

THE LIVES OF THE SAINTS

St. Oscar Romero, March 24

When St. Oscar Romero was appointed Archbishop of San Salvador in 1977, his country was in chaos. He set up pastoral programs to assist the victims of oppression. He also became an outspoken advocate for human rights. Many people in El Salvador were living in poverty.

On March 24, 1980, St. Oscar Romero was murdered while celebrating Mass in El Salvador. A car pulled up outside, and a gunman fired a single shot straight into St. Oscar Romero's heart.

Calling him a "a martyr for the faith" nearly 40 years later, Pope Francis canonized him in 2018. For the occasion, Pope Francis chose to wear the same blood-stained belt that Romero was wearing at the altar when he died.

Lent: A Time for Reconciliation

The season of Lent is a special time when we are reminded of our call to conversion. If you haven't gone to confession in a while, it's the perfect time to reconcile yourself with God and the Church.

Preparation for confession should include an examination of conscience, which means you think back on sins you have committed since your last confession.

What happens during confession depends on the priest and the person. Most people still start with the formula: "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned. It has been (state the number of months or years) since my last confession.."

If you can't remember the words or you don't recall how long it's been, don't worry! Just tell the priest it's been a long time, and he will guide you through the process.

Don't stress about going to confession, rejoice in God's love and mercy! Participating in the Sacrament of Reconciliation allows you to experience the healing gift of God's love!

Q: Why do priests wear vestments? Do they have a special meaning?



A: Vestments are clothes worn for a specific purpose. Our own manner of dress often corresponds to what we do. We dress up for special occasions, activities, and for special guests. We even had our "Sunday best" clothes we wore just for Church. Vestments are much the same, and each one has a meaning.

The **alb** is a reminder of the baptismal garment. The **stole** is a symbol of ordained ministry and authority within the Church. The chasuble reminds us that we are on a pilgrimage of faith, passing through this life towards heaven.

Priests wear vestments for two basic reasons:

First, they draw attention to the importance and solemnity of the act of worship. The color of the vestments indicates the season of the year or the feast being celebrated.

Second, vestments draw attention to what the priest does, rather than who he is. In the celebration of the Mass, the focus is on what we do together, on our common unity, and on the mystery and person of Christ.

Let us not grumble like the people in the desert. For we stand in the grace of God who pours divine love into our hearts and being. Let us stay in conversation with Jesus just as the Samaritan woman did at the well through our prayer and Lenten reading.

- How will I be a sign of healing and support to the elect thirsting for Easter Baptism?
