
CONTEMPLATE

Holy Friendship – Jesus and the Siblings from Bethany

Yesterday, Saturday, July 29th, we celebrated the feast of the three siblings – Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. Many of us, even those who rarely read or listen to the bible, know the story of these siblings and how their friendship with Jesus attracted an extraordinary miracle in the little village of

Bethany. That miracle, though it happened in a little remote village, was one of the major miracles of Jesus and the only one that occurred among his personal friends.



One of the brightest minds the Church ever produced, St. Thomas Aquinas, described friendship as the unselfish, constant, and effective desire and effort to do good for another. Aquinas further explained that friendship is

rooted in charity because charity, one of the three greatest/theological virtues, is the Holy Spirit dwelling in a person's heart. In other words, only the presence of the Holy Spirit in a person guarantees the virtue of charity. When this charity is present, a person can enter a genuine friendship with another.

In the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead in John 11:1-44, there abound loyalty, compassion, and empathy mutually between Jesus and his friends from Bethany. Jesus' unselfish, constant, and effective desire and effort to do good for his friends was unquestionable. Again, in Luke 10:38-42, we see these siblings, each in their best means, rendering unselfish acts of love to Jesus. The friendship of Jesus and Mary and Martha, with their brother Lazarus, is a holy friendship and a model of friendship for us all. In holy friendships, we look out for the good of our friends – help them, pray for them, and show them the love and affection they need when needed.

However, one of our more common human tendencies in friendships is making our friends hate whom we hate and love whom we love. As natural as this can be, it is unholy and uncharacteristic of the friendship we see between Jesus and the siblings from Bethany. Doing this and instigating lousy energy in our friends' hearts and minds against our enemies is simply a disservice to our friends. When we do such, we both exhibit unchristian attitudes and indirectly destroy our friends intentionally or unintentionally. The friendship that Mary and Martha and their brother Lazarus had with Jesus was one of mutual love and respect where both parties genuinely and unselfishly desire and work towards the good of their friends.

May Christ inspire and instill the courage and grace to cultivate holy friendships as his sons and daughters, and may his friends from Bethany intercede for us. Amen.


