

CONTEMPLATE

Prepare the Way of the Lord!

The message of John the Baptist becomes the calling of every baptized disciple of Jesus Christ. Each one of us is asked to prepare the way of the Lord. We can more readily take up the task of our lifework by clearing our lives of unnecessary, distracting clutter.

By conducting ourselves in holiness and devotion, we can speak volumes to those we meet. Not by preaching actual words, but by living lives that communicate the comfort God wants His people to know. We can be people of patience who show others that it's okay to wait for God's gift to come.



Hidden Figures

We often hear about people who, although we do not know much about them, are among the most significant influences on the prominent figures we

hear more about. Because of utmost humility and love for God, such persons choose to impact lives and influence humanity in a virtuous quietness. Like St. John the Baptist, they prefer to decrease, for our Lord to increase (John 3:30). In the history of our salvation in Christ, I call such men and women - the Hidden Figures.

Our Blessed Mother, The Virgin Mary, is one of these hidden

figures. While we know some things about her, we do not know enough compared to the role she played in the human life of Jesus and the history of our salvation. We all know and believe in Jesus Christ as our Lord and savior today. We should remember that everything came to us through the Blessed Virgin Mary, even Jesus.

Another important figure that was fully human and ordinary, like any of us, is St. Ambrose. Besides being known as a great theologian and a holy bishop in early medieval Europe, St Ambrose played a critical role in the life of St. Augustine. St. Augustine, the Church's finest intellectual clergy for centuries until St. Thomas Aquinas came along about 800 years later, was taught, converted, and baptized by St. Ambrose. Whereas St. Augustine remains one of the most influential people in the history of Christianity, there might never have been a St. Augustine without St. Ambrose.

This week, we celebrate these icons of humility, who gave all they had and allowed themselves to be used in fulfilling God's plan in others. On Wednesday, December 7th, we will celebrate the memorial of St. Ambrose. Then on Thursday, December 8th, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of our Blessed Mother. Because it's a solemnity, every Catholic should attend Mass and stay away from strenuous work, just like on Sundays.

Happy Feast of the Solemnity of Immaculate Conception to all our parishioners and friends.
