If you are sick or have difficulty walking or using a wheelchair, please sit in any of the four front pews during Masses. That way, I or Deacon Kevin or any of our Eucharistic Ministers can bring you communion first before others during communion.

I understand how difficult it is for some of us to let go of our age-long sitting positions in the Church. As good and faithful Catholics, this great and charitable sacrifice should be considered.

- 1) If you are garing for gamagne who is significant
- 1) If you are caring for someone who is sick or has difficulty walking, or is in a wheelchair, you can sit with them in the front pew.
- 2) For these two reasons, I will encourage us to leave the front pews for people who qualify for the above categories.
- 3) If you need a gluten-free Holy Communion, please let Deacon Kevin or me know when you come to Mass. You can stop by the sacristy when we are vesting and let us know of this.
- 4) If you have difficulty hearing, please ask for a hearing aid. We have some in the Church that you can use during Mass. Also, while our sound system is good, sitting in any of the two central rows makes hearing the priest much easier.

- 5) If you have little children, please sit closer to the cry room and use it when necessary. But please, come to Church with your little children. I AM NOT DISTRACTED BY THEIR HOLY NOISE, nor should anyone be.
- 6) Lastly and most importantly, talking before or during Mass is VERY disrespectful to God and other Church members. We can talk as loud and long as we want after Mass.

May God continue to bless us all as we try to observe all these and make our worship a more beautiful and profound experience for all.

Beginning this Lent, a few changes have been made to update the English text of the prayers used in the confessional.


The changes basically only affect the priest confessor and not the penitent.
