# A WORD FROM FR. PETER

## Saints Peter & Paul – Messengers of the Gospel

Last Thursday, June 29th, we celebrated the solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, the preeminent apostles and the two spiritual pillars upon which the Church of Christ is built. These men of grace, while humans in every sense of the word, responded to their call to discipleship with all they had and were when Christ came into their lives. One of the most profound things about them is that they were not perfect when they received the privileged call to walk/work with Christ.

Before their call to discipleship, there was nothing perfect about Peter and Paul – the call that brought them to perfection. In his words in Romans 7:1-25, Paul narrated his struggles with sin and how he would end up, even after his conversion, often doing the things he did not want to do. Though seldom speaking in a rather theological language,

Paul expressly confessed his weaknesses and limitations in his life of discipleship. But in all those spiritual struggles, Paul did not stop giving himself in word and deed to the discipleship of Christ every day for the rest of his life after his conversion.

Similarly, reading the Gospels, we see Peter as a man of many weaknesses. First, he could not keep a few hours of vigil praying with Christ during his agony in the garden. Second, he could defend the master he loved so dearly when the master was captured. Instead, he denied Jesus not once nor twice but three times.

As if that was not enough, the same guy would often take Christ aside and rebuke him for predicting his passion. However, despite these acts that reveal the depth of his brokenness, Peter did not hesitate to give his life entirely for the Gospel when he was called upon to do so (John 21:15-19).

What can we learn from these men of grace and exemplary Christian virtues? My favorite phrase, as some of us may already know when preaching

about the saints, is: "They used all they had and were for the gospel of Christ." This is precisely true with Peter and Paul. They did not only give their lives for the enthronement of the Gospel. They also shared their moral strengths and intellectual, material, and spiritual riches in touching the lives around them until their last breath on earth.

May Saints Peter and Paul intercede for and obtain the graces to selflessly continue to serve God and the people in our lives with our spiritual, material, intellectual, and moral gifts. And may we continue to grow in our spiritual lives. Amen.



On Sunday, July 16, the missionary from the Archdiocese of Kampala, Uganda, East Africa will be visiting us to ask for your prayers and financial support for the mission work of the Archdiocese. Fr. Dennis Kasule will be with us to share information about the ministry.

The Catholic Archdiocese of Kampala is one of the 19 dioceses in Uganda, East Africa,



covering 3,644 square kilometers. It has a total population of 4.9 million people, and 1.9 million (41%) are Catholics.


The Archdiocese has both rural and urban areas. They have a strong team of 387 priests and a dedicated cohort of both lay and religious leaders. The Archdiocese serves 74 parishes, 443 mission/village churches, 67 schools, 4 hospitals, 19 health centers and several social service units.

Fr. Dennis says that although their need for financial support is quite extensive, for the 2023 Missionary Cooperation Plan they are focusing on the pastoral ministers who serve the parishes and Institutions.

God has blessed them with a number of priestly vocations. However, the parishes in rural areas are not self-sufficient, and there is a need for a consolidated fund to ensure a priests' monthly stipend. Many rectories need repair and renovation to install running water and sanitary facilities.

Fr. Dennis says that they are so grateful for your gracious and generous support for the Archdiocese. He looks forward to praying with us and making an appeal on behalf of the Archdiocese of Kampala on July 16.
