

## A WORD FROM FR. PETER

#### Peaceful, Not Violent!

One of the challenging obstacles for American Christians (Catholics and non-Catholic followers of Christ) to visit the Holy Land is the idea that it is a violent place. The nation of Israel and most Palestinian territories Christians call the Holy Land may not be the most peaceful place on earth. Still, these places are more peaceful than most American cities like Chicago, St. Louis, Memphis, New York, and many others. But the modern world, in its anti-Christianity agenda, leaves no stone unturned in

convincing the rest of Christendom through its propaganda media that the Holy Land is a war zone where every life is at risk.

When you want people to enjoy the rich cultural, religious, and spiritual heritages of our faith in the Holy Land and invite them for a pilgrimage, it becomes a herculean task to convince them of their safety when they go. For this reason, most priests

who lead these pilgrimages often go with friends and parishioners who trust the priest. But it should not be so. Every Christian, especially Catholics, who can afford it, should make a pilgrimage to the holy land at least once in their lifetime.

For many reasons, St. John Paul II encouraged Christian pilgrimages to the Holy Land. First, it is one of the most charitable ways for the rest of Christendom to support the Christian minorities in the Holy Land who face extinction. If Christians vanish entirely from the Holy Land, retaining the holy sites in Israel and the Palestinian territories would be impossible.

The Muslims are doing everything they can to ensure that Christianity phases out from the Holy Land. They keep buying the church properties and the homes of Christians with large sums of money. They also sponsor fake news and anti-Christian secularist activities of world media to distract Christians from the rest of the world in extending fraternal support to the Christians in the Holy Land.

The Holy Father, St. John Paul II, also encouraged pilgrimages to the Holy Land because such visits to the historical places where it all began help deepen our Christian faith and solidify our relationships with Christ.

While I was there these last two weeks with thirty men and women from across our diocese, we saw about twenty other groups worldwide, including the United States. Another group from our diocese, led by Fr. Chris House of Christ the King in Springfield, arrived in the Holy Land while we were there. In these two weeks, we visited and prayed in many sites and shrines across Nazareth, Galilee, Jerusalem, Jericho, Cana, Bethlehem, Jordan Valley, and Mount of Olives. During this time, we enjoyed a peaceful time of spiritual renewal, time away from the noisiness of our daily routines, and fraternity. The Holy Land is peaceful, not violent.
