


What's a Parochial Administrator?

According to Canon Law, when a parish is "vacant," meaning that the pastor has retired, been transferred to another assignment, or is unable to exercise his duties as a pastor, the bishop must appoint as soon as possible a parochial administrator. In general, an administrator has the same duties and scope of authority as a pastor; however, these may be limited by the bishop.

In deciding the appointment of a pastor to a vacant parish, the bishop should make a judgment based on his knowledge of the priest's character and abilities, and on the advice of other priests and laity (Canon. 524). As such, the bishop may obtain this knowledge and advice during a priest's time as administrator of a parish.



Ill or Hospital Bound?


