## How is your Lent going so far?

In changing the circumstances and order of our lives a bit, perhaps we can hear God's voice more clearly and drink more deeply of graced moments we experience. Having God as a friend always involves several things. First, there is God's call. We become attuned to the echo of God's voice in the depth of our souls calling and beckoning us to listen.

Second, there is a request. We begin to see that God asks us to do certain things, to order our lives a particular way, and become more intentional in the choices we make.

Third, there is trust. Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are.

Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence.

#### Listen to Him.

One week into Lent, we are simply told by the voice from the cloud: Listen to Jesus. He told us last Sunday to "believe in the gospel." What does belief in this Good News look and sound like this Lent, this year? God wants us to change things up a bit and order our lives differently. We have to trust that this is where we need to be. The fruit that is revealed will indicate whether our journey is authentic.

- Since we are descendants of Abraham, how am I to behave with my cousins (that is, everyone)?
- Since we are sisters and brothers in the Lord Jesus Christ, to whom do I listen? What am I told?



## Detached or Attached to the Things around Me?

This second week of Lent, let us reflect more profoundly on how attached or detached we are from things around us. As Christians, living a life detached from our material possessions is crucial for a healthy Christian life. Our Lord Jesus suffered hunger, thirst, loneliness,

slander, and persecution in the wilderness of our sins.

He reflected continuously on his upcoming passion and death on the cross. Our Lord Jesus prayed relentlessly that God's would be done. Christ did not worry about anything or anyone he left behind in all these. Instead, he focused on his Fr. Peter Chineke, mission in the world redeeming the depraved humanity and reconciling us to God.

By giving up everything, Jesus received everything from the Father. These include the salvation of the broken human race whom he condescended to their likeness, suffered for, and died to redeem.

During his ministry on earth with his disciples, Jesus constantly emphasized the need to live a detached life. He preached this in both words and actions. Attachment to the things of this world, he believes, is an obstacle to the salvation that he (Christ) suffered and died on the Cross to gain for humanity. There is no mention of Jesus owning houses, vehicles, electronics, gadgets, or similar things throughout the gospels. No one ever told of Jesus going on vacation with his parents or friends. And he commanded large followership, but Jesus never abused his power or used it for his selfish interests.

While he does not condemn material things, Jesus strongly urges us to live our lives detached from

them. Because when we are detached from our earthly possessions, skills, and powers, we can better use them for God's glory and humanity's good. Living that life most perfectly, Jesus and his disciples spent the rest of their lives having little or nothing to do with private possessions. That way, they could give themselves entirely to God and his people.

As we continue our Lenten journey, let us explore ways to live more detached from material possessions. This way, we can give ourselves more fully to God and his people.

Beginning this Lent, a few changes have been made to update the English text of the prayers used in the confessional.


The changes basically only affect the priest confessor and not the penitent.


