In August, the Catholic Church celebrates the devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. A devotion is something that people do or say to show their love for God. The Immaculate Heart of Mary signifies, first of all, the great purity and love of the heart of the Blessed Virgin for God.

When we honor the Immaculate Heart, we give ultimate honor to Jesus. As we honor the Mother, we honor the Son. In addition, the Blessed Virgin is our mother as well (see Revelation 12:17), and her mother's heart is incomparable. St. Louis de Montfort said, "If you put all the love of all the mothers into one heart, it still would not equal the love of the heart of Mary for her children."

To "consecrate" means to "make holy" or to set oneself aside for service of God. This is beautiful! It is also a lifelong commitment, and shouldn't be taken lightly. If you are interested in consecrating yourself or your family to the Immaculate Heart, spend some time learning about the devotion and discerning it through prayer. You could pray an Immaculate Heart novena or an Immaculate Heart chaplet.

You could also memorize a few breath prayers (Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for me!), meditate on scripture (try Luke 2:19, Luke 2:35, and Luke 2:51), or look find another option that really speaks to you. Many Catholics consecrate their homes and/or families to the Immaculate Heart for the graces and special protection received.

She teaches us to face death this way – falling asleep in the Lord – one more way to proclaim the greatness of the Lord.




The St. Thomas Parish family extends a warm welcome to our new parochial administrator, **Fr. Peter Chineke!** We look forward to getting to



Thank you very much to all who have responded to the idea of installing a flagpole with an American flag outside the church at the Northeast entrance. Your






chapel under the icon of Our Lady of Perpetual Help. These intentions will be remembered in our intercessions at all Masses.
