Have you put on your "God glasses"?

Jesus tells the blind man "you have seen the Son of Man, you have seen the Christ; the one speaking with you is he." What if each of us could put on some glasses—"God glasses"—that allow us to see that intricate and detailed beauty of each person?

Imagine how differently we would act if each time we encountered our co-workers, we saw Christ. How differently we would treat our parents, our children, our spouse, and our classmates, our friends, our enemies. How differently we would treat the people who sit around us in church, the people we see here every week but to whom we never talk, the people who don't speak our language, the people who don't look, act, or think the way we do.

Imagine if each time we encounter each other, each time we speak with one another, we "see" Christ, we "hear" Jesus. How different our world would be.

THE LIVES OF THE SAINTS

St. Michael the Archangel

A statue of St. Michael the Archangel stands in the center of Kyiv, depicted with a shield and a sword, as the protector of the capital of Ukraine and the entire country. In the 16th century, St. Michael appeared on the coat of arms of Kyiv. But in 1969, during the regime of the Soviet Union, the authorities replaced his figure with chestnut leaves. After the fall of the USSR, the archangel was returned to the coat of arms, in 1995.

Major Archbishop Sviatoslav Shevchuk spoke about the angelic protector on March 4. "Here in Kyiv we perceive that the patron of our city is the Archangel Michael, who, with the cry, 'Who is like God?' cast into the abyss Lucifer — the one who rose up against God's truth and was the leader of the diabolical armies," he said. "We perceive today that the Archangel Michael, together with the whole Heavenly Host, is fighting for Ukraine."



Upcoming Events

There are a couple of things that I'd like to make you aware of as they unfold in the world around us. I usually leave Church news to the Church news websites, but as these "touch home" a little, I think

it's good for us all to be informed. Firstly, you may have heard that the global Church has undertaken, under the leadership of Pope Francis, a global "synod"—as a matter of fact, it's a "synod on synodality." Essentially, what the Pope is asking is that people throughout the world would take part in a process of

"synodality" (which comes from

the Greek word for "gathering" or "assembly"), which includes dialogue, accompaniment, and collaboration among the diocesan leadership, ordained clergy, religious, and lay faithful. I would like to officially invite anyone who desires to participate in the synod to a listening session to be conducted at Holy Family Parish in Decatur at 2:00 pm this Sunday, March 27.

At this listening session, the Bishop will address all present (virtually, as there are various locations throughout the diocese where these sessions are being held), before those present break out into groups to discuss three key questions, as outlined by the Bishop.

We will reflect on the progress we have made in the five years that have passed since we held our Fourth Diocesan Synod in 2017: In what ways are we seeing the fruits of discipleship unfold in our local communities? What essential work remains to be done? What are the challenges and opportunities we see to evangelize and form missionary disciples of Christ?

We will reflect on synodality and evangelization: A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, 'journeys together.' How is this 'journeying together' happening today in your particular

Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together'? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take to spread the **Gospel of Jesus Christ?**

We will also reflect on challenges to authentic discipleship: Given our negative experience with the loss of Catholic Charities foster care and adoption services 10 years ago due to government mandates contrary to our Catholic faith, how do we prepare for such mandates possibly being imposed on our Catholic schools?


The session will conclude with a group discussion and presentation to the Bishop on the nature of the conversation among those present.

Finally, on a different note, please keep up your prayers for the people of Ukraine! As some of you may have heard, Pope Francis consecrated Russia and the Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the afternoon of Friday, March 25-the Solemnity of the Annunciation. The Pope has encouraged bishops, priests, and laity to join their prayers to his, and although the consecration has already taken place—it's never too late to add our prayers to the Holy Father's!
