

Transfigured

We have all had moments when we seem to get a glimpse of Heaven.

For me, they come with the sacraments: in the pew following my First Communion, kneeling before the bishop as he sealed my forehead with oil at my Confirmation, standing opposite my husband on our wedding day, cradling my newborns as the priest poured holy water over their little foreheads, claiming them for Christ.

Moments when the veil between this world and the one to come is pulled away, and our hearts cry out: "Lord, it is good we are here."

Like Peter at the Transfiguration, we desperately wish the feeling would last forever. We want to hang onto the certainty, the confidence and the joy that radiates from our souls. We want to spend forever looking upon the transfigured face of Christ.

But we are not in heaven yet. We raise our eyes, seeing only this world before us, the words of Jesus ringing in our ears: "Rise, and do not be afraid."

"His dominion is an everlasting dominion that shall not be taken away, his kingship shall not be destroyed." — Daniel 7:14



It Is Good We Are Here!

Every August 6th, the Church celebrates the Feast of the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ. The event that this feast commemorates is one of the most powerful and life-changing experiences that Peter and the two sons of Zebedee had during their three years of discipleship with Jesus Christ. In his words, Peter explained in the second reading this Sunday the authenticity, efficacy, and majesty of

Jesus and his gospel message. Peter emphatically admitted how he and the disciples were eyewitnesses of Christ's majesty and the glory and honor he received from God.

Many notable events occurred during their ministry and discipleship of our Lord, which can be referenced in today's second reading. However, the Church picks the Transfiguration event and links it to Peter's testimony in the reading. To understand the weight of this testimony and the rationale behind associating his testimony with the Transfiguration event, one must prayerfully reflect on the prophetic utterance of the apostle upon the glorious and mystical sight of Moses and Elijah on Mount Tabor. Peter exclaimed: LORD, IT IS GOOD WE ARE HERE!

Overwhelmed by that mystical encounter of the divine bodies conversing with Jesus, the radiance of their faces and garments, and the mysterious voice of God bearing witness to the divinity of Jesus, Peter, intoxicated with joy, screamed: LORD, IT IS GOOD WE ARE HERE! It is good we are here to witness the divine declaration of your divinity, and to see how the heavenly bodies keep watching over you – Lord and Redeemer of humanity.

At Mass, we witness a similar event – a mystical event in which divinity converses with humanity. At Mass, we have the privilege to witness the divine exchange where our Lord transforms himself in the eucharistic species at consecration so we can receive him. When this happens, we exclaim like St. Peter: LORD, IT IS GOOD WE ARE HERE! It is good we witness the glorious exchange and receive you in the hallowed species of Holy Communion.

After that miracle of transfiguration, Peter and the other disciples went forth and lived and preached what they experienced. That way, the thousands of generations after them receive and continue to practice the faith. In the same way, our Lord wants us to go forth after each Mass, encouraged to live out and preach the miracle of the Eucharist. We do this as faithful Catholics by allowing our lives and actions to be a testimony of the majesty of Christ and his gospel message. When we do this, the generations coming after us will still have the Catholic faith and enjoy the divine riches of the Eucharist. Happy Feast of Transfiguration to all our parishioners and friends.


