A WORD FROM FR. RAMESH

Listening to Jesus: Mary has chosen the better part.

Jesus visited the home of Martha and Mary in Bethany. These two sisters are very different, as often is the case with siblings. After reflecting upon these two sisters, we can choose which of their perspectives to follow.

Martha is in the presence of Jesus, but she is not present to Him. Martha is physically in the same

house as Jesus. But when He speaks, instead of listening to Jesus, Martha is busy doing her own preoccupied things.

what exactly is Martha doing instead of listening to Jesus? She would certainly be the first to explain that she's working for Iesus. Her work is all about Jesus. But here's something to be Fr. Ramesh, noted, she's not doing what Iesus wants her to do. This sets before us one of the key distinctions of

the catholic spiritual life. This is the difference between sincerity and fidelity. Some persons believe that as long as they're sincere in what they do in life, then they're being faithful to what God wants them to do. This is a mistaken belief, and this belief can lead to many dead-ends in the spiritual life. Sincerity is definitely a virtue, but it is not a measure of fidelity.

And here is Martha's sister Mary. Mary is in the presence of Jesus and is also present to Jesus. Mary shows us path of our fidelity is the spiritual virtue of listening. Mary listens to Jesus. But what did Jesus say to her? We understand in the gospel that St. Luke the Evangelist does not reveal to us what Jesus said to her. What Jesus said was for Mary alone. But that Mary listened is for all of us to imitate: to listen, so that we might faithfully obey God.

Mary listened to Jesus' words: this is what Jesus calls "the better part". Let us choose the better path and make ourselves humble everyday by listening to Jesus, who knows what we are and what we need the most. May the Holy Spirit guide our journey.

Be Ready for God to "Stop By"

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't. For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called "stopping by."

They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. "I was just in the neighborhood," they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

"Crazy," you might exclaim. "People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope with the uncertainty?" Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or drink that was extra nice, just in case anyone stopped by. That way, we were always ready.

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. Most of all, though, they're about readiness.

If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to be?
