen with the ears of God that we may speak the word of God." Thus, the Protestant theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer reminds

us that the first service we owe to others in communion consists in listening to them. Whoever does not know how to listen to his brother or sister will soon no longer be able to listen to God either.

INDISPENSABLE ELEMENT

Listening is ... the first indispensable ingredient of dialogue and good communication. Communication does not take place if listening has not taken place, and there is no good journalism without the ability to listen.

LISTENING AND DISCERNMENT

Listening to several voices, listening to each other, even in the Church, among brothers and sisters, allows us to exercise the art of discernment, which always appears as the ability to orient ourselves in a symphony of voices.

"GREAT NEED"

In the Church ... there is a great need to listen to and hear one another. It is the most precious and life-giving gift we can give one another.

"MOST IMPORTANT"

The most important task in pastoral activity is the "apostolate of the ear" — to listen before speaking, as the Apostle James exhorts: "Let every man be quick to hear, slow to speak" (1:19). Freely giving some of our own time to listen to people is the first act of charity.

PRAY for VOCATIONS Join an "Invisible Monastery" Pledge to pray for vocations at the international website, invisiblemonastery.com. It was inspired by a call from the Vatican urging Catholics to "organize an 'invisible monastery' in which many persons, day and night, are committed to continuous prayer for priestly vocations."
