
No Friday Masses

A Pilgrimage of Prayer and Community

The beautiful interactions, sharing of meals, memorizing each other's names, taking pictures and selfies even with the cardinal are moments of bonding and socialization. It was refreshing and inspiring to see our people spending real time with others, even with people they had never interacted with before the trip. We made new friends and fostered fraternal solicitude even with people from other places and parishes who joined the trip.

Because of the generous donations of some of our parishioners, we could pay for more than what we promised to pay for the group. We also have some leftover funds after the pilgrimage. We agreed on the bus with the suggestion to help Henry's family with some of the surplus funds from the pilgrimage for Henry's orthopedic surgery. But on second thought, I decided we create a pilgrimage account with the parish and deposit the remaining funds there since we hope to make more pilgrimages like this in the future from the parish. As for Henry, if anyone feels moved to help his family financially to save Henry's life, please get in touch with me for details of his situation and needs.

In the next few weeks, we will find a way to get some of our fine pilgrimage pictures to all those who participated in this year's pilgrimage. What a blessing to have made this trip with a fine, loving, and supportive group of people from our dear parish and neighboring parishes. May God's love and blessings continue to multiply in your lives. Amen.


