

The disciples saw how Jesus lived and dealt with the day's circumstances. They wanted that same faith and determination. They wanted his fortitude and courage. In the meantime, waiting in joyful hope, we become servants who do what is necessary: Nurturing a deep love of God and trusting in his providence, we obediently do what we know is pleasing to God: love, repent of sin, show mercy, be compassionate and fight injustice.

As we willingly give witness to our faith, we do only what we are obliged to do, expecting nothing in return. Spared from the task of having to figure it all out for ourselves, we discover freedom.

Many of us have heard the expression "Oh, Father is busy!" several times. Others may have heard it only a few times or too many times. Whichever be the case, it seems one of those diplomatic ways in which Satan distracts or dissuades us from reaching out to our priests when we need them. We live in a time and place where the shortage of priests tends to be a significant pastoral obstacle to the practice of our faith and practical involvement in parish life and religious activities. He continually reminds us that our priests are busy, so we should not contact or reach out to priests when we need them. This issue is a satanic manipulation we should all be aware of and guard against.

Sometimes, this awful idea that our priests are too busy comes from our false impressions of their schedules and pastoral inclinations. Other times, these thoughts about our priests being too busy come from some pastoral agents who either want to take the place of the priests in our lives or who do not like the priest and try to dissuade us from any actual contact with him.

Whichever be the case, I sincerely encourage us to understand that no matter how busy our priests are, they have time for us. Let us not allow anything or anyone to keep us away from our priests. Visit them, reach out to them, and ask for their prayers. Reach out to them for moral, pastoral, and spiritual questions, and invite them to your family activities. They are your priests! And be open to the fact that they, like any other person, will not be able to honor all invitations or attend to every request.


Annette H Mormino (99), a longtime St. Thomas parishioner, passed away on September 21 in her home at Primrose Retirement Community in Decatur.



Recipe from Thomasian Cooks

St. Thomas Women's Club Cookbook Published in 1978

TEXAS CAKE

| 4 Tb. Cocoa | 1 C. water |
|--------------------|-------------------|
| 2 c. flour | 2 C.sugar |
| 2 sticks margarine | 1/2 c. buttermilk |
| 2 eggs, beaten | 1/2 tsp. cinnamon |
| 1 tsp. soda | 1 tsp. vanilla |

Bring 1 c. water and 4 Tb. cocoa to a boil. Pour this over the flour, sugar and margarine mixture and beat well. Add 1/2 c. buttermilk, 2 beaten eggs, 1/2 tsp. cinnamon, 1 tsp. soda and 1 tsp. vanilla. Mix well and pour in large greased and floured pan--9x13. Bake 250 deg. for 25-30 minutes.

Frosting:

| 4 Tb. Cocoa | 6 Tb. milk |
|-------------------|----------------------|
| 1 stick margarine | 1 box powdered sugar |
| 1 tsp. vanilla | nuts (optional) |

Melt the margarine and add 4 Tb. cocoa and 6 Tb. milk, vanilla, nuts and powdered sugar. Spread on cooled cake.
