



#### **CCD First Reconciliation**



#### **Sharing the Mission of Christ**

Today's readings show us two scenes in which the scriptures are being read publicly. The first is when Ezra the priest reads the Torah to the people. The proclamation of the law became an occasion of great sorrow as the people reflected on their failure to keep the covenant, which was seen as leading to their long exile in Babylon.

The second scene takes place in the synagogue in Nazareth, when Jesus comes home to inaugurate his ministry by reading from the scroll of Isaiah. The famous passage Jesus reads goes to the very heart of the covenant: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor."

We are the third audience for this powerful challenge coming to us today from the Word of God. Jesus himself is now speaking to us in our assembly: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon you. You have been anointed to bring good news to the poor...to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

Why is this reading about us? In today's second reading, St. Paul reminds us that we are the body of Jesus now present in the world. His ministry of preaching, healing, mercy and liberation is now taking place through us.

The people of Nazareth were at first moved by Jesus' eloquence, but their reaction turned quickly to skepticism and then to rejection when Jesus said that the words of Isaiah were being fulfilled in that very moment. His family and neighbors were stunned. Just who is this man, a simple carpenter, one of us, and yet he claims that God is fulfilling one of the great messianic promises through him?

Is their skepticism our own? We, too, are ordinary people sinful and weak. Can God empower us to bring the good news to the poor, freedom to captives, sight to the blind? Are we not just simple carpenters, working people, teachers, nurses, business men and women, farmers and child-care givers, parents and grandparents?

Yet we are asked to believe that this word is fulfilled in our hearing. The kingdom of God is at hand, the hand of God but also our hands, our feet, our voices and our faces turned to the world with compassion.

We are about to approach the Table of the Lord to receive Jesus in Communion. By receiving him we commit ourselves to be Jesus, anointed by his Holy Spirit to carry out his mission.

In this New Year 2022, we will see and hear Jesus again and again in the Sunday Gospels. If we dare to imitate him, his word will come true in our hearing. God will provide everything we need to carry out our vocations as disciples of Jesus.

Like the ancient people of God who wept at the reading of the law, we, too, are called to repent for our failures. But this is also meant to be a time of rejoicing. The joy of the Gospel is always ours in Jesus. If we live as missionaries of mercy, we will know God's mercy in our own lives. If we liberate one another with forgiveness, we ourselves will be set free. If we lift the burdens of the oppressed, we will know God's favor in our own difficulties.

God is always blessing us. Let us make 2022 a Year of Favor from the Lord.
