Baptized, Confirmed, and Received into Communion

In the catholic church, we have seven sacraments. These are baptism, confirmation, Eucharist (also known as holy communion or blessed sacrament), penance (also known as reconciliation or confession), anointing of the sick (also known as

extreme unction), matrimony (also known as marriage), and holy orders (also known as ordination).

These sacraments were established or sanctified by Christ for the salvation of all peoples. They are divided into three separate categories: sacraments of initiation (baptism, confirmation, and Eucharist), sacraments of healing (anointing of the sick and penance), and sacraments


of service (matrimony and holy orders).

While no one need to receive all these seven sacraments to be saved, some of them are required for full membership in the Catholic Church. These are the sacraments of initiation – baptism, confirmation, and the Eucharist. Baptism is the gateway of all other sacraments. It is a prerequisite for any other sacrament. While baptism does not entirely make one a full member of the church, one who is baptized can receive most of the other sacraments, especially in extraordinary circumstances.

Confirmation and eucharist complete the process of full initiation into the catholic church. Ordinarily, children receive baptism as infants. They are confirmed and given the Eucharist when they attain the age of reason. But adults, like in the case of converts, are welcomed into the church with all three sacraments of initiation administered at the same ceremony (mostly on Easter vigil) after the whole process of RCIA. But in special circumstances, the pastor can work with an adult on a private catechistical process, after which he must obtain permission from the bishop to administer the sacraments of Christian initiation to an adult without the whole process of RCIA.

This happened last week in our parish with Mr. Raymond Martins, who is now one of us – a full member of the Catholic Church here at St. Thomas the Apostle Church. After many years of active involvement in our parish, discernment, and prayers, Mr. Raymond asked to be received into the Church. Let us keep Raymond and all the catechumenates entering the Church this easter in our prayers.
